The organization was founded in 1984 by Dr. C. Delores Tucker in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. In 1985, Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm was the first elected chair. Many dedicated Black women were among the charter members, including Mrs. Coretta Scott King, Congresswomen Maxine Waters and Eleanor Holmes Norton, Dr. Dorothy Height, Dr. Mary Frances Berry and others called by Dr. Tucker to meet in D.C. to strategize on ways to confront the critical issues facing Black women and their communities.

The Legacy of Dr. C DeLores Tucker



C. DeLores Tucker fueled a lifetime of activism for advancing the rights of Black people and women.

William Tucker, who continues to live in Philadelphia, said his wife "always had an idea about how to eliminate some injustice in society. She would wake up with that on her mind."

C. DeLores Tucker "represents a generation that changed America," Rev. Jesse Jackson Sr. said in his eulogy at Tucker's funeral at the Deliverance Evangelistic Church in North Philadelphia in October 2005. Her funeral drew hundreds, including former civil rights activist and U.S. Rep. from Georgia John Lewis and Vice President Al Gore.

Born Oct. 4, 1927, she was the 10th of 11 children and the daughter of a North Philadelphia pastor. She grew up in Germantown, attended the High School for Girls and then went on to Temple University and the University of Pennsylvania.

C. DeLores Tucker was the first Black woman to serve as Pennsylvania secretary of state and was a driving force behind expanding voting rights, including lowering the voting age to 18. She initiated the first Commission on the Status of Women in Pennsylvania and was responsible for the appointment of more women and Blacks to boards, commissions and judgeships than ever before in the state's history.

In 1984, C. DeLores Tucker and U.S. Rep. Shirley Chisholm founded what's now known as the National Congress of Black Women, a nonprofit and nonpartisan organization that fights for the advancement of women of color in politics, education and society.

Advocating for educational issues for children and preparing them for college were among her lifelong goals, said E. Faye Williams, president of the National Congress of Black Women.

Among her lasting legacies in the city was her co-founding of the Philadelphia Martin Luther King Jr. Association for Nonviolence Inc. in 1983, which continues to hold its popular annual awards and benefit luncheon. The organization bills itself as the only affiliate commissioned by King's widow, Coretta Scott King.

History of NCBW



NCBW was founded by the late Dr. C. DeLores Tucker in August 1984 after attending the 1984 National Democratic Convention in San Francisco, California. As a result of black women being excluded from participating in the selection of the Vice-Presidential candidate, she convened the first organizing meeting at the Black Postal Workers Union Headquarters in Washington, D.C. A convention was held in 1985 in Atlanta, Georgia following several organizing meetings, and the late Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm was elected as the first National President.

NCBW is a non-profit tax exempt organization with the mission to build a network of women of color and to engage them in leadership activities within the educational, economic, social and political arenas. Our mandate is to foster and enhance the mission of this organization.

One of the many NCBW Programs that Dr. Tucker initiated was the College for Teens Program where teenagers would attend a summer session on a college campus and was the originator of the Campaign to have the Sojourner Truth statue installed at the U.S. Capitol. She also led NCBW's national campaign against Gangster Rap.



The Honorable Letitia A. James

Letitia "Tish" James is the 67th Attorney General for the state of New York. With decades of experience and a long record of achievements, she is a powerful, effective attorney and lifelong public servant. When she was elected in 2018, she became the first woman of color to hold statewide office in New York and the first woman to be elected Attorney General.

Before serving as Attorney General, Letitia James was the public advocate for the City of New York. When she was elected in 2013, she became the first woman of color to hold citywide office. During her tenure as public advocate, her office passed more legislation than all previous public advocates combined, including a groundbreaking law that banned questions about salary history from the employment process to address the pervasive gender wage gap. Prior to serving as public advocate, Letitia James represented the 35th Council District in Brooklyn in the New York City Council for 10 years. As a council member, she passed the Safe Housing Act, legislation that forced landlords to improve living conditions for tenants in New York City's worst buildings. Before her election to the City Council, Letitia James was head of the Brooklyn Regional Office of the New York State Attorney General's Office.



