Mark's Minute

One year ago...in late December of 2019...I wrote a newsletter article about "heading into the year 2020". And that newsletter article centered around "having 20/20 vision". When we talk about perfect vision...we refer to it as "having 20/20 vision". But, for the entire world, the year 2020 seemed light years away from the vision that we had for it. Little did any of us know...that the year 2020 would become the year that was intensely warped and so "out of focus".

But here's something that I've discovered--when our sense of sight gets affected, our other senses can actually become MORE attuned.

Back when I was in my twenties, I enjoyed spelunking (caving). I would always go caving with a group...and I ALWAYS had multiple sources of light with me (and even backup sources for THOSE sources). And usually at some point during that caving expedition, everyone in the group would sit down...and turn out ALL of their lights. I can't even describe to you how dark it was. A person could literally hold their hand a quarter of an inch in front of their nose and NOT see it. But, in those moments, my hearing appeared to be more heightened. In fact, back in February 2014 a group of scientists discovered that being in total darkness could, indeed, improve hearing. MIT neuroscientist, Mark Bear says that while there "is no direct connection between the two areas of the brain (the primary visual cortex and the primary auditory cortex), there may be a roundabout route." Bear concludes that "given enough synapses, every neuron in the brain connects to every other neuron in the brain."

Ok...but what does this have to do with an "all out of focus" 2020? Everything. You see, because this past year's "vision" got all messed up, it caused many of us to be more greatly attuned to OTHER things going on. Here is a DIRECT quote from my newsletter article from LAST YEAR:

"Our vision may occasionally need a new perspective. Sometimes, vision gets strengthened when we look at things through a new lens or in a new light. Is there a better way to DO this? Is there a more relevant ministry? Does this process connect the way it used to? Are we using technology in new ways to reach people? Looking at things from a different perspective can truly enhance a 2020 vision." (WHOA...Those words were written before we even knew that COVID-19 would turn into a full fledged global pandemic!)

But that's just my point. This past year may have affected our "vision" but it didn't rob us of looking at things from a different perspective. Think about this in light of what the apostle Paul wrote in Philippians 4:11-13: "...for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. I know how to be brought low and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

- Maintain their independence



Stewardship Snippet

As we start the New Year, people often make resolutions, that get broken, in some cases rather quickly. We hope everyone will make a goal to take their financial strategy seriously and begin holding a Board meeting. This meeting, if married, should be the couple sitting down to look at last year and plan for the year ahead. If single, a meeting with yourself is just as important. If you don't know where you've been and are, it's impossible to know where to go.

With the New Year, let's make it a goal to be the best stewards we can be of what God has given us to manage. Looking back, we saw what short-term and long-term goals were. Now we need to integrate those two objectives into a planning strategy. We return to Ron Blue's course on financial contentment and how to master your money.

This planning strategy has a four step process. We will go into greater detail of each of these steps as we move ahead in coming messages. First step, summarize your present situation. Second, establish your financial goals and objectives. Third, plan to increase your cash flow margin. And lastly, control your cash flow. If you know where you are, where you're going and the steps to get there, that's a major step in being a planner and not a responder.

When considering the financial planning process, there are three important implications. First, there are no independent financial decisions. If you make the decision to spend the money in one of the short or long-term objectives, those are funds that can't be spent in one of the other goals. Second implication, the longer the term your perspective is the better decision you are likely to make. Are you able to give up today's desires for future benefits? The last implication of the financial planning process, the lifetime nature of your financial decisions. "Decisions determine destiny and behavior follows beliefs." It's true in financial planning just as it is in our spiritual life. The key to success is knowing where you are going in life and knowing how to get there. The short and long-term goals are not what we are really trying to accomplish, but reflect our real desires of: security, peace, contentment, personal growth, obedience to God, self-worth or acceptance.

Money is the resource we use to obtain our desires. Success is knowing what God would have you be and do and achieve. Our goal should be to hear "well done good and faithful servant". Money is merely a resource and the Creator didn't intend it to be more than that. Financial decisions you made years ago can be affecting your today. The good news is if you turn your financial and spiritual life over to God, he can fix both.

People need hope, joy and peace and we need to share that light and love of Jesus. We have such an opportunity to share these truths during the pandemic. Continue to look for great things in Christ as we begin this new year. Be ready and excited to see the things God has planned for this body of believers in 2021!

Praise God that there is hope, joy and peace to be had as a Christian. Can you imagine going through the Covid crisis without His strength to carry you, His promise to never forsake you and His perfect will to guide you?
