There were several Mustangs in the show, including DVMA member Mike Fontaine's turbocharged custom 1967 convertible (see the feature story on page 5 of August's Feed Bag), plus some "future DVMA members": Susan's green 1967 Bullitt tribute fastback, Frank's red 1967 Convertible, and Craig's 1968 blue fastback with a saddle interior. DVMA Member's Mustangs

Back when Shawn Willis was in high school, he really wanted a classic Mustang. He had some friends who had them, and he'd had the opportunity to ride in both a Boss 302 and 429, which left quite an impression. But, there was one problem. As Shawn says, "I didn't have Mustang money. I had Cougar money." So, his high school ride was a 1970 Cougar with a deluxe interior and factory sunroof - a cool car in its own right, but his Mustang Fever never went away.

Once he was older and had saved up some Mustang money, Shawn began looking for an early GT - his dream car. In 1999, his wife Micheline found an online ad for an early Mustang and convinced him to go see it. Shawn brought along his friend, Mustang aficionado and longtime DVMA member Paul Gwizdak, to go look at the Mustang. The car was a was a 1966 GT convertible with a 4 speed, A/C, black deluxe interior, and though now light blue, was originally painted in the rare code 4 Silver Frost. With encouragement from his wife, and approval from his knowledgeable friend Paul, Shawn brought the Mustang home and began a lengthy and still ongoing



restoration. The engine has been rebuilt, the transmission upgraded to a 5 speed, and the plan is to return it to its original color. Around this time Shawn also joined the DVMA.

Working on the '66 when time allowed, the Willises still wanted a fun car to drive, so in 2016 they bought a 2015 GT convertible in Race Red with a Ceramic interior and 20" Foundry wheels. Equipped with Ford Performance lowering springs and exhaust, they now have 20,000 miles on this pony - only about 700 of those with the top up. This car has been on many long road trips, including driving in 2019 with five other Mustangs down to the Fabulous Fords Forever show in Anaheim, then out Route 66 through

California, Arizona, and New Mexico to Amarillo, Texas. The return trip took them home through some picturesque places, including both Grand Canyon and Yosemite National Parks.

After seeing how much fun Paul Gwizdak was having with his 2013 Boss 302 on the track, Shawn ordered a 2020 Shelby GT350 in Ford Performance Blue with white stripes, Recaro seats and the Track Pack option. Now Shawn is having his own 526 horsepower worth of fun with four track days in 2021 and more this year.

In case these three Mustangs aren't enough to convince you that Shawn is a die-hard Ford fanatic, check this out: he also has a 2000 F-150 Lightning, a 1968 Torino GT fastback that his parents bought new, and get this - he still owns the 1970 Cougar that he had in high school. How about that?



Ford Unveils New 7th Generation 2024 Mustang



On Wednesday, September 14th, Ford presented the new 7th generation Mustang to the world at a press event in Detroit. Dubbed the S650, the new Mustang features an exterior redesign as well as an amazing new interior loaded with state of the art tech. There will be no electric or hybrid options - the 5.0 Coyote V8 and the Ecoboost turbo 4 cylinder will continue as the two available engines, and there is even an available drift brake from the factory. 
