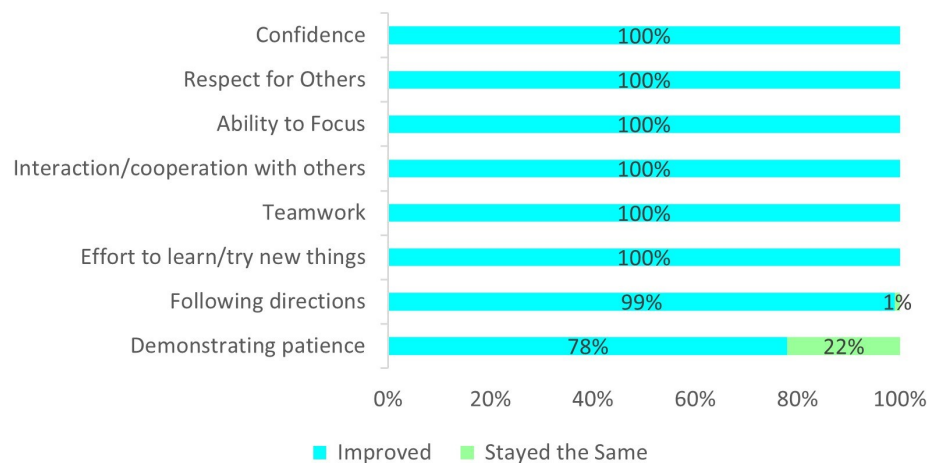

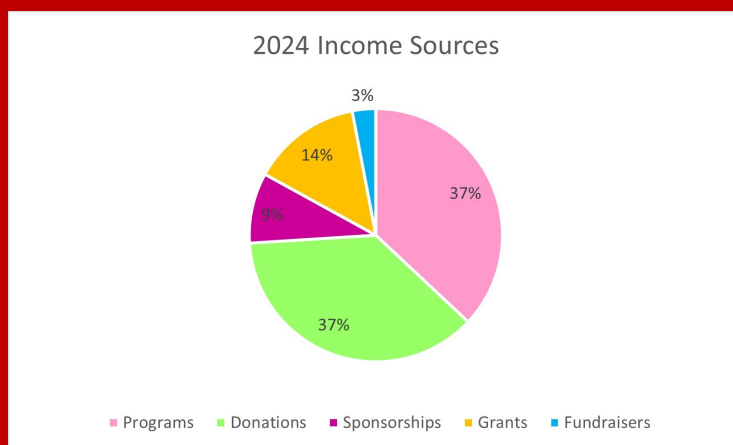


Strategic Initiatives

- 12% Hope for Hearts Program growth from 2023 to 2024. 42% growth since 2022!
- Opening of our satellite location at Oakwood Stables to offer our programming due to community requests for a location closer to Johnson county.
- Certification for four of our facilitators in Horse Powered Reading to improve literacy.
- Expansion of our Entrepreneur Executive Coaching Program.
- Charity Partner for the Seen Through Horses Campaign.
- Continuing education opportunities for our facilitators to strengthen their facilitation skills.
- Received grants from Smithville Charitable Foundation, Brown County Community Foundation, and the ECHO Foundation.
- Continued development of our relationship with Cummins through funding and volunteer opportunities as well as participation in their employee We Care Fair.
- Speaking engagements at the Equine Assisted Learning Leadership Summit and at Brown County PEO .
- Journey to Leadership workshops for Adult & Child Managers, The Wedding Studios Executive Team, and Pleasant Grove Elementary Teachers.
- Free to Be Me for Girls ages 10-14.
- Gateways for Groups workshop for Lutheran Hills Animal Camp.
- Addition of Rain to our farm.

"I can be a leader. I have what it takes I just didn't know it until the horses showed me."

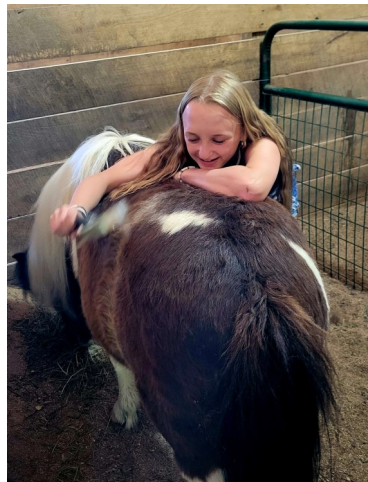
"I don't have to be like other people. I can be myself."

"Being with the horses makes me feel calm and helps me slow my thoughts down."

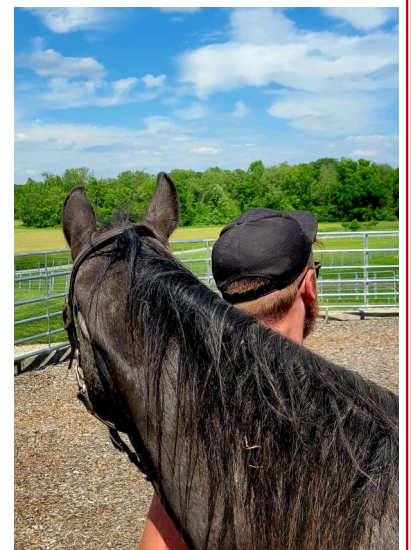


"I have learned to listen better and follow directions at home and at school."

"Today gave me the open honest space to be transparent and plan actions for change."

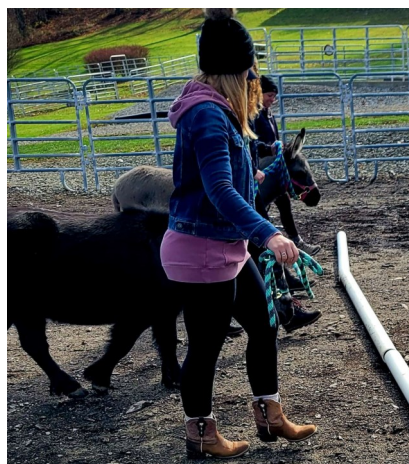
"It's okay to be confident and to speak up if I need something."
