Have You Driven a ฟอร์ด Lately?

On a recent trip to Thailand, I couldn't help but notice how many things had changed since my last visit in 2018 (and even more so since I lived there in 1998-2000). High-rise condos where there used to be beach huts, good coffee and cannabis dispensaries now seemingly everywhere, and a certain blue oval car company that was previously rarely seen now has a huge presence. I was surprised to see so many Ford trucks on the road, both in the big city and out in the countryside. Ford Thailand now has a large manufacturing plant in Rayong, a seaside province about 110 miles southeast of Bangkok. In fact, the first automobile ever built in Thailand was the Ford Cortina back in 1961 through a partnership between a Thai company and British Ford.

On this visit I had the chance to stop by the Ford dealer on Rama 4 Road in Bangkok and talk with the staff. They spoke little English, and my Thai isn't what it used to be, but we understood each other well enough and bonded over our shared interest in cars. Mustangs, especially vintage ones, are quite a rarity there, so they were excited when I told them I was writing an article for my Mustang club newsletter and that we have over 100 Mustangs in our group, ranging from 1964½ to 2023. Ford does sell Mustangs here, but they didn't have one in the showroom that day. There were two Ranger trucks and a Ranger-based PPV (Pickup Platform Vehicle), the Everest, proudly on display.

The Everest base model includes a 2.0 liter turbodiesel engine making 170 HP & 300 ft-lb of torque, while several upgraded trims feature a 2.0 liter twin-turbo diesel engine that makes 210 HP & 370 ft-lb. No gasoline engines or manual transmissions are available. There are 7 variations of Ranger, all with one of the two turbodiesel engines except for the top-of-the-line Ranger Raptor Ecoboost, featuring a 390 HP / 430 ft-lb V6 twin-turbo gasoline engine. All Mustangs feature the same two engines we know and love here in America. Prices? The Ranger runs from a base of US \$20,500 up to \$57,700 for a fully loaded Raptor V6. The Mustang is where sticker shock hits: \$108,800 for a base Ecoboost, and the 5.0 GT starts at \$143,260 before any options. Yikes!! That really makes you appreciate how good we have it here in the USA. Thai food may be ten times more expensive here than there, but you'll pay a whole lot less for Ford's pony car at home.

DVMA Member's Mustangs

It's pretty obvious that Anthony Northrup likes fun Fords. Just look at the selection of cars he's owned. He had a Merkur XR4Ti, which, with its turbo 2.3 engine and rear wheel drive, was basically a Mustang SVO in a stylish European suit. He then had a couple of Taurus SHO examples, including one where he swapped the larger 3.2 liter engine only available in an auto car into his 5 speed ride. After that, he owned two Mercury



Marauders, the second of which had 4.10 rear gears and often surprised the unsuspecting with its stoplight prowess and show car looks. After selling the last of these, Anthony decided he wanted a Mustang, and a topless, 5.0 V8 powered one at that. He searched far and wide, and in 2020 he found this 2012 Kona Blue Premium GT convertible online in Houston, Texas. After an inspection gave him the green light, a deal was made and Anthony flew to Houston and drove the car back home.

The first four hours of that maiden voyage included torrential rain, which made for quite an adventure since the car desperately needed a new top, and the back window was basically nonexistent. With plastic bags on the Saddle interior and kitty litter in the trunk, he soldiered on through the storm until clear skies prevailed. This was 2020, in the middle of Covid lockdown, so there were relatively few cars on the road and the rest of the trip was glorious. He averaged 26 mpg on the trip, cruising at 80 MPH most of the way. He did have to avoid stopping in New Mexico due to their Covid-era 72 hour hold on visitors there.

Once home, Anthony sourced a new canvas top for his pony. He also personalized his car with a set of black 2020 Mustang Performance Package 19" wheels that he practically stole on Craigslist for \$100, a pair of 2013-14 tail lights, a Roush exhaust, and a CDC light bar. A new clutch was installed at 88,000 miles.

Even though it's a requirement in the Northrup household that drivers know how to operate a manual transmission, that doesn't mean everyone wants to. When Anthony offered to let his oldest son drive the Mustang to school, he said, "It's just a car Dad - can I take the Highlander?" By contrast, his youngest son is into cool cars and performed a brake job on the Mustang when he was just 11 years old.

Anthony and his wife Ngoc Anh recently drove their pony top down on a chilly December night to take part in the DVMA Christmas Lights Tour, including decorating the car with festive lights and giant candy canes. In fact, the joke in the Northrup family is that the car has no top, since he refuses to put it up unless he gets caught in a rainstorm again. After all, top-down motoring is the whole point of a convertible, isn't it?


