


PASTORAL PONDERINGS

As Betty Jo says, the needs of our communities are growing. We are thankful for your donations, our local churches and the donations from Feedmore.

Lots of chicken, apple pie, ice cream, cheese, lettuce, carrots, corn, canned biscuits, bread, canned vegetables and other items filled the bags. One momma was excited that her daughter has found a doctor to help with her mental issues. Pray that she receives the help she needs. We do have a simple request. If you could ask everyone you know at church or at work to donate a reusable bag, it would take us through the summer months. Betty Jo doesn't want to spend money purchasing bags when she would rather buy food for our guests. Thank you!

A Message from Stewardship

Let's talk giving! There are various reasons one might give to their church, the most important one being a heart after Christ's own heart. We also, may have a desire to help those in need or less fortunate, or we may feel strongly about a particular ministry. What we must also remember is that there are several, well, less exciting things that your giving pays for. When you give to the general budget at Shalom, those funds cover a wide area of expenses. Those expenses include,

- Shalom's tithe-yes, we give 10% to places like the Dover Baptist Association and a Cooperative program.
- Paying our outstanding staff.
- Funding all of our educational ministries, from Sunday School to youth and children, discipleship, and much more.
- Our support ministries like He'Brews Cafe, flowers, special events, and kitchen supplies.
- Administrative expenses such as our copiers and all the copies they make, insurance, postage, and maintaining our church vehicles.
- Utilities and facilities-Did you know that through April we had paid almost \$13,000 in maintenance costs, or \$10,000 in cleaning cost, or \$4,500 in natural gas? We have a large building and there are cost to maintaining it.

These are just a few examples of where your gifts go when you contribute to the general fund here at Shalom. When you give to the general fund, you allow your gifts to be used in many ways that keep our church going and support our mission from behind the scenes. We thank you for everything you do at Shalom. God Bless!
