



During our countless car-spotting escapades, I found myself falling for the allure of American muscle. The deep, guttural roar of a muscle car's engine had me hooked. I started dreaming of trading in my reliable Subaru Outback for something that screamed power and freedom—a Mustang. But not just any Mustang; I wanted the true American muscle experience.

One day, Shaya and I were out and about when he spotted a stunning ruby red Roush Mustang at a dealership. He couldn't stop talking about it for weeks, pleading with me to at least check it out. What's a Poker Run?

That's a question with two answers: It's a way to add a road trip into a card-playing hobby, or it's a way to add a game of chance into a road trip. Either way, it's a fun event where you get together with your gear-head pals in your cool ride and hit the road. Simply put, a poker run is a tour where the participants stop at several points along the way and are given a playing card at each stop, to be assembled into a poker hand. At the end of the tour the cards are compared among the participants, and whoever has the best hand wins. What do they win? That depends on the group. Maybe a hearty round of applause and getting to buy lunch for your pals, or maybe it's a prize of some sort.





Julie and I have been regular participants in the Pioneer Poker Run in the Oroville area since 2021, organized as a charity event by the Oro Dam Cruisers car club. The course is about 100 miles in Butte and Yuba counties, attracts 50-100 participants on motorcycles and in interesting cars, and the winners take home nice prizes donated by local businesses. Entry fee proceeds go to local charities. My brother, who lives in Oroville, puts together a team of family members and close pals. We've fielded vintage and modern Blue Oval entrants over the years, with this year's group consisting of his '63 Mercury Meteor, a '66 Mustang, a 32-ish rat rod, and our 2001 Mustang. A Family of Fine Automobiles. In 2022 we entered both of our Mustangs, with Emily and Julie in the '99 and me solo in the '01.

There are five stops in the Pioneer Poker Run where you get a card with a number that corresponds to your entrant number (I was 587 this year), in parking lots and safe roadside turnouts. The first stop this year was actually on the Oroville Dam. In some poker runs the stops are at restaurants or bakeries where you have a chance to buy a snack or a beverage. Since these aren't timed events, it's nice to have a chance to get out of the car for a bit here and there. The sixth and final stop is the destination where you turn in your cards, and of course an informal car show ensues as entrants arrive from the course. This year there were food vendors and music which added to the "car"nival atmosphere. Prizes go to the three best poker hands, and are announced at a specified time (ya snooze, ya lose, even if you have a royal flush).

Any chance to go cruising with pals in fun cars is fine by me, and if I have to keep up on the details of poker so be it. It's the luck of the draw that'll get you a shiny new toolbox in the end, but it's a sure winner for fun when you bet on car people doing car stuff with their cool cars.

When Things go Sideways...

No, I'm not talking about when the newsletter crashes and I end up having to recreate a month's work in 5 days! For those of you who don't know, I recently acquired another Mustang - a Wimbledon White '67 coupe with a red interior, 6 cylinder engine, 3 speed manual, and not much else. This was the "Secretary's car" that Lee Iacocca hired Shelby to distance the Mustang's image from, and I named her Lois. My first order of business was to rebuild the leaky carburetor- big thanks to DVMA Past President Harry Davis for coming over to accomplish that for me. Next on the list was to replace the original(!), marshmallowy suspension & steering, plus the leaking oil pan gasket. Uh-oh! When I removed the oil pan I found a bunch of metal parts lying in the bottom. Definitely not good. I recognized them as bits of the thrust bearing, and sure enough, pulling that main cap showed that the original(!) thrust bearing was coming apart. I was NOT going to pull this engine and have another non-running project right now, so I did something I've never done before: "rolled" in new bearings, primed the oil pump, and crossed my fingers. It worked! Lois runs great and the oil pressure with the new bearings is fantastic. I got all the new suspension and steering bolted on & aligned, and she drives like a brand new, 56-year-old car now. While the steering column was out, I painted it and replaced the badly worn dash pad. The interior is a much nicer place to spend time now.

A big thank you to DVMA Board Member Matthew Hawkes for coming over to help with bleeding the brakes and firing up the engine after the bearing swap. Members helping each other keep their Mustangs on the road - that's what DVMA is all about!


