INTRODUCTION

Logan River Redlands Horse Trail Riding Club (The Club), commenced as a trail riding club in 2002. Working Equitation was included as a discipline at the Club in 2018. In 2025 the Club was the successful applicant for an expression of interest to lease the grounds located at 30 Irwin Road, Cedar Grove. January 2026 saw the Club move from the grounds at Chambers Flat to Boondarn Park, 30 Irwin Road, Cedar Grove. This move has enabled the club to expand from trail riding and working equitation to include dressage, ranch riding and show jumping.

The new location will also enable internal member and participation competition events, training clinics, multi-discipline equestrian events providing a safe, relaxed and fun competition and learning environment for riders of all skill levels from beginner to advanced.

The grounds will also be open to other community groups and equestrian clinicians on a fee for hire basis outside of The Club arranged events.

The Club will strive to improve facilities and services to club members. Suggestions and feedback from members are welcome. Members are very welcome to contact the committee by email with your suggestions for improving the club.

On April 4th, 2026 the official club name changed to Logan Equestrian and Quarter Horse Club Inc.

Management

As the Club offers a number of different disciplines it operates under the umbrella of Equestrian Australia (EA) National and Equestrian Queensland (EQ) State Constitutions for working equitation, dressage, and show jumping. For Trail Riding and Ranch Riding, the Club operates under the umbrella of Australian Trail Horse Riding Association (ATHRA). The two governing bodies are required to cover the insurance and governing requirements of the different disciplines. The Club is managed by an enthusiastic and pro-active committee.

Facilities

The Club enjoys some of the best equestrian club facilities in the area. We have two competition grade sand dressage arenas, an undercover arena with security surveillance and a fenced round yard. Additionally, we have a large, fenced grass area for working equitation, trail obstacles, ranch riding and show jumping.

Horse facilities include 22 steel day yards, two separate biosecurity yards and two wash bays. Club house facilities include a full kitchen, meeting room, storage shed and first aid areas and toilets including disabled facilities. The clubhouse was completely renovated in 2010 with funding from Logan City Council.

Membership

As we are currently affiliated with two different Governing bodies our Club membership is tailored under these Governing bodies; Equestrian Australia and ATHRA.

On event days, you must nominate to compete to be allowed access to the competition areas (Check which Discipline is scheduled as this will indicate what areas of the grounds are

being used). We provide a fun, relaxed and collaborative learning environment and a great place to improve your skills and compete in all disciplines.

We send out regular emails to keep members informed and post notifications on our Club Facebook page.

Meetings

Members are welcome to attend monthly Management Meetings as observers. Members General Meetings will be held twice per year where members have the opportunity to participate. Members are always welcome to provide suggestions, concerns or requests to the committee by email at any time.

The Management Team usually meets on the second Monday of the month via TEAMS or at the clubhouse and all members are welcome to attend as observers from 6.30pm but must email the secretary and let them know they would like to attend.

Safety and Risk Management

All EA and Club events under the EA banner are conducted in accordance with Equestrian Australia or Australian National Working Equitation rules and regulations;
All ATHRA and Club events under the ATHRA banner are conducted in accordance with ATHRA rules and regulations, and the club's current Member's Handbook.

Safety of horses, riders and spectators is paramount. Where a horse's behaviour is deemed to be dangerous to others the person responsible for the horse may be requested to leave the clinic or event and move to an area which does not create a danger to others.

Riders, members and visitors must always adhere to the requirements specified in the club's current Member's Handbook while on the club grounds and interacting on social media.

Any club member who puts the safety and wellbeing of their fellow club members at risk or who deliberately ignores the conditions of membership outlined in this document will need to show cause as to why their membership should not be revoked.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR USE OF MEMBERSHIP

All members must agree to adhere to the Members Code of Conduct. Please refer to Appendix A of the Members Handbook

Dress Standards

Club/Participation/Competitive

As per Equestrian Australia / ANWE / ATHRA rules unless stated otherwise.

Club internal dressage competitions

Equestrian Australia dress or club shirt may be worn in lieu of other light-coloured collared shirt.

