



The volunteer opportunity included tasks such as passing out child sponsorship forms and assisting participants in the process of sponsoring children all across the globe. Recovery Day at the Capitol





On March 7th, The Healing House and New Beginnings partnered with Missouri Coalition of Recovery Support Providers (MCRSP) as we walked through the Missouri State Capitol, sharing testimonies and speaking with legislators on behalf of House Bill 1028, a benevolent tax credit for faith, community and peer-based addiction recovery programs in Missouri. This bill is currently sponsored by Representative Travis I Smith and Senator Rusty Black and co-sponsors include representatives: Cheri Toalson-Reisch, Adrian Plank, and Aaron Crossley. In summary, I if passed, the bill will: Beginning January 1, 2024, authorize a taxpayer to Ireceive a tax credit equal to 50% of the amount of any donation made to an organization that provides recovery support services to people · recovering from substance use disorders, including justice-involved individuals. Tax credits are non-transferrable but may be carried forward for four years. A taxpayer must donate at least \$250 to receive the credit. Please pray that this bill passes, as it would greatly and positively impact THHNB and other programs like ours, as well as benefit our I donors!

CURRICULUM

THHNB is currently going through classes such as "The Wonderful Name of Jesus" which consists of reading and discussing E.W. Kenyon's book, and "Program of Action", our I2-Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) Recovery class. The residents are also attending AA, Bible Study, and Abundant Life Recovery, along with ministry Bible readings and Keith Moore Teachings.
