This month's Member's Mustang is a very special one - Rusty and Marlene Hill are the original owners of their Wimbeldon White 64.5 coupe! When Rusty saw this Mustang sitting on the lot at Jorgenson Ford in Pittsburg, he thought it would make a great wedding present for his new bride, Marlene. Rusty's dad had a connection to the dealership's owner, so Rusty and his dad went down to the lot, but the little white Ford was no longer there. Disappointed, they went inside, where they were relieved to find that the shiny new Mustang had been moved into the showroom. After making a deal to buy the car for \$2700 out the door, there was some confusion because another salesman had just sold the same car - to another guy named Mr. Hill! Rusty had signed his paperwork first, though, so he won out and got to take this pony home.

What a wonderful wedding present! There was one catch, though - Marlene didn't know how to drive a car with a manual transmission. So, Rusty got about teaching her. Before long, Marlene would sit on the hump in the middle with Rusty driving. He would push in



the clutch and she would shift. Pretty soon, she was driving the stickshift pony all on her own.

This Wimbeldon White with black interior coupe came equipped with a 200 ci six, a 3 speed manual, and because it was such an early car, it had 13 inch wheels with hubcaps and no side mirror. Rusty has since added a side mirror though, since he got pulled over by a police officer who showed him the vehicle code book that required him to have one! Other upgrades done over the years are putting in a larger radiator to cure an overheating issue, rebuilding the transmission to correct some shifting problems, reupholstering the driver's seat, and swapping out the old dash pad for a new one. Everything else is original, and this Mustang now has only 59,000 miles on the odometer. An interesting and rare option that this car came with is the "Whinny Horn", made for Ford by the Jubilee Manufacturing Co. of Omaha, Nebraska. This horn is supposed to sound like a horse whinnying (Mustang - get it?), but it stopped working years ago.

Throughout the years, other cars have come and gone, but the Hills have held on to the white Mustang through all of life's changes and challenges. Here's hoping that the three of them are happy together for many years to come.