Club clinic and training days

Members must be presentable with appropriate footwear and current safety helmet.

Safety Requirements

Safety helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards as specified by Equestrian Australia (Refer to Equestrian Australia website). Members are responsible for ensuring their helmet meets current standards and has appropriate tagging.

Club Shirts and Merchandise

Social Media

Use of social media by members should be used to promote and benefit the club to the equestrian world and the general public. The club does not discuss club business on social media. Negative or derogatory comments on social media may result in your membership being revoked. Point of Contact

The committee and/or subcommittee members are your first point of contact for all queries.

EVENT INFORMATION

General Event Information

The club grounds may have restricted use prior to the day and on the day of the event. Grounds will be closed for maintenance as required. Details of restricted use will be on the club's Facebook page.

On the day of the event all questions should be directed to the event organiser.

As a competitor you are expected to help on the day that you are competing with jobs and packing away, please refer to the section Volunteers and Helpers to ensure that you are familiar with what is expected.

Exclusion zone for Undercover Arena

There is a 10m exclusion zone around the Undercover Arena. Please do not enter the marked area.

Horse Health Declaration (HHD)

A completed Horse Health Declaration must be handed in at each of our calendar events and when camping. A link to download this form can be found on the Club website.

Smoking Laws

Smoking is banned within 10 metres of all club facilities and activities.

The coverage of the ban includes all club facilities including the sporting ground, riding area, the viewing area, public seating at the grounds and any other area reserved for use by the competitors and the officials. This includes the use of all smoking products, including electronic cigarettes.

Water

Please be conservative when using the wash bay as the club must pay for water usage.

Lunging

Lunging is to be in the round yard or in the grassed areas only. Lunging must **not occur** in the competition arenas or the undercover arena. This may cause damage to our facilities and possibly endanger other members using that facility.

First Aid

A qualified First Aid officer will be available at all club competitions. The club's first aid kit and supplies are stored in the white cupboard in the scoring/meeting room in the club house.

Ribbons/placings

DRESSAGE

Participation/Competitive competitions ribbons go to 6th place. Ties are allowed if equal placings cannot be resolved.

Internal Club competitions, ribbons go to 6th place depending on the number of entries, ties are allowed if equal placings cannot be resolved.

WORKING EQUITATION

Point day and HOTY competitions ribbons go to 6th place. Ties are allowed if equal placings the highest Dressage score will determine the placings

RANCH

Ranch Events highlight the versatility of the hard working, multi-talented horses and riders who spend their days keeping the cattle industry running. The ability of a horse to work at a forward yet economical pace in a natural frame in partnership with its rider is the basis for Ranch Events.

Pattern events such as Ranch Riding, Ranch Reining, Ranch Pleasure and Ranch Trail test the horse and rider's abilities and education while they negotiate a series of manoeuvres and transitions.

A horse's gaits, movement and ability to ride confidently amongst other horses is showcased in Ranch on the Rail; and its ability to work cattle is tested in Ranch Cow Work, Ranch Cutting, Ranch Roping and Ranch Boxing.

Mechanical cow boxing is a class where a rider uses a horse to control a remote-controlled mechanical flat that simulates the movements of live cattle. The goal is to demonstrate precision, control and eye appeal as you manoeuvre your horse in response to the mechanical cow's movements. Each run is 50 seconds long and the judge will blow a whistle when the time expires.

Ranch Conformation is a led class in which horses are judged against the standard for an ideal working ranch horse based on their manners and confirmation.

Points Day General Rules

These rules are based on the Ranch Horse Association of Australia Rule Book
This rule book should be referred to for detailed descriptions of classes and tack and attire requirements.

