Hello,

I have reviewed the consultant jurisdictional determination submission for the 2000 Corporate Drive Redevelopment Project in the Town of Orangetown, Rockland County, NY. Wetlands 1 and 2 from the wetland delineation report prepared by Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. are regulated by NYS DEC pursuant to Article 24 of the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL). Basins 1 and 2 are *not* regulated by NYS DEC pursuant to Article 24 of the ECL.

The classification of Wetland 1 as Class 1 is accurate as it is contiguous to fresh surface waters having a classification of A. The classification of Wetland 2 as Class 2 is accurate as it meets the criteria of being within an urban area defined by the United States Census Bureau. I have summarized my findings in the table below:

Hi Paige,

Please see attached exhibit showing the proposed infiltration testing on the Databank Orangeburg site. The testing will involve the creation of a temporary access path (hatched on the attached plan) using wood chips that passes through the adjacent

area of Wetland 2. The access path as shown will not require any tree cutting; if the path were to be moved outside of the adjacent area, some trees would have to be cut. For the actual infiltration testing itself, some trees will have to be removed in the area of the proposed basin (shown in orange on the second sheet of the PDF). These trees will be cut by hand. The testing will consist of test pits (approximately 2' x 4') and boring holes, all of which will be restored to pre-existing conditions once testing is complete. The equipment used will be limited to a skid-steer and/or a mini excavator. Based on the minimal tree cutting, the natural material used for the access path, and the small machinery used for testing, this will not impact the function of the wetland or the adjacent area. Can you confirm that both the selective tree cutting and the infiltration testing are exempt activities under the NYSDEC Freshwater Wetland Regulations? As previously mentioned, this work needs to occur during a specific window in the spring to accurately characterize groundwater levels and infiltration capacity of this area. If you have further questions, please let me know and I will respond as soon as possible to keep this moving forward.

We've also collected some additional information on Basin 2. It was installed by the previous property owner, Verizon, and was utilized for stormwater runoff reduction and water quality treatment. The property was vacant for several years, during which time the basin became overgrown. Under the Phase 1 proposed work, it will not be used for stormwater runoff water quality treatment as the new site design directs all impervious stormwater runoff to newly installed stormwater infrastructure. It does still function for stormwater runoff reduction as it collects nearby pervious runoff via sheet flow and controls the rate of release. During the final stage of Phase I construction (currently in progress), the contractor will perform maintenance and clear the overgrown portions to ensure it is functioning as designed. Based on this information, are you able to confirm that this basin would not be considered a regulated wetland? Once we have clarity here, we can finalize the boundary validation plan and our revised permit application.

Hi Paige,

Thanks for your time on site today. To summarize:

- NYSDEC is in agreement with the delineated resource boundaries.
- KH will revise and resubmit the wetland delineation report to include classification of wetlands based on Jan 15, 2025 NYSDEC SOP.
- KH will prepare a wetland boundary validation plan including NYSDEC title block for signature. To be provided via email for preliminary review and hard copy once final.

A few items we discussed on site that we'd like to circle back to:

- Is anything needed beyond the above items for the application to be deemed complete?
 - Is there a standard timeframe for application review once deemed complete? If not, do you have a ballpark for when we might receive our first round of technical comments?
- Assuming the project is not able to further avoid and minimize impacts to the wetlands on site, what type and ratio of mitigation would be required, if any?
 - Are mitigation bank credits an option and do you know if there is a bank that services this area?
 - When is the applicant required to detail proposed mitigation strategy and execute purchase agreements if credits are the chosen option... as part of the permit application, after the permit is reviewed, or after it is fully issued?
- As I mentioned, there is infiltration testing that needs to occur between mid-March and mid-May within the 100' adjacent area. Based on our conversation and a review of the NYSDEC website, selective tree cutting (necessary for drill rig access) would be exempt. But it seems the actual sampling would be a minor activity, requiring a permit.
 - What is the best way to obtain approval for this activity given the time sensitive nature of it? Should it be added to our current application (which is a major project) or submitted as a separate minor application? It is noted that the applicant for this may be different than the applicant for the larger site development.

I will schedule a follow up call for early next week to discuss these items. Please let me know if any of the following times work for you and your supervisor:

- Monday 11-12 (and most of us earlier in the morning too)
- Tuesday 10-11:30, 3 and 4 (not 3:30)

We appreciate your attention to this project and helping us get the necessary clarifications to move this application forward as expeditiously as possible.

I am not saying we are at square one – I wanted to ensure the parcel determination portion of the application was started as this can take up to 90 days if submitted through the jurisdictional determination form on the DEC website. The consultant option for JD guidelines were finalized and posted to our website this week – I was unable to propose this option until those guidelines were made available. Also, if a JD request was submitted through the website and you are opting for the consultant route, I can let the team handling those requests know that regional staff are taking over the determination for this particular property.

Please note the following bullet from the Consultant Option:

- Proposed classification of each Article 24 regulated wetland(s) located on the parcel(s) **based on the most recent version of DEC's "Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for Remote Jurisdictional Determinations and Classification of Freshwater Wetlands Pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 664, Freshwater Wetlands Jurisdiction and Classification."** Off-site wetlands, where appropriate, must be considered when proposing classifications.

The SOP was not posted on our website until after January 1st, therefore the classifications for wetlands in the report from December 2024 were not determined using the SOP (linked here: [Freshwater Wetland Jurisdictional Determination](#), under "Types of Jurisdiction Determinations"). Additionally, the report notes one of the wetlands as "Class 2 or 3." Classification must be specific, and the criteria used to make the determination shall be noted in the report.

I am working to provide technical comments as soon as possible, I do not have an estimated timeline. A site visit to validate wetland boundaries should also be set up. My next availability is 2/24 or 2/27. Please note validations cannot be completed if there is substantial snow cover. I have the first two weeks of March open as well. A shapefile can be sent once the wetland boundary is validated.
