Mark's Minute

As you may know, on Wednesday evenings, after our church-wide meal, a group of us here at Shalom, are working our way through the book, "Devotional Classics". So far, we've delved deeply into the writings of C. S. Lewis, St. Augustine, Thomas Merton, Henri Nouwen (and many others). In this month's newsletter I want to share with you a prayer of John Baillie (1886-1960). I believe it not only captures "God loving us first" but it also captures how we can "love Him first". (Quite appropriate, I thought, for a month often dubbed "Love Month" because of Valentine's Day). Here is John Baillie's prayer entitled "My First Thought":

"Eternal Father of my soul, let my first thought today be of You, Let my first impulse be to worship You, Let my first speech be Your name, Let my first action be to kneel before You in prayer.

For Your perfect wisdom and perfect goodness:

For the love with which You love mankind:

For the love with which You love me:

For the great and mysterious opportunity of my life:

For the indwelling of Your Spirit in my heart:

For the sevenfold gifts of Your Spirit:

I praise and worship You, O Lord.

Yet let me not, when this morning prayer is said, think my worship ended and spend the day in forgetfulness of You. Rather, from these moments of quietness let light go forth, and joy, and power, that will remain with me through all the honors of the day.

Keeping me chaste in thought:

Keeping me temperate and truthful in speech:

Keeping me faithful and diligent in my work:

Keeping me humble in my estimation of myself:

Keeping me honorable and generous in my dealings with others:

Keeping me loyal to every hollowed memory of the past:

Keeping me mindful of my eternal destiny as a child of Yours.



Everyone knows there are deacons at churches, however over the past couple of years (especially through changes during the pandemic) many of the ways that deacons have served the church have changed. People may wonder, what does a deacon actually do now that the offering plate and the communion plates are no longer passed? Well, you may be surprised that those are not the only things that deacons do here at Shalom. Here are a few of those things"

The Deacon of the Month gives the offertory prayer at the 11am service even though the offering plates are not officially passed. But there are many ways to give; like: online, through the mail, during the service or in the designated boxes by the doors. The Deacon of the Month is also responsible for finding people to give the invocation prayer at the 11am service. Check out the newsletter monthly to see who the Deacon of the Month is and to learn a little bit more about that person.

At the beginning of the year deacons divide into two groups: One group is a visitation group they call, visit and send cards to those who are in need that month. The other group is the ordinance group. They are responsible for setting up and taking down the communion elements and helping with any baptisms throughout the year (washing of towels and robes, and assisting at the baptism, etc). In addition deacons have been assigned to each Sunday School class and will check in at least once a month to gather prayers, praises and concerns. (See page 6 for the assigned deacons.)

The deacons will also be meeting this month to decide what projects to focus on this year. I will continue to post updates in the newsletter in order to keep you informed and to ask for your help to get involved! If you ever need to reach out to a deacon while on church property, look for our name tags. Which look a little bit different so that you can easily pick us out in a crowd.

While there are a lot of other things that deacons assist with in the background, please know that we are here to be servant leaders at Shalom and in the community.
