### Mark's Minute

This May, I will be taking a pastoral sabbatical (or clergy renewal), while our church also enters into a time of spiritual renewal. For those of you who attended our last church quarterly business meeting on Sunday, October 17th, you know that we are now including a time of "Sabbatical Questions and Answers" as part of each quarterly business meeting (through April 2022). So, I thought it might be helpful over the next several months to talk through some of the questions I received.

<u>What is the timeframe of the Sabbatical?</u> May 1 – August 15, with Sunday, May 1 being a "passing of the baton Sunday" to our Associate Pastor (and Sabbatical Interim), Rev. Dan McFaden.

<u>What is the theme of this Sabbatical?</u> My part of "Shalom on Sabbatical" will center around what I consider to be the four main roles of a Minister in a church: 1) Pastoral Caregiver (Shepherd), 2) Leader (Equipper), 3) Preacher, and 4) Teacher. Different aspects of my sabbatical correspond to these different roles.

For instance, regarding my role as "Pastoral Caregiver" (visiting, counseling, crisis care, shepherding, etc.) my Sabbatical will include some intentional times of rest, rejuvenation, spiritual readings, meditation and prayer, prayer journaling, etc. At both the beginning and the end of this sabbatical time, I will spend some uninterrupted time at a member's condo at Smith Mountain Lake. I will pray, write, read, prepare for an upcoming journey, take walks, and reflect on where I've been in ministry and where God is guiding me in my next years at Shalom. I will also enjoy time with my family, both in travel and at home. That, too, will provide a greater balance in my life. I recognize that I am only as effective as a pastoral care giver as I, myself, am being renewed and filled by God. This time of rest, rejuvenation and relaxation is designed to help me approach the next years of ministry ready to offer our church pastoral care out of a refilled and refueled position.

Next, there is my role as a Leader (and Equipper). As part of this sabbatical journey, I am lining up visits with pastors and staff teams of churches that are functioning "at the next level" then Shalom currently is functioning. This might be a church at the next level numerically (500-600 in attendance), or this might be a church that has a clearer discipleship strategy in place, or this might be a church that has successfully navigated an area where Shalom has struggled to gain traction in the past. Some of the pastors that I will be receiving coaching from have been where we are currently and have successfully led their churches to the next level. I want to learn from them (and their staff teams). When it comes to leading a church "at the next level", I want to learn more about: discipleship strategies, church organizational structures, growth barriers and growth multipliers, staffing structure and specific staffing positions, leadership strategies and time management (at the next level).

Finally, in my roles as Preacher and Teacher, I look forward to learning through a marriage retreat with my wife and also traveling to Greece and Turkey with my daughter, Morgan, for a "Footsteps of Paul and Seven Churches of Revelation" tour. This educational travel tour will be

led by a college professor, Dr. Mark Fairchild. There is no doubt in my mind that a tour such as this will be beneficial for both my depth of teaching and preaching.

I hope this helps to give you a big picture of the "pastor's part" of "Shalom on Sabbatical". Next month, I will share with you, the church's part...

#### Room in the Inn 2021

Christmas is quickly approaching and so is our annual Room in the Inn program! With the belief that no one should have to spend Christmas Eve and Christmas night outside, our goal is to provide a Room in the inn packages to at least 100 unsheltered households. Packages will include the following:

- One private motel room per household for Christmas Eve and Christmas night 100 rooms (2 nights) @ \$90/night=\$18,000
- One fast food gift card per family member 150 cards @ \$20/card=\$3,000
- Four microwavable meals per family member 600 meals @ \$2/meal=\$1,200
- A warm Mo Hope hoodie for each family member 150 hoodies @ \$20/hoodie=\$2,000
- Two pairs of new socks for each family member Donated by Bombas sock company.

The total cost of this program will be \$24,200. We truly need your support this year. Please specify Room in the Inn when you give. Thank you!


