

The United Way of Central Missouri notified The Healing House and New Beginnings on June 15 that our grant request for an \$8,500 Community Support Grant for 2021 was approved. The grant will be used to purchase the following items:

- Security fence
- 10 single size mattresses
- Swing/play set
- Living room furniture
- Washer and dryer

Most of the items will be for the Jochebed House. Several of our worn out, existing mattresses will be replaced because of this grant. We are grateful to be selected from the many agencies that applied. The award letter stated, "The United Way is proud to acknowledge your passion, hard work and commitment to our community." Also stating, "Thank you for sharing our vision to inspire hope and create opportunities for a better tomorrow."