Jotaka L. Eaddy

Jotaka Eaddy is an award-winning strategist, advocate, Television host and connector who Forbes Magazine describes as the "Olivia Pope of Silicon Valley." She is the co-host of the Oprah Winfrey Network Award Winning Series "Speak Sis." With more than 20 years of experience in policy, advocacy, and movement building, Jotaka is a highly sought after speaker and strategist whose accomplishments include: her trailblazing election as the University of South Carolina's first Black Woman Student Body President and her groundbreaking work that led to the abolition of the juvenile death penalty in America through the 2005 landmark US Supreme Court decision in Roper Vs Simmons. Not to mention, her pivotal leadership as Senior Advisor to the NAACP where she led Initiatives to expand and defend voting rights through state legislative wins and executive orders, all before her bold and successful transition to the C- suite of Silicon Valley and the private sector.

As the Founder and CEO of Full Circle Strategies, LLC - Jotaka leads a team of dynamic individuals committed to advancing transformative change and global impact for clients, including corporate, non-profit, foundations, technology, and government organizations seeking to advance policy, ideas, and change.

Organizational Honoree





Holli L. Holliday, Esq.

Holli L. Holliday, Esq. currently serves as the president of Sisters Lead Sisters Vote, a 501(c) 4 organization, founded by Black women, expand Black women's leadership, voices & politics. Holli has managed or advised over 300 campaigns, as campaign manager, leading political programs or as a consultant. Because of her inclusion background, she functions best when connect people to each other and creating the optimal space for this connection. Through SLSV, she works tirelessly to amplify Black women's voices; advance Black women's political leadership; and expand Black women's opportunities.

As a 3rd generation attorney and politico, Holli has always been engaged in politics. In the last 20+ years, she has served in every role, from volunteer to campaign manager to candidate to advisor. Living between her hometown, Kansas City Missouri and the Washington DC area, Holli is a 25+ year member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.; active leader in #WinWithBlackWomen network, a graduate of Howard University and the University of Missouri – Kansas City School of Law,







Dr. Naomi Johnson-Booker

Dr. Naomi Johnson Booker has a stellar reputation for transforming failing schools into successful learning institutions. She is a public education innovator: through GLA's leadership and global studies program, Dr. Booker incorporated learning outside the classroom into the school's curriculum through U.S. and overseas excursions. She has been credited for changing the mindset of her West Philadelphia scholars as she closes America's Exposure Gap, which in turn leads to closing the Achievement Gap., Most of her scholars live beneath the Federal Poverty Level, showing them they can become future leaders of the world.

Dr. Johnson-Booker served for 30 years in the School District of Philadelphia as an area superintendent transforming and managing 15 schools. In 2001, she entered the charter school sector, serving as regional vice president of curriculum and instruction for a charter school management organization.

Dr. Johnson-Booker's status as an esteemed educator is widely recognized. In 2020, Philadelphia City Council named Dr. Johnson-Booker a "Philadelphia Living Legend." Dr. Johnson-Booker was also honored by the Philadelphia Business Journal as a "Woman of Distinction."



Dr. Robin P. Cooper

Dr. Robin Cooper is the trailblazing president of Teamsters Local 502, The Commonwealth Association of School Administrators. In 2016, she made history when she was elected as the first African American, first woman and first African American woman to lead its local union since its Teamsters chartering in 1985. She served as an principal for 16 years and she was instrumental in improving climate and academic achievement in the two schools where she served as a principal. Prior to that, Robin served in the capacity of Cheyney Adjunct Professor, Assistant Principal, Administrative Assistant to the Cluster Leader, Freedom Schools Project Director, and Teacher. Robin also served as a Commissioner for the Teamsters Human Rights and Diversity Commission

Robin is a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc., Dr. Ruth W. Hayre Scholarship Fund, Top Ladies of Distinction, and other notable organizations. She currently serves as an Executive Board member of the Legacy of Love Foundation, Inc., President of Top Ladies of Distinction, and President of Teamsters Black Caucus Philadelphia and Vicinity Chapter.

In 2023, Robin was recognized for her achievements in Philadelphia by the Schoolmen's Club of Philadelphia with the lifetime achievement award.



Sherri Horsey-Darden

Sherri Darden is the owner and publisher of ScoopUSA Media, the oldest FREE Community paper in the tri-state area. She is first and only Black female 100% owner and publisher of a regularly published newspaper in the city of Philadelphia. As the publisher, Sherri is there. She is in the office and the communities, at programs and events, working with the Community to share our stories and ensure that we tell our stories.

In the past five years, Scoop is evolved and has transitioned from a newspaper to a media platform, hosting the Inside Scoop and working with communities in Philadelphia (and surrounding counties), Chester, Camden, NJ, and Wilmington, DE. We are digital and in print, and we have an App--that is available on any smartphone/device platform. Scoop has repositioned itself as a viable community media platform and partner, sharing local and national news for our communities.



