# **DVMA Member's Mustangs**

In 2019, Bill and Julie Kinsey had finished restoring their 1966 Thunderbird and were looking for a new project when they found this red 1999 Mustang V6 coupe through the Cars 2nd Chance charity program run by the local Rotary club. Mechanically sound, this pony just needed some TLC, which the Kinseys provided. New glass, lights, and a hood were installed, along with a rebuilt automatic transmission and beautiful new red paint. They did such a great job with this Mustang that it was used in the Cars 2nd Chance booth at the 2021 Orinda Car Show as an example of how beatiful one of their donated cars can



turn out. It also won Best in Class, 1994-2004 Mustang, and the 2022 DVMA Show & Shine!



With the red car looking and driving great, the Kinseys were thinking about their next project. While talking to DVMA President Harry Davis, Bill found out that Harry had a car available - a True Blue 2001 GT automatic with only 80K miles on the car and 20K on a new engine. So, in April 2021, the "Harry Davis Special", as Bill calls it, changed ownership. This is a uniquely customized Mustang. It has Cobra suspension with 13" front and 11" rear brakes, adjustable coilovers, Roush body panels, and 2001 Bullitt wheels. Pop the hood and you'll see a Roush cold air intake and throttle body for a

few extra ponies. It was even featured in the July 2007 issue of the Feed Bag. This car turned out to be not much of a project because, as Bill says, "Harry built it just as I would have."

What do you do when your project cars are "done"? Drive them, of course! These cars are family projects - the Kinseys build them together and enjoy them together. They recently took both

Mustangs on the 104 mile Pioneer Poker Run in Oroville, CA, not to mention the 250 mile round trip to get there and back. This annual event raises money for local charities and is sponsored by the Oro Dam Cruisers car club. Bill and Julie drove the blue Mustang, and their daughter Emily drove the red one. To make it a real family affair, they were joined by Bill's brother in his 1963 Mercury Meteor S-33, and nephew in his 1966 Mustang. Family, fun, and Fords. Sounds like the Kinseys are on to something great here. Let's join them on the next DVMA outing and drive our Mustangs like they were meant to be driven.

# Miles of car show: trekking at the DVMA Show & Shine

Who knew that hanging out with pals in the parking lot and showing cars could be all the exercise you really need? The Fitbit knows and it's happy to let you share the data. At our June 4th DVMA Show & Shine I turned mine on and it I wasn't expecting what it told me.



I'm a real data nerd in my work life and hobbies, and the modern fitness tracking device provides a wealth of facts and statistics. Hiking and mountain biking are my two main fitness activities, and there are some interesting categories of information that I've collected over the years. For example, in 2021 hiking and riding I accumulated 70,000 feet of


elevation gain. Elevation is something I intentionally seek trying to get between 500' and 1000' per adventure, and it's nice to have the numbers. I like to take every opportunity to track my activities so I can add to the body of data, and I made a point to do so at our June 4 show.

Typical car show activity for me involves walking the field and visiting every vehicle. Sometimes I'll make additional laps in case I missed an owner of an interesting car. Depending on the size the venue, that can add up a fair amount of distance. Our show at Streets of Brentwood, as you can see on the map, had me walking in a patch of about 2000'x2000' with a sortie or two down the lane for sign deployment/

So, between setting up, placing signs, parking, judging, and visiting, in the 7 hours we were there my accumulated distance was 5.97 miles (12753 steps). Consumed about 1,500 calories too, but at the average speed of 0.8MPH my calorie burn here was similar to sitting in my recliner at home watching a Mecum auction. Also, somehow the device clocked my top speed as 15.9MPH which is highly unlikely given my current mass and power/weight ratio. On the other hand, the two cups of coffee that I downed on the drive over was on the move a while later and I was on the run to the portable necessaries rather hastily. Most likely it's a flawed interpolation of time and distance due to satellite feed interruption, but hey, what do I know?

With that top speed anomaly aside, the data is telling me that if I'm looking for a workout, the parking lot is a viable alternative to the trail. Gas up the Mustang and break out the lawn chairs 'cuz we're going hiking!

They are willing and able to train and assist anyone interested in holding theirs or anyone else's office. We want and need "new blood" in our club; people with new and fresh ideas. It can be hard work sometimes, but mostly it's fun and rewarding! Please consider nominating yourself or someone else, and **bring it to the meeting on July 13**. You can also **mail it to the DVMA PO Box** or **email it to DVMAeditor@aol.com by July 22**.

#### **Duties of the DVMA Elected Officers**

**President** - The President shall preside at all meetings, and act as Chairman of any Executive Board meeting. Further, the President shall: Appoint committees as required for various Association functions; Perform any other duties regularly associated with this office.

**Vice-President** - The Vice-President shall act in the capacity of the President in the absence of the President. Further, the Vice-President shall: Perform any duties regularly associated with this office, or those designated by the President. The Vice-President, or his/her designee, shall be responsible for obtaining prizes for and conducting the raffle at each business meeting and any other function where a raffle is appropriate.

**Treasurer / Membership** - The Treasurer shall keep a record of and dispense the funds of the Association per the mandate of the Executive Board. He/she shall make a statement of his/her accounts at each business meeting, and at other such times as the Association or Executive Board may require. Further, the Treasurer shall: Collect dues and present bills authorized by the Executive Board; Disbursement shall be made by the Treasurer only after approval by the Executive Board; Act as Chairman of the Membership Committee and shall screen each membership application as required by the By-Laws. In addition, he/she shall: Notify members of delinquencies; Distribution of identification badges to members.

**Secretary** - The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of the Association meetings and those of the Executive Board. He/she shall keep a record of all business transacted in the name of the Association. Further, the Secretary shall: Give due notice of any election, appointment, meeting, or any other business requiring the personal attention of any member; Have charge of the papers and correspondence of the Association and its Executive Board; Perform any duties regularly associated with this office, or those designated by the President.

**Board Member** (Three) - Board members shall assist the President and Executive Board by performing any duties specified by the Executive Board.

**<u>Sergeant-At-Arms</u>** - The Sergeant-At-Arms shall be responsible for maintaining order at Association functions, and any other duties specified by the Executive Board.

**Tour Coordinator** - The Tour Coordinator shall be responsible for maintaining the calendar of events, making the calendar of events known to the Newsletter Editor and Webmaster on a monthly basis, and maintaining and distributing event signup sheets. The Tour Coordinator shall also ensure that all event organizers understand and follow the established procedures for planning, organizing and carrying out an event. Event procedures shall be established by the Executive Board.

**Newsletter Editor** - The Newsletter Editor will be responsible to assure that the "Monthly Newsletter" is mailed or emailed once each month to each member. The Newsletter Editor shall ensure that the newsletter contains sufficient content to be interesting. The Newsletter Editor will make every effort to publish the Association calendar and Association contact information in every issue.

#### **Non-Elected Officers Include:**

**Historian** - The Historian shall be responsible for maintaining all Association archives including, but not limited to, awards, newsletters, articles, and other media pertaining to the Association.

**Webmaster** - The Webmaster shall be responsible for establishing and maintaining an internet website that shall include, at a minimum, membership information, a current Association calendar, and Association contact information including email addresses.

**Storekeeper** - The Storekeeper shall be responsible for keeping stock of DVMA merchandise, having merchandise at the meetings, and having a store at the annual Show 'n Shine and other appropriate events.
