Town Council Regular Meeting**



Present: Mayor Shannon Stinchcomb, Council Members Frank Cheely, Rebecca Knight, and James Shedd, Town Attorneys Ted Baggett and Frank, & Town Manager, Christy Singley

Mayor Stinchcomb called the meeting to order at 6:10 PM

Mayor Stinchcomb gave the Invocation.

Mayor Stinchcomb led the pledge.

Mayor Stinchcomb welcomed guests and opened the meeting to public comment. Ronald Rogel addressed the council about his business.

Council Member Cheely made a motion to approve the June minutes and Financial Reports. Council Member Shedd seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Council Member Shedd gave the report for the Historical Society Committee stating the July 3rd event at Jug Tavern Park was a great success and very well attended. He informed the council that they were now planning for the next event which will take place in Fort Yargo.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Camera Maintenance contract with Alloy Networks

Town Manager Singley presented the contract that was provided by Alloy Networks to provide maintenance services on the new camera system. The proposal is for 2 visits per year at \$495 per visit. Council Member Cheely made a motion to approve the maintenance contract with Alloy Networks. Council Member Knight seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

2. Municode

Town Manager Singley presented the proposal from Civic Plus to do a full codification of the The Code of the Town of Carl, and code hosting through Municode. The full proposal, explaining the optional services and tools were explained. Council Member Knight made a motion to do a full codification, and to accept the proposal from Civic Plus with the addition of MuniDocs. Council Member Shedd seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

3. New Outdoor Bathroom Doors and Timed Locks

Town Manager Singley presented the bids for new outdoor bathroom doors and timed locks. Council Member Knight made a motion to go with Top Notch Dock & Door for the doors and Alloy Networks for the locks. Council Member Cheely seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Public Comment Policy for Town Council Meetings

Town Manager Singley presented the policy comment policy, which was created from a survey done by all council members. Mayor Stinchcomb asked if anyone had any changes they would like made. Council Member Knight requested that the wording “for 24 hours prior to the meeting” be removed. Council Member Knight made a motion to adopt the public comment policy for Town Council meetings. Council Member Shedd seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

2. Appointment of Prosecutor and Probation Service.

Town Manager Singley informed the council that the City of Auburn has changed prosecutors since we appointed the prosecutor at the last meeting, and that we needed to appoint their Probation Services as well. Council Member Knight made a motion to appoint the City of Auburn’s Prosecutor and Probation Service to serve the Town in those roles, per Section 3(e), Provision of Municipal Court Services, in the Intergovernmental Agreement for the City of Auburn to conduct Municipal court for the Town of Carl dated Nov. 16, 2023. Council Member Cheely seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.

3. Text amendments

Reading of Text Amendments to Appendix B, Chapter 89 of the Town of Carl Code, specifically Code Sections 89-9, 89-255, 89-1314, 89-1315, 89-1316, 89-1443, and 89-1444 by Town Manager Singley.

Mayor Stinchcomb opened the meeting to public comment. Sheyla Wright addressed the council about the possibility of purchasing an existing business in Carl.

Mayor Stinchcomb asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting and enter into Executive Session to confer with town attorneys. Council Member Knight made the motion. Council Member Cheely seconded the motion. Votes were taken with all members present voting yes.
