# TREATMENT SERVICE DESCRIPTIONS

## **ACUTE TREATMENT SERVICES (ATS)**

Detox programs provide 24-hour nursing care, under the consultation of a medical director, to monitor an individual's withdrawal from alcohol and other drugs and to alleviate symptoms. The typical length of stay is 3-5 days.

## **ADDICTION SEVERITY INDEX (ASI)**

An assessment tool used to assess an adult's condition in 7 key problem areas that are typically affected by substance abuse, including medical status, employment, and more. A testing administrator can perform the test in approximately 1 hour in a structured interview format. The ASI screening tool is helpful for practitioners in assessing clients so that they can determine the types of addiction treatments the client may need and make a plan for moving forward.

## **CLINICAL STABILIZATION SERVICES (CSS)**

Provides clinical stabilization services for clients leaving detox and provides stabilization services for clients needing acute treatment but not meeting criteria for medically-necessary detox services. The typical length of stay is 2-3 weeks.

## **COGNITIVE BEHAVIORAL THERAPY (CBT)**

Cognitive behavior therapy (CBT) is a type of psychotherapy. It may help you to change unhelpful or unhealthy ways of thinking, feeling and behaving. CBT uses practical self-help strategies. These are designed to immediately improve your quality of life.

## **DIALECTICAL BEHAVIORAL THERAPY SKILLS (DBT)**

Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) is a structured therapy that focuses on teaching four core skills (mindfulness, acceptance & distress tolerance, emotional regulation, and interpersonal effectiveness).

## **DUAL DIAGNOSIS SERVICES (DDS)**

Dual Diagnosis services provide a comprehensive system of treatment and recovery from co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders.

## **EXPERIENTIAL THERAPY**

Experiential therapy is distinguished by its emphasis on action. Action is important because when a person is bodily engaged, they have access to psychological elements they wouldn't have access to otherwise.

---

## **EYE MOVEMENT DESENSITIZATION AND REPROCESSING (EMDR) THERAPY**

A structured therapy that encourages the patient to briefly focus on the trauma memory while simultaneously experiencing bilateral stimulation (typically eye movements), which is associated with a reduction in the vividness and emotion associated with the trauma memories.

## **INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS (IOP)**

A less-intensive program than a PHP. This outpatient program remains part of the continuum of care for an individual with a substance use disorder, providing structure and support for the individual as they transition back into the community.

## **LONG TERM RESIDENTIAL**

A structured alcohol and drug free environment. Programs often last longer than 30 days.

## **MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT (MAT)**

MAT can be used for opioid detoxification, but is more commonly used to provide ongoing support to individuals in recovery. While MAT is available for treatment of alcoholism, it has been used primarily in the treatment of opioid use disorder. There are three FDA approved medications for the treatment of opioid dependence - methadone, buprenorphine and naltrexone (brand names Revia and Vivitrol). Suboxone, which is a combination of buprenorphine and naloxone, is also used to treat opioid use disorder. Each may be used for long term maintenance therapy. The type of medication used will vary based on individual circumstances.

## **NALOXONE (NARCAN)**

Naloxone (Narcan®) is a safe medication that can save someone's life by reversing the effects of an opioid overdose. It only works on opioids, such as heroin, prescription painkillers and fentanyl, but it is safe to use even if opioids are not present. If you are worried you or someone you know may be at risk of an opioid overdose, naloxone is available at any pharmacy without prescription.

## OUTPATIENT SERVICES

## **PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAMS (PHP)**

Part of the continuum of care, PHP's offer a transition from inpatient treatment, to a highly structured outpatient treatment.

