Vintage Racing at Sonoma, March 16

The Classic Sports Racing Group (CSRG) was founded in 1968 to provide opportunities to continue driving racing cars whose competitive days were through, whether due to age or discontinuation of their class. CSRG conducts two events per year at Sonoma Raceway, one in the spring and one in the fall.

This year's spring race was conducted March 15-17 and hosted a number of interesting Ford performance entries among a plethora of vintage marques spanning the decades from the 1930s to the modern era. Cars are grouped in classes based on type and engine displacement. Formula Ford (FF) continues to be one of the larger classes. With their 1600cc and 2.0 liter 4bangers and open wheel construction, Formula Ford offers exciting racing for drivers and spectators alike. Formula Ford was created as a Formula 1 training ground in the 1960s, and cars by Lola, March and other well-known builders continue to be a presence at CSRG events.





By far the oldest Ford-powered car racing today was a 1952 Manning Special sporting a flathead Mercury 255/ Lincoln 3-speed powertrain. Chuck Manning was an stress analyst at Douglas Aircraft who designed a racing chassis, published design details in Road & Track, and sold plans. Some were built and raced successfully in 1952. One of them is still out there, and now it wears a pair of Wilson & Woods performance heads.

The Ford-Lotus connection was also present at this year's spring race. Similar to the famed Shelby-Ford-AC collaboration, Ford of Britain teamed up with Colin

Chapman's Lotus starting in the early 1960s, a group that ultimately included Ken Duckworth and Jim Clark. Racing in Group 4 was a Lotus Type 23 sports racer powered by the beloved 289 V8 backed up by a Colotti transaxle, a familiar combination on the road courses of Europe and the USRRC. Two 1965 Lotus Cortinas were entered in the small displacement production class against Alfa Romeos, BMWs, Porsches and others.

Mustang and Cobra enthusiasts are drawn to the ground-pounders of Group 8 large displacement production cars. This year's field included two GT-350s and two 427 Cobras. While it was an IMSA Corvette that dominated Saturday's race, spectators were treated to a hard-fought duel for second place between the two Cobras and another fiberglass bow-tie entrant. I'm pleased to report that a Cobra beat that Chevy.

The hallmark of CSRG events are the open paddock and the accessible driver-owners. Spectators are free to walk among the cars and crews, and friendly owners are always happy to tell you about their cars (provided that they're not wrenching on them in prep for the next race, of course). Many of the cars and owners at these races have long, storied histories

in racing, and to hear the tales all you have to do is ask.


Ready, Set, Race!

life began a new chapter with the DeLuca family that continues until today. After the car's long hibernation, Don had the body and paint refinished, the engine rebuilt, and everything redone that needed redoing. Don and his wife Doris enjoyed driving and showing their rare "D N D 71" Mustang, often bringing granddaughter Jessica along for the fun. In fact, she has been cleaning the wheels and helping grandpa wax this car since she was 10 years old. She particularly remembers going along with them to shows in downtown Martinez and to the BAMA Ponies & Snakes show. As the years went by, the decision was


