Mark's Minute

In last month's "Mark's Minute", I highlighted what I would be doing (and where I would be going) in May as part of the "Footsteps of Paul and Seven Churches of Revelation" Tour in Turkey and Greece.

This month, I will highlight my Sabbatical focus for June. This June, as part of my Sabbatical, I am going to spend some time sharpening my devotional side and my leadership side. There are three specific goals that I have for June: 1) To engage in both devotional materials (to deepen my spiritual walk) and leadership materials (to strengthen me as a leader). If you ask my wife, she will tell you that "the books that I will be reading during my Sabbatical" continue to grow. On the devotional side of things, I will be working through The Devotional Classics (edited by Richard Foster), The Cost of Discipleship (by Dietrich Bonhoeffer), In the Name of Jesus and Sabbatical Journey (both by Henri Nouwen), and Being with God by A.J. Sherrill. On the leadership side, I will be reading Simple Church by Thom Rainer and Eric Geiger, Breaking Growth Barriers by Carl George, Overcoming Barriers to Growth by Michael Fletcher, and The Call: The Life and Message of the Apostle Paul by Adam Hamilton. 2) In addition, I hope to journal each day, not only about what I am learning in my reading, but where I am seeing God in clearer ways as I slow down and enter into a different routine.

And finally June will be a month to 3) connect with pastoral coaches and pastoral teams. I will be using June to not only be coached by mentors that I respect, but to also be coached by some pastors/staff teams of churches that are "at the next level" from where Shalom is right now (as in, at the next level in size, in stability, in new endeavors, in staffing, in community ministries, in discipleship structures). In other words, I want to learn from people who have led a church THROUGH where Shalom is right now...and into the next level. I have lined up eight different pastor/staff teams to travel to, meet with, and talk through a questionnaire with them that I have created.

Throughout June, July and early August, the Millers will also be worshipping at different churches to experience what other Baptist churches and other denominations do for worship. We are looking forward to learning from others (both traditional and contemporary in style).

In addition, during the month of June, I will be praying through our membership, taking walks, and revisiting some places that had been especially integral and meaningful in my spiritual journey.

I hope that gives you an idea of my June on Sabbatical.

Pastoral Ponderings Shalom on Sabbatical

Read prayerfully 1 Corinthians 3:4-11. You probably know that the churches in Corinth had some issues, to say the least! It seems that they were bickering over several issues, including who was the better preacher. Can you imagine that? Surely none of us has ever done anything like that!

Seriously, for the next three and half months, beginning May 1st, Shalom will experience a change in pastoral leadership as Pastor Mark goes on his 3 1/2 months sabbatical. I have been entrusted with the role as your interim pastor, and I need your prayers to continue the work that Pastor Mark has been doing for over 16 years. As Paul wrote to the Corinthians, pastors are different, with differing skills and gifts to offer their congregants. Some sow, some water, and others reap, depending on the gifts that God has gift them.

There will be comparisons of course. Many of you have been served by several pastors over the years. Remember, however, the advice that Paul gave to the Corinthians and others: each Christian, including pastors, has been empowered by God through they Holy Spirit to do what he has entrusted him/her to do for *Him.* As Paul says elsewhere: "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them..." [Romans 12:6].

We will definitely be praying for Pastor Mark as he journeys through his sabbatical. Again, I ask that you pray for me too as I shepherd the flock called Shalom Baptist Church in his absence.




