- 1. Setting: *Describe the setting of your story. Does it take place in various settings? How is the setting similar or different to where you live?***
- 2. Do the characters seem real and believable? Can you relate to their predicaments? Why? Why not? Use text evidence to support your answer.**
- 3. Do the characters remind you of someone you know? How? If not, why not? Tell how they are different from people you know.**
- 4. What do you think happened to the main character 10-20 years later, after the story ended?**
- 5. Do you like the ending of this book? Why or why not? How would you have preferred the book end?**
- 6. Select your favorite passage or sentence. Write it down. Explain why it was your favorite. Did it have meaning to you?**
- 7. Do you think the title fits the book? Why or why not?**
- 8. Make either a text to self, text to text, or a text to world connection. (pick one)**
  - Text to self: explain how some aspect of the book connects to you and your life
  - Text to text: explain how the book reminds you of another book, movie, poem or song
  - Text to world: explain how the book reminds you of world events, past or present
- 9. How does this book relate to our Catholic faith? You may select a certain scene or event. Explain.**
- 10. Vocabulary. Write down 10 words that were new to you. Define them or explain them.**
