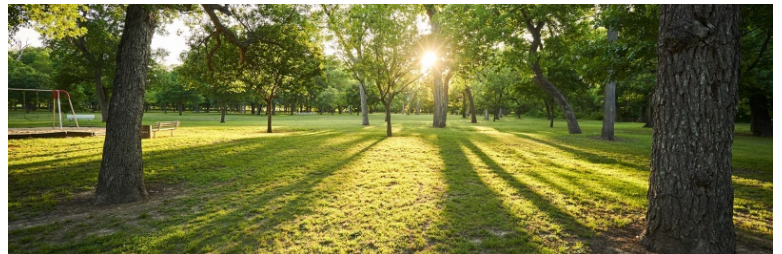

Director Duties and Responsibilities

The OCA Board of Directors provide leadership, governance, legal and financial oversight of the organization. We also facilitate community dialogue and liaise with local governments on a variety of topics such as: land use development, transportation, parks and greenways, quality of environment, and economic and social development.

Director Responsibilities include:

- Help fulfill our Mandate and support our Mission and Vision
- Maintain an interest in and help achieve the goals of the OCA as set out in the strategic plan
- Prepare for and participate in 11 monthly Board meetings
- Chair or participate in at least one committee
- Attend the Annual General Meeting
- Participate in Board-staff orientation & planning sessions
- Attend community events and volunteer for special events, as an ambassador the Association, as time permits
- Participate in periodic reviews and development of strategic plans and organizational policies
- Support board decisions once made
- Follow our bylaws and other policies that apply to the Board of Directors
- Participate in the approval of the annual budget
- Participate in identifying prospective Board members and recruitment activities
- Participate in supervisory duties related to the Executive Director position
