

## Mark's Minute

In Matthew chapter 3, John the Baptizer quotes from Isaiah chapter 40, when he proclaims, "Prepare the way for the Lord". As we take steps toward Christmas...we are called to do the same in each Advent season. In fact, Advent is a time for preparing, expecting, and anticipation. So, this advent season, I thought it might be helpful to break down that phrase "prepare the way for the Lord."

PREPARE: To prepare means to "put in proper readiness or condition". Preparing is about getting ready for something. Preparing is all about getting things in order...getting things ready. And when it comes to Christmas, we have a lot of preparing to do: decorating the house, making Christmas cookies, writing this year's Christmas letter, getting the Christmas cards in the mail, buying all those gifts, scheduling all those Christmas parties, preparing all the food for the big Christmas feast...prepare...prepare...prepare. But what's interesting about this word "prepare" here in the Bible is that it is an "imperative" verb. An imperative verb is a command. In the original Greek, this literally reads, "YOU prepare". No one else can prepare for you. Furthermore, here in Scripture, the whole notion of preparing carries a much deeper meaning than setting up Christmas trees, marking things off your "to buy" list, or cooking a holiday ham. "Preparing" (at least in this context), is directly linked to repentance. As you PREPARE for Christmas this year...have you prepared to encounter Jesus Christ in a new way this coming month...by first approaching him humbly...with a heart of repentance? All that to say: you and I must take the time...make the effort...and actually PLAN to prepare our hearts for the Advent season. You see, if we don't plan to prepare now, we will find ourselves waking up on the morning of December 26th surrounded by trash bags full of wrapping paper and new gadgets, yet still feeling somewhat unfulfilled and somewhat empty. Plan to prepare your heart for Christmas...or you might just miss it altogether.

"THE WAY". Prepare THE WAY: That's an interesting phrase isn't it? To fully understand this, we need to realize that the word "way" (odon)-literally means "road"?-Prepare ye the road. In its original context, those words

"prepare the way" were all about clearing obstacles out of the road. Isaiah's words, "prepare ye the way of the Lord" draw richly upon an ancient near Eastern custom of sending representatives ahead to prepare the way (or most often, literally, the road) for the visit of the monarch (a king, a queen, a prince). The idea here (even way back in Isaiah chapter 40) was that of preparing a processional highway for the Lord's coming to Jerusalem. That should immediately bring to mind Palm Sunday...(Jesus entering Jerusalem on that donkey.) Even today, this concept isn't all that foreign, is it? Whenever the president of the United States travels anywhere, aren't there teams of secret service agents who go out before that president..."preparing the way"? Even today, "way" and "road" are interchangeable, aren't they? If somebody asks, "How do I get to your house?", you might answer, "Well, you travel down 360 this way, take a right on Pole Green Road and go that way for about 2 miles". But that's not all. Even in our language "way" can also mean "conduct" (for instance-this is the "way" that Jesus desires that we live). In fact, original Christians were even referred to as the "followers of the Way" (capital W). In the Greek, "odon", means both road...and conduct. Advent is not just about clearing debris from the street for the Lord's coming, it's about clearing the debris from our hearts...in preparation for Christmas. What external junk is weighing you down? What stuff is robbing you of your Christmas joy? What needs to be cleared from your heart this Christmas season?

FOR THE LORD. Everything we do, as Christians should, be done with a focus on our Lord, Jesus Christ. Everything that we do to prepare (even in the small ways) should somehow point back to the Christ of Christmas. After all, it is the way of the Lord. The "way" in which we prepare for this season should be rooted in the Way of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Furthermore, when we look around our church sanctuary each Advent Season, we will see visual reminders of the Lord, even in the small things. (Red petals of poinsettias remind us of Christ's blood shed for us; the nativity is a visual reminder that God came to us; the evergreen tree-as "ever green"--symbolizes our eternal life in Christ; the lights on the tree remind us that Jesus is the light of the world; the holly and its prickly leaves, remind us of the crown of thorns; the circle of the wreath is a reminder of Jesus' unending love for us and a reminder that Jesus, our Lord is Alpha and Omega, Beginning and End.

Shalom, we have just under 4 weeks until Christmas...so how will you prepare? Will you "Prepare the way for the Lord"?




