

short run on 580 to Corral Hollow Rd and the westward leg back to Livermore. After a short break at Carnegie off-road vehicle park








DVMA Member's Mustangs

In her 20's, Susan D'Arcangelo bought a Ford Falcon, and she loved how simple and easy to work on it was. Years later, she bought a Ranchero that she also thoroughly enjoyed. But it was when a friend of hers wanted to buy a Bullitt clone, and Susan went with her to check it out, that she really fell in love. Susan ended up buying a '65 Mustang and totally restoring it. She still owns the 302 powered, Honey Gold coupe today.

In 2019, while at the Ford dealer to trade in her '72 F150 for a new Ranger, she saw the '19 Bullitt and fell



stable of blue oval vehicles. Then it happened while looking on Facebook marketplace in 2020, she saw a '67 fastback project, drove to San Jose, and bought it. It needed a lot of work and had a worn-out 302, but Susan had the vision to see what it could become. After having the fastback towed home (following in her 2019 Bullitt), she got to work redoing everything. Her friend Robert painted the car in Dark Highland

Green, and she ordered a crate 302 that never showed up. That turned out to be a blessing, because she found out that she could get a 351 Windsor stroked to 427 cubic inches and had Prestige Motorsports build her a fuel injected version, then backed it up with a Tremec 5 Everyone notices the beautiful green paint, Bullitt styling, and the flashy engine, but there are many other details, like the black leather

to match the '19 Bullitt, that require a closer inspection to appreciate. All these details added up to win Susan the "Best Ford" award at the Madness on Main show in Martinez this year. That's where I noticed her car, too, and invited her to come to a DVMA meeting. Now she and her Mustangs are staples at DVMA events, and she's even hosted some "Cars, Coffee, and Cuts" events at Blades Co., her barber shop in The Orchards, Walnut Creek. With three Mustangs to choose from, you're pretty likely to see Susan driving one of them to a show or event near you.

SoCal Stunners

Planning a trip to Southern California anytime soon? Well, if you love Shelbys and want to see a truly awesome collection spanning all years and historical details then look no further than the Segerstrom Shelby Event Center located in a business park in Irvine, CA. It contains the collection of the Segerstrom family who have been ranchers in the Southern California area for generations and are now displaying their meticulously restored Cobras and Shelbys in a stunning 2-story facility. By following a designated route through the glass and marble space you recount the Carroll Shelby story chronologically with



multimedia presentations and stunning examples of his inspired designs. The center has been open for about 2 years now and, similar to the Cobra Experience, they do weddings and corporate events there. The huge lobby had a 25-ft Christmas tree and they had just had a wedding in that area the day before.

Besides the beautiful cars and Carroll Shelby memorabilia they have a large display of "petroliana" (restored antique gas pumps and signs). Some of the low prices showing on the pumps are prices I remember paying. Does that mean I'm an antique too? There also was a great collection of coin-op children's riding toys. Remember begging Mom for a turn on one of those after coming out of the supermarket?

This was a wonderful 2 hours spent in an immaculate shrine to Carrol Shelby and his cars. Even people who are not "car people" will enjoy it as was the case with my sister and brother/in-law who thought it would entertain us and it sure did. 