- A horse and rider combination must not be entered in more than one division. The same rider may enter a different horse in another division eg a young horse in Green Horse and an Educated Horse in Open
- Competitors can access their Judge's Score Sheets after an event by contacting the Official Points Scorer/Club Secretary/Ranch Subcommittee.
- No horse under 3 years of age may be exhibited under saddle.
- All riders 18 years of age and under must wear a safety helmet with the chin strap always fastened whilst seated on a horse on the Club grounds whether competing or not.
- **Stallions:** In accordance with the ATHRA Code of Conduct, a stallion shall be clearly identified with a blue ribbon on his head gear and his tail, so it is clearly recognized as a stallion front and rear. Youth are not allowed to ride or handle stallions. If you intend to bring a stallion to a Points Day and require a yard, please contact the Ranch committee at boondarnparkranch@gmail.com before completing your entry on Nominate
- No hoof polish/black
- No braided or banded manes/tails or tail extensions.
- Trimming inside ears discouraged. Trimming bridle path is allowed, also trimming of fetlocks or excessive (long) facial hair.
- Equipment with silver should not count over a good working outfit. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged.

- Exhibitors can change from 2 handed to 1 handed to hold the saddle horn and holding the saddle horn with either hand will not be penalized in any class.
- Posting or standing in stirrups at extended trot is acceptable.

Attire

Mandatory

- Long sleeve collared shirt (half or full button or zipper)
- Western hat or ASS approved safety helmet
- Western pants/jeans
- Western boots

Optional

- Spurs, chinks and chaps in ridden classes.

Prohibited Equipment

- Martingales
- Draw reins
- Nosebands and tie-downs
- Chain, wire or metal tie-down or bonnets are prohibited, regardless of how padded or wrapped
- Training tack collars
- Jerk lines for roping
- English spurs
- Twisted mouthpieces
- Whips
- Covers on saddles
- Any curb strap narrower than 12.5mm
- Braided rawhide balls across the horse's nose are not permissible
- Choke ropes, tie-downs, wire around the horse's neck, nose or browband, tight nose band, quirt, bat or mechanical device giving the rider undue control over a horse will not be permitted in the arena.
- Bitless bridles
- Wire of any kind and on any part of the curb device is not permissible
- Absolutely no rigid material will be permitted under the jaws, regardless of how padded or covered.

Division Eligibility

A Professional Rider has, in the previous three years from the date of competing, received remuneration or compensation for showing or training any horse, or instructing any other person in riding or exhibiting.

Lead Line

- This division is for riders from 2 to 12 years of age who are not confident to ride unassisted.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk and trot only
- Horses must be led by a competent person over 16 years of age.
- No rider entering this division can enter any other Division.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Green Youth

- This division is for beginner riders between 7 and 18 years of age.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk and trot only and not required to lope.
- Green youth are not eligible to compete in any other division
- Green youth are not eligible to compete in Ranch Reining
- Any age horse can be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit or bosal. Curb bits are not permitted.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Intermediate Youth

- This division is for riders with a moderate level of riding ability between 7 and 18 years of age.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk, trot and lope.
- Any age horse can be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit or bosal. Curb bits are not permitted
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Open Youth

- This division is for experienced riders between 7 and 18 years of age.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the work, trot and lope.
- Any age horse can be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit or bosal. Curb bits are not permitted.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Green Rider

- This division is for beginner riders over 18 years of age.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk and trot only and not required to lope.
- Green riders are ineligible to compete in any other division.
- Green riders are not eligible to compete in Ranch Reining.
- Any age horse can be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit or bosal. Curb bits are not permitted.

- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, stock, or fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Intermediate Rider

- This division is for non-professional riders with a moderate level of riding ability. Professional riders are **not** eligible for this Division.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk, trot, and lope.
- Any age horse may be ridden one or two handed in any legal headgear.
- Riders must not swap from one to two hands or vice versa during a class if riding in a curb bit.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock, or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Green Horse

- This division is for horses of all ages with a basic level of education.
- Both professional and non-professional riders are eligible to ride in this division.
- Horses will be required to show at the walk, trot and lope.
- Any age horse may be ridden one or two handed in any legal headgear.
- Riders must not swap from one to two hands or vice versa during a class if riding in a curb bit.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Intermediate Horse

- This division is for horses with moderate level of education.
- Both professional and non-professional riders are eligible to ride in this division.
- Riders will be required to show their horses at the walk, trot and lope.
- Any age horse may be ridden one or two handed in any legal headgear.
- Riders must not swap from one to two hands or vice versa during a class if riding in a curb bit.
- Any safe saddle can be used including English, Western, Stock or Fender. Bareback pads are not permitted.

