Prayer Beyond Words: Opening to Life Last month, I invited us into a shared congregational prayer — a way of joining our voices and hearts in asking God to grow our souls in love and courage. As we continue with this daily practice, I also want us to explore the deeper dimensions of prayer.

When most of us think of prayer, we think of words: asking, thanking, praising. But as the great mystics remind us, words are only the husk of prayer, not its kernel. True prayer is not about managing God or getting God's attention — it is about becoming attentive ourselves.

Prayer is a way of stepping off the noisy "subway" of our thoughts and emotions, as Brian McLaren puts it, and finding the place of quiet within. In that stillness, something shifts: we discover that we are not our racing thoughts, not our anxieties, not even our best intentions. We are God's beloved. From that place of resting awareness, new gifts arise: insight, peace, courage, compassion.

Prayer also asks us to embrace a radical openness to life. Matthew Fox calls prayer a "yes" to life — and sometimes that also means a "no" to injustice. To pray is to stand open before all that is, to welcome reality in its fullness, and to sense God's presence permeating every aspect of our lives. Prayer that closes us off from life, or becomes a substitute for action, is not prayer at all. This is why prayer is transformative. It doesn't remove us from the world but roots us more deeply in it. It aligns our small lives with God's great Dream — a Dream of wholeness, healing, and justice.

Prayer grounds us in love so that we can live large: more compassionately, more generously, more courageously.

As you continue to pray our congregational prayer, I encourage you also to experiment with silence, breath, or simply paying attention to the life you live. Let your prayer be less about words and more about presence. And remember: God is not out there waiting to be found. God is here — in the quiet of your heart, in the life of our community, and in the very breath you breathe.
