## GET STARTED IN CANNABIS PROFESSION

(KNOW THE INDUSTRY AND UNDERSTAND CONSUMER INSIGHTS)

It's everywhere these days — in your favorite gummies, craft cocktails, and even fast-food hamburgers. Across the United States, the cannabis industry is booming. And if you've ever been curious about what it's like to work in this field — or wondered how you can leverage your existing professional knowledge into a cannabis-related career — then look no further.

According to Hannah Rimm from refinery29.com - Working in cannabis is lucrative, especially given how many people in this country <u>use marijuana recreationally.</u> Today, there are <u>55 million recreational marijuana users</u> in the U.S. — and most of them are millennials. Considering stigma is decreasing and appreciation is growing for the plant's diverse uses, it's a great time to get involved.

Even though it's new, the cannabis industry is already heavily male-dominated. According to <u>data from Vangst</u>, just 38.5% of the total surveyed employees identify as women. Even more worrisome: 74% of the companies surveyed had ten or fewer female-identifying employees, and 12.6% of companies had zero women in a director or executive-level position. Because the market will only continue to expand (it's expected to be <u>worth \$146.4 billion by the end of 2025</u>), it's important to make <u>racial and gender diversity</u> a priority now.—

Recent report from Vangst sees that Cannabis Job Creation will increasing in the coming 4 years (2025) within company bases on the five newly legalized states: **Arizona, New Jersey, Mississippi, Montana, and South Dakota.** 

#### 10 In-Demand Cannabis Careers: Work in Cannabis

- ✓ **Director of Extraction** A director of extraction is in charge of processing and refining active components like THC and CBD. These active components are then used to make oils, concentrates, and various forms of edibles.
- ✓ **Director of Cultivation** Directors of cultivation should have mastery in skills like planting, cloning, crop nutrition, and pest management, as well as oversee staffing.
- ✓ Cannabis Compliance Manager A cannabis compliance manager ensures that cannabis products comply with state laws and regulations, as well as health and safety standards.
- ✓ **Edibles Chef** Edible chefs will develop unique recipes and oversee the production of edibles. Due to the potent nature of edibles, chefs must be able to create goods with precise doses of THC and CBD.
- ✓ **Dispensary Store Manager** A dispensary store manager is in charge of all retail operations for cannabis companies. They typically oversee all daily operations of a dispensary and its inventory.
- ✓ **Budtender** A budtender's responsibility is to recommend the best strains based on preference or medical necessities. Budtenders typically need to be familiar with point-of-sale systems to ensure all sales are properly tracked.

- ✓ **Trimmer** One of the most common entry-level opportunities, a trimmer carefully prepares all harvested products. Trimmers cut and remove the flowers from the marijuana plant, then further manicure each bud
- ✓ **Cultivation Technicians** Responsible for assisting with all aspects of the company's cultivation operation from seedling to harvest.
- ✓ **Sales reps** must have strong customer service experience and be able to build and seek new relations with upcoming companies and people. One of the most important duties of a product sales rep is to create and maintain strong relationships with multiple cannabis dispensaries and distributors
- ✓ **Packagers** Involves to meet daily productivity, quality, and compliance requirements. The Packager is expected to hand trim plants, correctly package product, and perform a variety of other duties in cure and farming as assigned.