Madaline Maria G. Dunn

Madeline Maria Dunn was born to Amos and Leslie Glenn October 14, 1933 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Robert and Madaline had five children all together. Together they have 12 grandchildren and 17 great grandchildren.

Madeline has received numerous awards and accolades including The National Congress of Black Women Shirley Chisholm Award, (Unbought and Unbossed), the Fannie Lou Hamer Award for Voters Registration, Advocacy and Crisis Intervention Network Award, and The Lucien E. Blackwell Guiding Light in the Community Service Award to name a few.

Madeline sense of adventure has taking her around the world. She can be overheard saying "who would have thought that a little girl from my street has traveled to China, Hong Kong, South Korea, Senegal, Gambia, West Africa, Nassau, Bahamas, Morocco, Kenya and Brazil." Love for her family and desire to make a better life for her children's children has always been her driving force.



Keir Bradford-Grey, Esq.

Keir Bradford-Grey is a nationally recognized state and federal defender, and a pioneering leader at the forefront of developing the model for community engagement with the legal system. Keir has dedicated her career to creating a justice system that makes our communities safer.

Honored as a Philadelphia Living Legend in 2022, Keir is the only woman and only African American exploring a run for Attorney General. Keir was the first woman to lead public defender offices in both Montgomery County and Philadelphia, where she managed a staff of over 500 and a budget of over \$50 million.

A public defender for more than two decades, Keir has served as the Chief Defender in Philadelphia and Montgomery County, Pennsylvania's first and third largest counties by population, trying cases in both state and federal court.



Jimia R. Davis

At a young age, Mia overcame a myriad of traumatic life experiences, but learned that the key to success is having the ability to use the experiences as motivation. One of the most impactful moments in her life was on April 15th, 2019, when her Father, James Davis Jr. was wrongly convicted and sentenced to 10+ years in federal Prison.

Speaking on the impact her Dad had on her life, the city of Philadelphia and much more in the highest court in the country at only 17-years old, the Judge (Wendy Beetle Stone) told Jimia, "you will be ok, you have the fire in you. I see it." She then proceeded to issue her Father a preposterous sentence, justifying it by saying "Your family thinks very highly of you [James Davis Jr.], this will show them."

Jimia uses this day as her main motivation, and is now determined not only to change the mindsets of individuals within the urban community, but to open her own Law firm devoted to fighting for Black men who otherwise could not fight against the system themselves.



Florence "Penny" McDonald

Florence M. Penny McDonald is the Treasurer of the Citizens Networking 4 Progress (PAC). She is the proud mother of three married children and is blessed with 19 wonderful grandchildren. She is the oldest of five children of Elaine Witherspoon-Carter and the late Lawrence Witherspoon.

She was a co-founder of United Community Action Network (UCAN) promoting "Education Over Incarceration" Program. A co-founder of "Fathers and Children Together" Initiative (FACT), She is currently the executive director of Community Forgiveness and Restoration (CFR) a Faith-Based Reentry 501c3 non-profit organization. She has been working with incarcerated lifers in SCI Graterford and other State and County prisons for more than 20 years to create and implement plans to stop the culture of street crime in our community. CFR works to assist returning citizens providing needed resources to prevent recidivism.



Angela McIver

Angela McIver is a national leader and advocates for Fair Housing for all. Angela joined the Fair Housing Rights Center in Southeastern Pennsylvania as Chief Executive Officer in 2007. In 2016 and again in 2020, Angela became a member of the Pennsylvania Advisory Committee of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. Since 2018, she has served as a National Fair Housing Alliance board member. In 2019, Angela was designated a National Housing Fellow under the Strong Families Commission. Angela delivers housing commentary on Turning Life Corners on WPPM 106.5 FM radio. She appeared on many media platforms, including KYW News radio, WHYY-FM 90.9, WITF/WURD 900 AM, WWDB 96.5 FM, 6abc Action News, NBC10 Philadelphia, Praise 107.9 FM, PBS News Hour, Reveal, Radio One Reopening Philly Radio Video Event, Bike and Build, and CNN.

Angela has 30 years experience and serves as a systems analyst by developing customized business solutions, institutional and organizational networking, community partnerships, coalitions affecting adults, youths, and disabled persons, and identifying social intersections and solutions. Currently, Angela's status as a Certified Trauma-Competent Professional is pending. Once obtained, she will implement a national Trauma for Fair Housing Advocates program.



