

Mark's Minute

Perhaps you've heard the name "Josh McDowell"...or perhaps you haven't. Josh McDowell is both an evangelist and a defender of the Christian faith. Though he has authored over 150 books, his book Evidence that Demands a Verdict was ranked 13th in Christianity Today's most influential evangelical books published after World War II.

Well...here's the story behind that book.

Josh McDowell entered university as a young man looking for a good time and searching for happiness and meaning in life. He tried going to church, but found religion unsatisfying. He ran for student leadership positions but was disappointed by how quickly the glamor wore off. He tried the party circuit, but often woke up after the weekends feeling worse than ever.

He finally noticed a group of students engaged in Bible study, and he became intrigued by the radiance of one of the young ladies. He asked her a reason for it. She looked him straight in the eye, smiled, and said, "Jesus Christ."

"Oh for crying out loud," he retorted, "don't give me that garbage about religion."

She replied, "I didn't say 'religion', I said 'Jesus Christ'."

The students invited him to intellectually examine the claims of Christ and the evidence supporting Christianity. He accepted their challenge, and after much study and research, finally admitted that he couldn't refute the body of proof supporting Christianity. McDowell received Christ as his Savior, and his research became the background for his book, Evidence that Demands a Verdict.

One of the major factors in his conversion to Christianity was his inability to ignore the historical resurrection of Jesus Christ, a point he made later to a student at the University of Uruguay who asked him, "Professor McDowell, why can't you intellectually refute Christianity?"

"For a very simple reason," replied McDowell. "I am not able to explain away an event in history—the resurrection of Jesus Christ.






Prayer Corner





Stewardship Suippet

Our study last month talked about the economic dangers of debt. This month we'll cover the spiritual dangers of debt. There are two: (1) borrowing always presumes upon the future and (2), borrowing may deny God an opportunity to work.

The Bible warns us about presuming upon the future. James 4:13-16 calls presuming the future as "arrogance." Whenever money is borrowed for any purpose, there is a presumption of repayment. When a Christian borrows money, it must be paid back, Psalm 37:21, "The wicked borrows and does not repay". The biblical principle here is, whenever you borrow money for any reason, there must be a guaranteed way to pay it back. Not a "hoped for way". Of course, if the rapture happens, maybe you get off the hook. Or maybe He will leave those with debt here to repay it. Obviously, this is a joke but it does point out the importance of repaying your debt.

The second spiritual danger is it may deny God the opportunity to work. Sometimes we feel we must borrow, but are we limiting God? God can provide in unusual, undeniable and supernatural ways. We may miss out on seeing God work. This is often putting the lender in God's place. Often, we don't wait on God's timing and seek other means to reach our desires. Isaiah 55:8-9 talks about God's thoughts and ways are not like ours. The question is, are we trusting in God to provide or is it me? So the next time the need to borrow arises, think carefully about the economic dangers, but don't overlook the possible spiritual dangers. Next month we will look at the biblical principles of borrowing.