Australian Heritage Snaffle Bit (AHSB)

- This division is for experienced riders and horses.
- Both professional and non-professional riders are eligible to ride in this division.
- Horses must be ridden two handed in a snaffle bit only regardless of horse's age.
- Fender or stock saddle only

Open

- This division is for experienced riders and horses.
- Both professional and non-professional riders are eligible to ride in this division
- Western saddles compulsory
- Horses 3 to 5 years may be shown in a Snaffle bit, Hackamore, curb bit, half-breed or spade bit.
- Horses 6 years and over can only be shown in a curb-bit, half-breed, romal, spade bit or two rein.

- To be eligible for End of Year High Point Awards, a horse and rider combination must compete at a minimum of two Points Days per calendar year and compete in the Ranch Conformation class for their Division.
- In the event of a tie for a High Point Award, the tie will be broken by a count back of the greatest number of first place ribbons, then the greatest number of second place ribbons etc.

SCORING

- Except for the Conformation class, each exhibitor is scored between 0-100 points and automatically begins a run with a score of 70 points.
- The exhibitor is scored on the quality of each manoeuvre with -1 ½ Extremely Poor, -1 Very Poor, - ½ Poor, 0 Correct, + ½ Good, +1 Very Good, +1 ½ Excellent
- Pluses and Minuses reflect the smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness, and authority of the exhibitor when performing the various manoeuvres.
- Penalties may be accrued for incorrect manoeuvre execution.

USE OF GROUNDS

- The Club Grounds can be accessed by current Platinum and Gold financial members with personal EA recreational rider membership or above. Members with access to the grounds outside of an organised event must adhere to the rules outlined below.
- Wet weather – please be considerate when using grounds/arenas after rain. Please refer to the club's Facebook page as to the use of the grounds and arenas following wet weather
- There are two and a half days a year (Good Friday, Christmas Day and prior to 1.30 p.m. on Anzac Day) where the council have stipulated there is to be no use of the club grounds. Please be aware that your membership will be revoked should you ignore the direction of Logan City Council

The club takes seriously its responsibility for safety and risk management however the individual is equally responsible for safety of riders and horses and security of the grounds. All riders must be aware that horses are unpredictable and horse riding is deemed a dangerous sport. The onus is on all riders to be aware of your own safety regarding you, your horse and others at any time you are on the grounds.

ANY PERSON FOUND DAMAGING OR DESTROYING CLUB PROPERTY OR FACILITIES WILL HAVE TO SHOW CAUSE AS TO WHY THEY SHOULD RETAIN MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS

Rules for the use of the Grounds outside organised Events or Clinics

1. Platinum and Gold members using the grounds **must be financial Club members** and **hold an EA recreational riding membership**
2. Gates must be locked when leaving the club grounds. If you find the gate unlocked, please lock it. Members that need access have the combination.
3. Only allow access to riders who are LEQHC members who hold EA recreational or above membership
4. Private lessons can only be held by a coach that holds a current insurance certificate of currency. This should be emailed to secretary@leqhc.org.au each year.
5. All members have equal rights to use the arenas. Lessons do not have priority unless at a club sanctioned event / clinic or booking.
6. Please observe the correct protocols eg. left shoulder to left shoulder, faster pace to the outside of the arena track. so that no horse or rider is put at risk.
7. No equipment or objects eg. chairs, milk crates or mounting blocks, jump stands etc. are to be taken on to any of the dressage arenas without approval from the Management Committee
8. **No lunging in any of the dressage arenas.** Separate areas are provided for lunging
9. No sliding stops or galloping in the undercover and dressage arena furthest from the roadside. The outdoor dressage arena closest to the roadside has been identified as the arena suitable for Ranch riding activities.
10. All manure must be removed from dressage arenas, wash bay & yards and placed in the allocated areas. Do not place around trees in the carpark area.

11. **Be conservative when using the water in the wash bay**
12. Anyone using jumping equipment left in grassed area must have an instructor or experienced adult supervising
13. Always adhering to the requirements specified in the club's Risk Management Policy and the current Member's Handbook while on the club grounds.

