Pays the internet bill for one year at a United Way Agency.

Provides 4 diabetics with needed strips to test their blood sugar twice a day for a year.



Supplies needed technology and sensory supplies to children with Autism.



Pays the monthly utility bill for four families struggling to keep utilities turned on.



Provides house keeping for two and a half hours a week for a local disabled senior.
