

Lesson 2: After the White Flag — Walking in Obedient Trust

Lesson Focus

This lesson builds on surrender by addressing what follows: obedience. While surrender is a decisive moment, obedience is a daily walk that keeps believers aligned with God's will.

Key Scriptures (ESV)

- Proverbs 3:5–6 — Trusting God fully rather than relying on personal understanding.
- Genesis 12:1 — Abraham obeys God without full clarity or explanation.
- James 1:22 — Obedience is the evidence of genuine faith.

Teaching Summary

Many believers surrender emotionally but hesitate to obey practically. Scripture teaches that trust often requires movement before clarity. Obedience does not earn God's favor; it reveals where trust truly rests.

Key Teaching Points

- Surrender hands God control; obedience keeps us from taking it back.
- Trust means acting without full information.
- Faith is demonstrated through obedience, not intentions.
- Delayed obedience often masks a struggle with trust.

Student Reflection

- Where have I surrendered in words but not in action?
- What step of obedience might God be asking of me right now?
- Am I waiting for certainty when God is calling me to trust?