Hiring of grounds:

The grounds are available for hire to outside organisations that meet the criteria established by the committee especially regarding risk management/insurance. Any enquiries should be directed to the Secretary and a current Grounds Hire Form must be completed; this can be found on the Club's website. Members are asked not to use grounds when hired out, unless otherwise stated. Dates are always listed on club's Facebook page and website.

Dogs on grounds

DOGS ARE STRICTLY NOT PERMITTED ON EVENT DAYS

Anybody bringing a dog onto the grounds on an event day will be asked to remove the dog from the grounds. If you bring a dog onto the grounds at any other time, the dog MUST be on a leash and tied to your float/truck/car. Dogs are not permitted within the fenced area of the club house or in arenas. Please be aware of the biosecurity risk of bringing your dog to the grounds.

Camping

Camping is permitted with approval from council. The process for requesting to camp overnight on the club grounds may take up to 6 weeks. Your first point is to contact the management committee and submit a camping request form found on the club website. If the management team agree to the camping request, they will then submit a request to council for permission.

You will be notified prior to the date as to the outcome from council. Council approval forms must be kept at the club for the dates granted for presenting if requested. A Horse Health Declaration must be completed on the day of camping.

The only exception to this is at Club sanctioned events where camping is offered. In this case the Event organiser will submit the approval forms for camping at that event.

USE OF UNDERCOVER ARENA

The undercover Arena is available for use for members of the Club who have Platinum or Gold membership and have recreational rider EA minimum membership. On payment of this membership, the Management Committee will provide the grounds gate access code. Members with the access code have a responsibility to not share that code with any other person.

Indoor light hire is \$3 per half hour.

Please note that there are security surveillance cameras in operation.

Rules for the use of the Undercover Arena

1. There is a maximum of 4 riders permitted in any arenas at any one time unless it's a club organised event
2. Only allow access to riders who are LRRHTRC members that have Platinum or Gold membership. If you are found to knowingly allow access to anyone that isn't authorised to use the arena this will result in having your membership revoked
3. During busy periods and there is a queue for use of the Arena, riders will be capped to minute periods
4. The undercover arena gate is to remain closed unless horses are entering or exiting
5. Please observe the correct protocols eg. left shoulder to left shoulder, faster pace to the outside arena track etc. so that no horse or rider is put at risk.
6. No lunging. Separate areas are provided for lunging
7. No sliding stops or galloping in the undercover arena
8. No equipment or objects eg. chairs, milk crates or mounting blocks, jump stands etc. are to be taken on to any of the dressage arenas without approval from the Management Committee
9. All manure must be removed from the undercover arena
10. Horses are not to be left unattended, loose tied or hard tied up in the undercover arena.
11. No one is to sit on the undercover arena fence.
12. There is a 10-metre exclusion zone around all arenas during a competition
13. The Management Committee can revise the rules when they see fit at anytime

VOLUNTEERS AND HELPERS

Volunteers

Without Volunteers we cannot run events and any help is greatly appreciated.

All volunteers MUST sign in and out of the volunteer sign on book. It is a volunteer's responsibility to ensure they complete this task. The volunteer sign on book will be at the gear steward tent, canteen or with the club committee member responsible for overseeing the event volunteers for that day.

Club Competitor Helper Requirements

Competitors are expected to help out for an hour each day at each event they compete in.

Members entering events are to be allocated a job to assist with the smooth running of the event. Please be considerate to event organisers and your fellow club members and be on time and do the job you are assigned. If you are unable to do your job, it is your responsibility to find someone to take your place. Failure to do your job or find a replacement will result in your future nominations being considered for rejection.

Members riding in the event are expected to help as part of your club membership. Entry fees for members are at discounted rates. All volunteers must sign the sign on book.

Finishing Your Event

At the completion of your test or jumping round, leave the arena/ring as promptly as possible to make way for the next rider and help the day run smoothly. Once you have finished for the day and tended to your horse's needs, please return to the clubhouse and offer to help in the running of the day.

