



Pizza Slice Book Report

Dear Parents/Guardians,

For the second book that is a chapter book of your child's choosing, (however please have them not select *Captain Underpants* or books similar to that) your child will create a pizza as a way to share and present to the class his/her book.

The front of the slices of pieces will be made to look like actual slices of pizza. Your child will choose what toppings he or she would like to create to put on top of the pizza slices. On the back of each slice will be the book report labels: (Slice 1) **Characters**, (Slice 2) **Setting**, (Slice 3) **Problem**, (Slice 4) **Solution**, (Slice 5) **Summary**, (Slice 6) **Title and Author**. This can all be handwritten or typed. Slices 2, 3, and 4 are all 1 to 2 sentences in length. Slice 5 should be 4 to 6 sentences in length. Following this letter is the criteria for creating this book report as well as the rubric and an example of a pizza slice to use as a guideline. Below is an image of a student model. I hope you have a wonderful summer and enjoy eating pizza and reading!

Make a Pizza Slice Book Report



Materials:

- Large paper or cardboard circle (No smaller than 8 inch) cut into 6 equal slices.
- Pencil
- Chapter Book

Slice 1 – Characters

- Make a list of ALL the character in the book. Describe the main character.

Slice 2 – Setting

- Describe in detail one of the settings where the story takes place the most

Slice 3 – Problem

- Describe in detail one of the problems in the story. Use lots of detail.

Slice 4 – Solution

- Describe in detail how the problem was solved.

Slice 5 – Summary

- Describe in detail what the story was about. Make sure to include only important details.

Slice 6 – Title/Author

- Write the title and author of the story. Make sure to spell all the words correctly.

Overall:

- You have complete sentences.
- You have your neatest writing.
- Good presentation.
