

munity and peer based addiction recovery programs.








2021 THE MINISTRY IN REVIEW



PROGRAM PARTICIPATION:

Six women residents commenced the program during 2021. Twenty-six women have completed the 1-year program since The Healing House opened in May 2015. Four men completed the Koinonia House men's program that was in operation from July 2017 through December 2020.

At of the end of 2021, there are seven women who have remained with the ministry following their commencements to serve in leadership positions as employees and Sr. Resident overseers. Recovered women committed to giving back and supporting their own recovery are vital to the ministry's ability to serve other suffering women.



PROGRAM GROWTH:

Some of the program growth activity completed during 2021 include:

Converted Koinonia House men's residence to a residence for women

Board member volunteers remodeled the downstairs apartment making it more suitable for Becky Schuessler, our

single mothers program coordinator, to live on-site with her two young children. Now called Jochebed House, it is home for 6 women in addition to Becky and her family. United Way of Central Missouri awarded the ministry a Community Grant to acquire a security fence, mattresses, play set, living room furniture and washer and dryer that helped with the transition.

- Implemented Mentoring Program
 Women mentors from area churches are paired with residents and meet regularly. The Ark church hosts and facilitates monthly Praise and Painting events for current and former residents with their mentors.
- Hired Part Time Assistant Program Coordinator
 As a result of increased operating needs, Becky Schuessler was
 hired as a part-time Assistant Program Coordinator.
- Accredited The Bethel House resulting in all The Healing House and New Beginning houses being accredited through the Missouri Coalition of Recovery Support Providers (MCRSP).



God continues to bless the work of this ministry through generous people who believe in His healing love and power and give of their time, talents, and finances. During 2021:

- Non-designated monetary donations increased 79% over last year.
- Fundraising results were 2.2% less than 2020 (under \$300).
- The ministry received \$131,200 in donations designated for Jochebed's Promise, our vision for our next phase of development, bringing the total raised since 2020 to \$166,200.
- Implemented State Recovery Support Services (RSS) and State Opioid Response (SOR) government funding resources for faith-based recovery services helping residents and providers with recovery services costs. The ministry began receiving funds for residents in November.

GOALS FOR 2022:

- Continue to raise support and seek to acquire suitable property to develop
 Jochebed's Promise. The Board of Directors investigated multiple properties during 2021 and will continue to trust God and His timing for providing the location.
- Complete remodel of 2nd floor of the Healing House to provide space for 3 more residents, add a bathroom and expand a partial to a full kitchen. This will bring our capacity to 25 residents.
- Expand ministry outreach to incarcerated women, adding Chillicothe to Vandalia prisons and the Fulton Community Supervision Center.
