American Rimfire Association (ARA)

ARA Matches for 2025 will be held at NHRC on the second Saturday of the month at 8 AM from **April 12th** through November 11th. The public is invited to participate in the ARA matches. Participation in the ARA does not require you to attend all the matches – you can shoot when your schedule allows.

Blue Rock/ Trap Shoots

Outdoor and DPR Hours

Mon.-Sat. 8 AM to sundown

Sunday 1 PM to sundown

Membership Cards. All members are required to display their membership card and scan in while using the range facilities.

Non-members. Non-members may only use the club facilities under the following conditions:

- 1) they are with a current NHRC club member and
- 2) they have completed a Liability form. Liability forms are located in the club house and on the outdoor range. Place completed (signed and dated) forms back in the bin. A form must be completed yearly.

Targets. Only paper targets and various steel targets provided by NHRC are approved for use. All other non-approved targets are not permitted and in violation of club rules.

CLUB EVENTS

Trap Shoots. Trap shoots are held on Tuesday evenings starting at 5:00 PM from April to October. Trap shoots are open to the public.

American Rimfire Association (ARA). ARA shoots run the 2nd Saturday from April through November at NHRC. ARA Tournaments are held on Saturdays throughout the season. Please see the NHRC website for dates and further details. ARA is open to the public.

RANGE SAFETY AND FIRST AID

Although the use of the range is at our own risk, the club has provided a new device for sudden cardiac arrest. The club has an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) onsite. An AED is a portable device that automatically diagnoses life threatening heart arrhythmias and delivers an electrical shock if needed. Once connected to the machine, the AED will tell the user what to do. Signs of sudden cardiac arrest are suddenly becoming unconscious, not breathing normally or gasping and no pulse. If a person is conscious, breathing, or has a pulse an AED should not be used.

There is a small cupboard mounted on the wall right inside the entrance to the range building restrooms. The white box contains the AED/defibrillator and a Stop the Bleed kit. The club will be securing a small first aid kit that will be available for small cuts. ***If there is an emergency on the range, please call 911 for medic and/or ambulance services.***

BERWICK RIFLE TEAM



The Berwick high school rifle team concluded its regular season with a record of 6 and 4 and qualified for the league playoffs. Highlights of the season were seniors Wyatt Readler and Molly Conrad each reaching the 5000-point milestone. Molly won a 3rd place medal at the all-star tournament. Molly and Luke Sult qualified for the state individual tournament. A 99 average is required to participate.

The team was happy to have 3 freshmen compete in enough varsity matches to earn a varsity letter. They were Brennan Spade, Parker Anawalt and Dominick Torsella. The team continues off season

practices on Mondays and hopes to improve their record in the 2025 -2026 season.

The indoor and outdoor ranges have experienced some damage from shooting. Rich Yoder has done some maintenance to several of the outdoor targets and in the DPR. Further repairs are ongoing as we try to keep up with the increased use of targets within the DPR. Please be mindful of your target and the background – especially in the DPR.

When on the outdoor range, *do not shoot at or towards the ground; Targets must be placed 36+ inches above ground level. Do not shoot at the ARA target holders!*


