

Bill Brandt Ford Turns 50!

Not many car dealerships can boast about being in business for 50 years, but Bill Brandt Ford in Brentwood, a longtime supporter of DVMA, can and did in a big way on the evening of October 20th. A beautiful catered gala with food, drinks and live music was spread out over the parking lot and showroom (minus the new display cars and trucks, of course) celebrating the business's 50th anniversary. Fun fact: a new electric F-150 Lightning truck's battery was powering all the lights, live music, sound system and twinkle lights outside!

The early years of the business started in the 50's when it was owned by a Mr. Chapman and his wife Earline. She was at the reception and, at age 95 years young, told me how her husband was killed in a freak hunting accident leaving her with 3 small children and a busy car dealership to run. She ran the business for 12 years making her one of only a handful of female-owned Ford dealerships in the country. Go Earline! Bill Brant bought the dealership in 1972. He passed away a few years ago but his sons, Jim and Rob, along with many other family members, carry on the legacy today. Rob Brandt has been a major contributor to the success of our yearly car shows by generously providing t-shirts, port-a-potties, folding tables and space rental fees at Streets of Brentwood. We are so grateful for that. Thank you for your ongoing support and congratulations on your first 50 years!

Classic Sports Racing Group Charity Challenge

DVMA's October tour was a visit to this year's Classic Sports Racing Group (CSRG) Charity Challenge at Sonoma Raceway on Oct 1, with Matthew Hawkes and Bill Kinsey attending. It's racing, it's a car show, it's a full throttle living museum with belch-fire exhibits roaring in competition where every owner and driver is a friendly and knowledgeable docent.

CSRG was formed in 1968 for the purpose of preserving vintage sports and racing cars that are no longer eligible or competitive in club racing, and conducts Spring and Fall events at Sonoma.



This Fall's event saw participating cars from the 1950s through the 1980s, resulting in a diversity of racing classes. Large and small displacement production cars, small displacement sports racers, an MG Reunion class, nine classes in all with some cars eligible for multiple classes. Formula Ford had 37 entrants, the biggest class of the event. Considered to be a training ground in Formula racing, Formula Ford started in the 1960s in Europe, was popular in America from its introduction here in 1967 through the 1990s, and continues today. Typically powered by Ford's 1600cc and 2.0 liter 4 cylinder OHC engines, Formula Fords are still enjoyed here in US vintage racing.



Closer to our club's interests, four Mustangs ran in the large displacement production class, duking it out with Corvettes and others in a glimpse back at the legendary Trans-Am races of the 60s and 70s.

An extra treat on the track was Rob fuller, a friend of our club mate and newsletter editor Erik Miller. Rob fielded two production Datsuns: a 240Z and a 510. We cheered him and the 510 on to take second place in an exciting grapple with a very fast Alfa Romeo GTV. He raced both cars on Saturday.

Along with the racing are static displays of historic race cars, historic tow-vehicles (1950s GM Greyhound bus, 1960 Ford pickup), cool cruisers and sports cars, and more interesting and knowledgeable people than you would otherwise meet in a lifetime. As we walked the pit area and made conversation we were treated to insights on Bruce McLaren and Can-Am racing, the wooden frames of Morgan sports cars, and the



mechanical specifics of Formula Fords. There were other cars there not racing, including a couple of 351-powered DeTomaso Panteras, a couple of old-school '32 Ford flathead hot rods, and a 260ci Sunbeam Tiger. No shortage of interesting and gorgeous cars to feast the eyes on, wheel-to-wheel action on the track, and friendly people to meet and talk with.

Avocado Double Deluxe. No, that isn't a healthy new ice cream flavor, or something from the secret menu at In-N-Out Burger. It is, in fact, a very 70's interior color scheme offered by Ford that comprised two different shades of avocado green. Mark Vasgerdsian's 1973 Mustang convertible was not only built with the rarely ordered Avocado Double Deluxe interior, but with the coordinating special order paint color of Metallic Ivy Glow and a Bright White power top. This is one rare and beautiful pony.

Mark has owned over 100 cars in his life, but this Mustang has a special significance. The original owners were neighbors of Mark's when he was young and as a kid he was paid to wash this

car, telling the owners that someday he'd own it himself. In the 90's, the owners called Mark and asked if he was ready to buy it, but the timing was bad - he was already in the middle of another Mustang restoration.

Years later, Mark was walking out of a deli in San Francisco, and there was the Mustang double-parked out front. He recognized the license plate and knew it was the same car. Mark waited and spoke to the owner, who confirmed that he had bought the car from Mark's old neighbors, and said that he was not interested in selling.

Fast forward a few more years, and Mark was looking online for a new project when he spotted an ad for a green Mustang convertible - you guessed it - the same car he knew and loved as a kid. He went to see the car and was shocked at its condition.

The last time he had seen it in SF it had still looked great. Now it was "a mess": the paint was faded, the top was torn, there was mold growing in the interior, and it hadn't run in years. Mark knew he had to save this

car, so he bought it and towed it home. He spent the next four years restoring it cosmetically and mechanically, including a rebuild of its 351 Cleveland, while preserving as much of the car's originality as possible. Did I mention that amazingly, this car still wears its original coat of Ivy Glow paint? Mark has been enjoying owning and driving this special convertible ever since.

In 2022, Mark decided it was time for another car, and he felt that he'd like to get a newer Mustang. Not a big fan of the usual blue, red, or black cars, he wanted a green one, of

course. When he found out that Ford was no longer building 2022 models to start work on the '23 version, he searched local dealers and found a 2022 GT in Eruption Green with a black interior at Putnam Ford in San

Mateo. Even though they are 49 years apart, the two green colors are amazingly similar.

Mark and his wife Gail were DVMA members years ago, but their son's involvement in sports and other responsibilities meant that they couldn't attend most DVMA meetings and events, so they let their membership lapse. Mark recently ran into Harry & Karen Davis while shopping at Costco, and they invited him to come to a meeting. Mark attended the October meeting and signed back up, becoming a DVMA member once again. We're happy to welcome him, his family, and his two green Mustangs back to DVMA!
