
The first stop was the B.R. Cohn winery near Glen Ellen, a great place to take a breather and enjoy the scenery. Next up


was lunch in Healdsburg at Kinsmoke

DVMA Member's Mustangs

Children stop, stare, and point. People adjust their mirrors, trying to get a better look. Other motorists stop Mike Fontaine in parking lots, gas stations, and in traffic. Even those who don't know or really care about cars know that this car is something special.

Mike's 1967 Mustang convertible is a unique, "one of one" show car that backs up its good looks with a whole lot of power. Focal, a high-end French speaker company, commissioned an equally high-end custom car shop to build this Mustang for the 2013 SEMA show



in Las Vegas. No expense was spared. Besides its Shelby-style body mods and custom charcoal grey paint with white GT350 stripes, Mike's pony features a custom interior, which includes 14



speakers, two 12" subwoofers, and two 400 watt amplifiers. Under the hood sits a Dart 363 stroker engine with Edelbrock heads and a custom Erson cam. It is force fed by a 76mm turbocharger through a blow-through carburetor to make 705 horsepower and a mountain of torque. All that power is routed through a Tremec TKO 5 speed to a 9" rear differential with 3.91 gears.

Mike had a '66 Mustang coupe when he was younger, and felt it was time for another pony in his life. He had

planned on going to the Mecum auction in Hershey, PA with some friends, but he got sick and couldn't go. Since he was already a registered bidder, he was able to watch the auction on TV, and with his friends there giving him updates on the auction, he bid on this convertible over the phone. When the smoke cleared, Mike was the winning bidder, getting an amazing deal compared to the high cost of building this beautiful, unique SEMA show car.

While it may have once been a show car, Mike's Mustang is now a "show and go" car. He drives it all over, and every time he does, someone stops him to ask about it, or tell him a story about the Mustang they once had. This special Mustang was featured in the 2022 Danville 4th of July parade, and once Mike was paid \$1000 just to use the car for a wedding photo shoot. Keep an eye out for Mike and his unique convertible Mustang at a car event near you, and take a close-up look at all the custom touches it has, inside and out. Don't be surprised if you stop, stare, and point when you





first see it, too.



Hungry for Breakfast Club Rally

Hey...want to know a secret? There is a monthly car gathering in the North Bay that is making a big splash in the local car community. This is a "cars & coffee" style meetup with a twist: drivers meet early on a Saturday morning at a different location each month, socialize and check out all the cool cars, and then get in and drive a preplanned route of twisty back roads for about 100 miles. This event, the Breakfast Club Rally, calls itself "Mostly vintage, brand-agnostic, and 100% anti-snob." Boy, do they really live up to that! They curate about an 80/20 mix of vintage to modern cars, and it doesn't matter if you bring a million dollar Lamborghini, a hot rod, or a beat-up old truck - all are welcome. I've attended a few of these events now and they are a



lot of fun. What's more, they have photographers at the start point and



along the driving route, and if you like the photos they take of your car, you can buy prints or digital copies. Since this is a Mustang newsletter - fear not, Ford's famous pony car is welcomed with open arms here, along with everything from Abarths to Z cars.

So, how do you get in on the fun? You can register your email address at breakfastclubrally.com, and they will notify you when registration opens up for each month's event. Registration for these events is free, but is limited and fills up quickly. 1999 and older cars are automatically accepted. 2000 and newer cars are selected by the organizers, so send them a photo of your ride and an explanation of why it is special enough to be included. Once registered, the event organizers will send you an email the week before, letting you know the secret start location and turn-by-



turn directions for the driving route. It's best to bring along a navigator to share the fun day, and help you follow the route as you cruise through the scenic Bay Area back roads. Check out some more photos from past events HERE. I hope to see you and your Mustang out there!
