

MARK'S MINUTE

At the moment that you are reading these words, several of us from Shalom are likely touring the 7 churches mentioned in Revelation chapters 2-3 (we will be touring them June 30-July 1). One of those churches is the Church at Laodicea. In Revelation 3:15, Jesus says that they are neither HOT nor COLD, but rather LUKEWARM.

Now, I have to admit...that used to really confuse me. I can understand how it would be a good thing for a church to be hot. You know, "on fire for God, with passionate, red-hot zeal". But, when we read this in its context, it appears that being "cold" is actually a positive thing, too. It seems that the temperature that is NOT positive (according to these verses)...is "lukewarm".

So, what does it mean when Jesus says: "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot"? Well, to understand this, we have to go back to the word, "deeds". You see, "hot"; "cold" and "lukewarm" are not necessarily describing a person's spiritual fervor—but are instead adjectives that modify this church's DEEDS. Jesus is saying something about their DEEDS. Let's start with that word "hot". Laodicea was located SMACK in between Hieropolis and Colossae—it was the "middle city" of those 3 cities. So, on one side, was Hieropolis, which was built upon massive hot springs (which still flow today). In fact, the white travertine deposits can be seen for miles—and are even visible across the Lycus valley from Laodicea. In other words, the people of ancient Laodicea would have had a visual reminder of the HOT SPRINGS from where they were. We used to live in the mountains of Virginia...and there was a place not far from where we lived that had once been a fancy resort (around the 1900's). That resort was famous for its hot springs...its natural, hot baths. And people would pay lots of money to go there and receive the medicinal benefits of those hot springs.

Now let's go back to the church's "deeds" for a moment. The church was failing in both hot AND cold. So, what's the "cold side" all about? Well, remember that Laodicea was between Hieropolis and Colossae. Colossae was known for its pure, cold water...in fact, while at the site of Colossae, I took a picture of a natural spring there.

But between the hot springs and the pure cold water sat Laodicea, and Laodicea's deeds were right in the middle—lukewarm...they weren't HOT—that is—they weren't providing healing for the spiritually sick (which corresponds with the healing of the hot medicinal baths) ...BUT (on the flip side) their deeds also weren't cold... in other words, they weren't providing refreshment for the spiritually weary. Think about what an ice-cold drink of water does for you on a 94-degree day. Think about the refreshing feeling you get jumping into a pool when you're outside in August. So, you see, Hot symbolizes healing and Cold symbolizes refreshment.

But that's not all. In addition, the water was piped into Laodicea...and those pipes would get filled with minerals...well, Jesus says to that church in Laodicea...that its deeds—caused Jesus to do what YOU would do if you drank a lukewarm glass of water filled with minerals (and the Greek is very graphic). Jesus doesn't just say "or "spew". He (quite literally says "vomit") —bottom line...the Laodiceans lack of zeal...made Jesus want to throw up!

May our deeds as a church be both healing and refreshing!






Youth Group Newsletter