Paulette Starr-Dinnall

Paulette's humble beginnings started in St Catherine Jamaica. At the age of 21, she migrated to the United States with a passion for life and a strong desire to achieve a part of the American Dream. She attended the Community College of Philadelphia, and over a period of 35 years, she opened a Nail Salon, Snack Shop, a used car dealership, a Night Club, lawn and Cleaning Services, and a Caribbean Food Market. She also dabbled in Real Estate. Pat's Caribbean Market is one of her greatest accomplishments. It's been one of the biggest Caribbean Markets in the Philadelphia area for over 25 years and counting. It has been featured in several magazines and television shows. It is also a shopping Haven for Patti Labelle, Malik Yoba, and many others.

Throughout the years, Paulette has been a pillar of the community by donating to various organizations. Organizations including Shriners Children's Hospital, Penn Relays, Carnivals, Churches, etc. The community can always count on her annual Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Baskets and goodies. With her many hats including mother and grandmother, she has never forgotten her humble beginnings which compels her to touch every life she meets. If there's one thing that anyone can say about Paulette, it is that, if anyone asks, she gives, when they don't, she still gives. If they just look at her, she gives even more.




Toni Staten

Toni Staten serves as Executive Director of the Laborers-Employers Cooperation and Education Trust (LECET) for the Laborers District Council of Metropolitan Philadelphia and Vicinity (LDC). In this role, she serves as the lead marketing executive for LDC. She provides senior leadership supporting LDC's mission to assist its membership in securing employment, defending their rights and advancing their interests as working men and women.

Toni joined the Laborers District Council more than 17 years ago and began her career as a Special Projects Researcher and Claims Processor in the Laborers' Prepaid Legal Fund. In 2012, she was promoted to Health & Safety Awareness Coordinator in the Laborers' Health and Safety Fund.

In 2017, Toni was appointed to her current role as Executive Director. During her tenure, she has led the transformation and expansion of LDC's branding and outreach efforts, targeting resources and developing programs addressing the needs of youth and underserved communities. She has also expanded LDC's reach through innovative media relationships and serves as host for Laborers' Live, a weekly radio program on Philadelphia's only locally owned African-American radio station.



Dr. William Tucker

Dr. Tucker currently serves as President of the Philadelphia Martin Luther King, Jr. Association for Nonviolence, Inc., for the past 17 years and although retired, continues to carry on this great legacy. He is the former Chairman of the Bethune DuBois Institute in Washington, DC. Both of these organizations were founded by his late wife, the Honorable Dr. C. DeLores Tucker. He served in the U.S. Army 1951 – 1953 and received an honorable discharge. Dr. Tucker was married to the late Dr. C. DeLores Tucker for more than 55 years.

Approximately, 29 years ago, Dr. Tucker founded the Children's Christmas Dinner Party held first in Washington, D.C. for disadvantaged children. In 2004, through Philadelphia Martin Luther King, Jr. Association for Nonviolence, Inc., he orchestrated the 1st Annual Children's Christmas Dinner Party for underserved children from Philadelphia and surrounding areas at the Wyndham Franklin Plaza Hotel. They served over 3,800 children that year, a program that continues today!

As a committed community activist, Dr. Tucker, over the years has served as President of the Associated Real Estate Brokers of Philadelphia, President of the Philadelphia Council of Property Owners; Board Member of the National Negro Business League, the Urban League of Philadelphia, Heritage House, The Philadelphia Health and Welfare Council and the Executive Board of the Philadelphia Chapter NAACP.



Retired Judge Thomasine Tynes

Judge Thomasine Tynes was born and educated in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. In 1989 she was appointed by Governor Robert Casey to serve as a judge in the Philadelphia Traffic Court. In March 2005, Governor Edward G. Rendell appointed her as President Judge of Traffic Court. Judge Tynes has 20 years of distinguished service as the longest sitting judge of this Court. She also has a distinction of being the first African-American female to ever serve as Traffic Court Judge and the first female as President Judge of the Philadelphia Traffic Court, both unprecedented milestones. Her Reputation as a fair and dedicated jurist has prevailed throughout her career.

Before serving in the judiciary, Judge Tynes was Director of the congregate housing services program from 1983 to 1989. This federal pilot program was funded through the Philadelphia Housing Authority, and provided seniors with medical nutrition and legal services, along with homemaker skills to facilitate independent living within a controlled environment. She also managed a multi million dollar sportswear conglomerate in New York City, served as CEO of a successful automobile retail business, is a well accomplished real estate entrepreneur and earned a single engine pilots license
