### Mark's Minute

Not long ago, I came across a story about a husband and wife who had been bickering. In fact, they were really starting to fuss at each other. And so the wife suggested that they write down their complaints on a piece of paper and then show the other person exactly how they felt. She thought that this might cut down on the bickering by getting some things "out in the open". The husband agreed and so they each took a sheet of paper and began writing.

They both wrote vigorously for a little while. The husband would pause, look at his wife, and write some more. The wife would pause, then look at her husband, then write some more. The husband paused again, looked at his wife with an even angrier look on his face, and then he would write some more. The wife did the same and then put her pencil down. But her husband was still writing. He looked up at her with fury and continued writing. He kept writing. Then he wrote some more. Then even more. The wife was getting furious because she had covered one side of the page and here was her husband finishing the back side of his paper. He kept looking at her and coming up with MORE to write. Every time he looked up, something new would come and he'd write some more.

The wife was in pain and agony. She was clenching her fists and tears of anger were welling up in her eyes. Finally, her husband said that he was finished. They exchanged sheets of paper and looked at each other's sheet. And...as soon as she gave him her sheet and looked at his, she felt terrible. She wanted to take her sheet back. For when she looked at her husband's sheet of paper, in spite of his anger and pain, he had written on every line: "I love you. I love you. I love you. I'm ticked off, but I love you. I'm angry right now, but I love you. I don't want to be here right now, but I love you."

When she saw that much love...it covered over what had brought up the argument in the first place.

Perhaps that's what the apostle Peter meant when he wrote these words in 1 Peter 4:8: "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins." In other words, love forgives again and again and

This phrase may have its again. roots in Proverbs 10:12, which says, "Hatred stirs up dissension but love covers over all wrongs." This verse can hold several meanings within itself: 1) God's (He loved us first) love "covered" our sins through His forgiveness, so that we can (as a result) "cover" other people's sins. 2) When we truly love one another, we will forgive (cover) people's offenses/sins against us. And 3) When we exercise love, God will forgive our sins. Now, regardless of which meaning you choose, one thing is clear: love and forgiveness are intertwined. In fact, in 1 Corinthians 13 (the "love chapter"), we discover that "love keeps no record of wrongs". As we practice "loving God's way" we will also be practicing "forgiving God's way".... And vice versa.



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## Stewardship Snippet

### Guaranteed Financial Success

Is it wrong to desire financial independence? Not as long as that doesn't mean independent from God. The question should be, how much does God want me to have or keep? How do you reach your long-term goals? The answer is simple: Spend less than you earn and do it for a long time. Or as the Bible says, "Whoever gathers money little by little makes it grow". (Proverbs 13:11). I always tell people in my practice as a Financial Advisor, the savings rate is more important than the rate of return. That is proven by math. The eighth wonder of the world is the "magic of compounding". Simple illustration, if at age 20, you put away \$2,000 per year, and earned an average return of 10% per year for 40 vears, at age 60 you'd have almost \$1,000,000. The "Rule of 72" says if you take any interest amount and divide it into 72, you get how long it takes for money to double. Compounding involves three variables, amount saved, time period and earnings rate. Key point: The earlier you start, the less you have to save. The later you start, the more you either have to save or the more risk you have to take on the rate of return needed. Whatever your financial situation is today, ask God "What would you have me do?" It all begins with being content as a steward of whatever God has allowed you to have or blessed you with. Cash-flow margin is the next important concept related to your success of the magic of compounding. Again, the answer is, spend less than you earn. To create margin, you have two choices, increase income or reduce expenses. Remember the four areas that control cash-flow, giving/tithing, lifestyle expenses, taxes and debt repayment. The main area we can affect is lifestyle. God knows what lifestyle he has chosen for you. Allow Him to help you. Conclusion: adding cash-flow margin to magic of compounding; 1) get rich slowly - it requires patience and selfdiscipline, both fruits of the Spirit. 2) a dollar spent today takes it out of your future use. 3) money has time value, amount today can be more tomorrow.
