# MARK'S MINUTE

As I sit here thinking ahead about July, I can't help but to think about the many places that I've witnessed fireworks displays over the years. When I was a child, I remember seeing fireworks at a local park...and at neighborhood block parties. Since then, I've seen fireworks explode of theme parks (like Astroworld in Houston; Kings Dominion, and Busch Gardens).I've watched them from porches at various beach houses...and have EVEN watched them from our balcony at the Polynesian Resort overlooking the Lagoon in Walt Disneyworld.

Here are a few things that I've observed about fireworks...

- 1) Fireworks are bright: Have you ever noticed that when some of them explode they really light up the sky-so much so that for a few moments if feels as if its daylight. They bring such rich, vibrant light into the darkness!
- 2) Fireworks are powerful: Imagine the amount of explosive power that is jammed into each and every firework. It's hard to imagine that something that sits on a shelf will explode into something so vast and wide.
- 3) Fireworks aren't silent: Whether it's a whistle, a series of pops and cracks, or one big loud BOOM, fireworks "speak".

Maybe there's a lesson here for us...as believers in Christ:

First of all, you and I are called to be bright lights in a dark world. In fact, the way that we live as believers should actually contrast with the darkness around us. In Matthew 5:14-16, Jesus said "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on a stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before people that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven." Even though we are all to be Christ's light, each of us is uniquely different- just like how each firework is unique. We all have Christ's light in us to light up the darkness, but our spiritual gifts, talents, and experiences are all different variations of that light!

Second, we each who are believers in Christ, may all look different on the outside, but inside we house the incredible power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 8:11 says, "... if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead, is living in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies, through His Spirit, who lives in you." Our physical bodies may just be "jars of clay" (says the apostle Paul), "but we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us." The firework packaging is not as important (and as majestic) as the power that this packed within that little box.

Finally, we, as believers, are not to keep silent about our faith. We are to look for opportunities to share our testimonies, bridge conversations to spiritual things and excitedly share with others about what God is doing in our lives. In Acts 18:9-10a, the Lord appears to Paul and says, "Don't be afraid! Speak out! Don't be silent! For I am with you...." May that be the Lord's word to each of us believers, too!

So...this July 4<sup>th</sup>...as you watch fireworks (or hear them as you are trying to go to sleep)...think about their light, their variety, their power (despite their packaging), and that they aren't silent. Then thank God for His light in you, our variety as believers, His power (despite your packaging), and the message that He has given you to proclaim!


