#### THE COLOR PURPLE?

It's official - the 2021-2022 hunting season has begun in Pennsylvania! While you are out in the woods looking for a perfect hunting spot, be mindful of those purple painted trees and fences. The purple paint is the new 'no trespassing' sign. To hunters, those purple markings also mean no hunting is allowed on the property. More landowners are opting to use purple paint to mark their property rather than posting no trespassing signs. Painting trees and fence posts cuts down on property maintenance for landowners. The paint lasts longer than posted signs which can be stolen, become worn out or fall. Why purple? Well purple shows up well in the outdoors and can be 'seen' by individuals with colorblindness. As you hit the outdoors this fall, look for the new posted 'paint' / no trespassing signs. For more information on this follow the link to Purple Paint Law.

Outdoor and DPR Hours

Mon.-Sat. 8 AM to sundown Sunday 1 PM to sundown

**Membership Cards**. All members are <u>required</u> to display their membership card and sign in while using the range facilities.

**Non-members**. Non-members may only use the club facilities under the following conditions:

- 1) they are with a current NHRC club member and
- 2) they have completed a Liability form. Liability forms are located in the club house and on the outdoor range. Place completed (signed and dated) forms back in the bin. A form must be completed yearly.

**Targets.** Only paper targets and various steel targets provided by NHRC are approved for use. All other non-approved targets are not permitted and in violation of club rules.

#### **CLUB EVENTS**

**Trap Shoots.** Trap shoots are held on Tuesday evenings starting at 5:00 PM from April to October. The shoots are open to the public.

**NHRC Gun Show.** NHRC hosts an annual Firearms and Outdoor Sports Show every January. The 2022 Gun Show will be held on January 8 and 9 at the Nescopeck Township Volunteer Fire Company off Route 93. Show hours are Saturday from 9-4 PM and Sunday from 9-3 PM.




all participants had a lunch and awards ceremony.