## **SOBER HOME**

Places for individuals to live in a substance free environment after residential substance use treatment. Not all sober homes are regulated or monitored, they are often privately run. For the directory of the

## **STRUCTURED OUTPATIENT ADDICTIONS PROGRAMS (SOAP)**

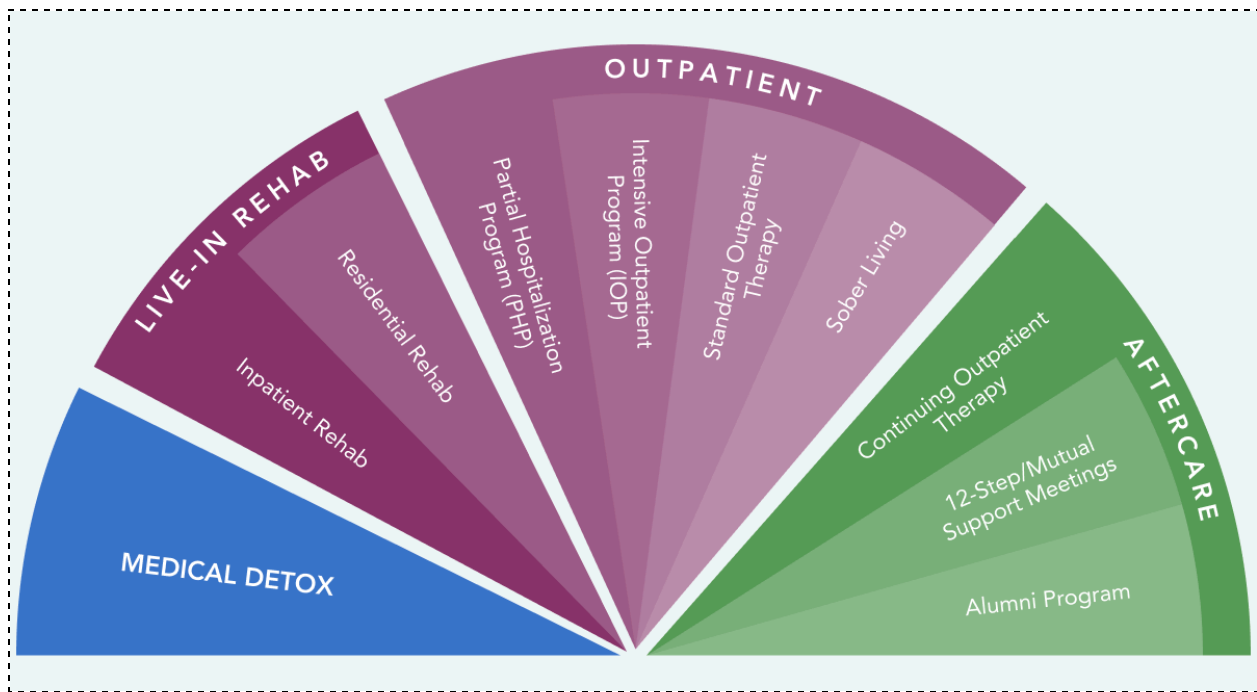
This outpatient program consists of short-term, structured, substance use disorder services used to assist individuals being discharged from Acute Treatment Services (ATS).

## **TRANSITIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES (TSS)**

Short-term residential program for individuals who need further stabilization after detoxification. Admission is limited to clients discharged from detox or who are currently homeless. The typical length of stay is 3-4 weeks.

## CONTINUUM OF CARE



**“Continuum of Care” refers to a treatment system in which clients enter treatment at a level appropriate to their needs and then step up to more intense treatment or down to less intense treatment as needed. As outlined by Mee-Lee and Shulman (2003), an effective continuum of care features successful transfer of the client between levels of care, similar treatment philosophy across levels of care, and efficient transfer of client records. The American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) has established five main levels in a continuum of care for substance abuse treatment:**

- ❖ Level 0.5: Early intervention services
- ❖ Level I: Outpatient services
- ❖ Level II: Intensive outpatient/Partial hospitalization services (Level II is subdivided into levels II.1 and II.5)
- ❖ Level III: Residential/Inpatient services (Level III is subdivided into levels III.1, III.3, III.5, and III.7)
- ❖ Level IV: Medically managed intensive inpatient services

**These levels should be thought of not as discrete levels of care but rather as points in a continuum of treatment services**
