Drug Certification Form—(All market exhibitors must sign)

Animal/Exhibitor Disqualification: To foster fair competition, provide a level playing field and to protect the safety of food, the showing of unethically fitted livestock, livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered, or animals being administered unapproved drugs is strictly prohibited.

Unethical Fitting: Unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, conformation, musculature, or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Unethical fitting includes the use of injections or feeding of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass. Unethical fitting also includes, but is not limited to, artificially filling animals by stomach pumping, airing injections and bruising. Animals showing signs of having been unethically fitted will be disqualified.

Unapproved Drug Use: The showing of any animal that has been administered during its life any quantity of any unapproved drug chemical or medication is strictly prohibited. Such drugs include, but are not limited to any diuretic, unapproved growth stimulant or other unapproved medication. Unapproved means not approved by the Food Drug Administration (FDA) and/or the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for slaughter animals including animals that may be destined for human consumption. IF any approved drug has been administered to the animal, sufficient time must have passed so that the animal does not test positive for any drugs or chemical at weigh in.

Animal Inspection: As condition for participation in the Show, exhibitor must agree to submit any animal entered by the exhibitor for inspection. Exhibitor agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests reqe4suted by the Show. Exhibitor also agrees that the opinion reached by the Show or its officials as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age shall by final and binding without recourse against the Show or any of its officers. Further, the Show specifically reserves the right to have tissue, blood, or urine laboratory analysis made on any animal entered for competition. The conclusions reached by the laboratory as to whether such animal has been administered a diuretic, unapproved growth stimulant or other unapproved medication, or has not been properly withdrawn form approved drugs shall b final and binding with recourse against the Show or any of its officers. An exhibitors of an animal testing positive for any drug or mediation or unapproved chemical may forfeit all rights and privileges' to exhibit livestock in the future at the Show.

2026 Panola County Jr. Livestock Show <u>County Bred Verification Form</u> <u>Cattle and Swine Only!</u>

In order for a <u>steer, heifer or market barrow or gilt</u> to qualify for the "Panola County Bred" portion of the Jr. Livestock Show the following must apply:

Sir (Bull/Boar) and Dam (Cow/Sow) <u>MUST</u> reside in Panola County at the time of conception

If the Dam (Cow/Sow) is bred by A.I. the process <u>MUST</u> be done in Panola County

The exhibitor will be required to sign verifying that to the best of his/her knowledge that their animal is Panola County Bred.

The parent/guardian will be required to sign verifying that to the best of their knowledge the exhibitor's animal is Panola County Bred

The breeder, (owner of the bull/boar and/or cow/sow) or the A.I. technician will be required to sign verifying that the animal was bred and had conceived in Panola County