Yards are available free of charge, so you can leave your horse in a safe environment. The event organizers are likely to be riding and will need your assistance to allow them to prepare their horse for the day. Please remove any manure from the yards.

The club encourages members to help and support one another, this may include holding horses, helping with forms, or covering someone else's job. Please be an active member for everyone's fun, safety and enjoyment of the day. Please also feel free to arrive early to the event/clinic to help before you ride. This is another great way to show your support to fellow riders and members. The club cannot run successfully without member involvement.

CLUB BY LAWS RELATED TO COMPETITION

1. All riders must wear a current and approved helmet as per Equestrian Australia regulations and appropriate footwear.
2. All riders must be financial to participate in club activities and to ride at the club grounds.
3. Members under eighteen (18) years are not eligible to vote.
4. Alcohol is not permitted at club events which are attended by members with their horses. Alcohol may be available at social functions provided the members who attend such functions do not bring their horses.
5. Children (under 18) must always have a supervising parent and/or guardian on the grounds.
6. It is preferable that no dog be brought on club grounds. If a dog is taken onto the grounds it must be kept away from riding areas and club house fenced area. It must always be kept under control on a leash. No dogs permitted on trail rides. Absolutely **NO DOGS** on competition or training days.
7. Stallions are allowed on the grounds and at club events unless specifically stated otherwise in the event program. Stallions **MUST** always be handled by a rider 18 years or older and under control. Handlers are asked to manage their stallion according to Equestrian Australia stallion handling guidelines (see EA web site for guidelines). Stallions must be stabled separately or tied to a truck/float and must always be supervised while tied up. They cannot be yarded in the general yards among other horses. If stallions become out of control or a threat to any other horse or person, the handler will be asked to remove them from the grounds.
8. Horses cannot be exchanged between members in any dressage competition where the one horse/one rider rule (EA) applies.
9. Members will have discounted nominations to compete at participation or competitive or open competitions (participation dressage or participation show jumping events) and clinics.
10. All entry gates **MUST** be closed while horses are on the grounds.
11. All members are encouraged to abide by the country code:
 - (a) enjoy the countryside and respect its life and work
 - (b) guard against the risk of fire
 - (c) fasten all gates
 - (d) keep to defined paths across farmland
 - (e) leave livestock, crops and machinery alone
 - (f) take your litter home or use bins provided. DO NOT drop rubbish on the ground
 - (g) help to keep all water clean
 - (h) protect wildlife, plants and trees

CONCLUSION

The Handbook has been developed to assist members in gaining the greatest benefit from their membership and to be a good club member. Your input is welcome as the handbook will be updated periodically throughout the year as required. Please take your feedback or suggestions to the committee either at an Annual General Meeting, an Open general meeting or to a committee member by email.

APPENDIX A

General Code of Conduct

Members or persons are required to comply with the Logan Equestrian and Quarter Horse Club General Code of Conduct. LEQHC members must meet the following requirements in regard to their conduct and behaviour during an activity held or sanctioned by LEQHC and in any role held within LEQHC:

- Adhere to the requirements contained in the Members Handbook.
- Members riding at an event are expected to help out as a part of your club membership.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealing with others.
- Be professional in, and accept responsibility for your actions.
- Make a commitment to providing quality service.
- As an affiliated club, be aware of, and maintain an uncompromising adherence to Equestrian Australia standards, rules, regulations and policies that cover the equestrian disciplines the club offers to our members.
- Scrupulously avoid any conducting privileged information to gain a personal or commercial advantage.
- Operate within the rules of the sport including national and international guidelines which govern Equestrian Sport, the member associations and the affiliated clubs.
- Do not use your involvement with LEQHC to promote your own beliefs, behaviours or practices where these are inconsistent with those of Equestrian Australia.
- Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with persons under the age of 18 years, as your words and actions are an example.
- Avoid unaccompanied and unobserved activities with persons under the age of 18 years, wherever possible.
- Refrain from any form of harassment of others.
- Refrain from any behaviour that may bring LRRHTRC into disrepute.
- Provide a safe environment for the conduct of the activity.
- Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- Be a positive role model.
- Social media must be used to promote and benefit the club to the equestrian world and the general public.
