COMMUNITY ISSUE

■ Substance Abuse

Substance Abuse has been identified as an issue in our area. Employers are unable to find individuals to fill workforce positions due to the inability to pass drug tests. The justice system is overwhelmed by drug related issues. The number of children in foster care has seen a dramatic increase.

■ Contributing Factors to Substance Abuse

- Genetic predisposition
- Certain brain characteristics that can make someone more vulnerable to addictive substances than the average person
- Psychological factors (e.g., stress, personality traits like high impulsivity or sensation seeking, depression, anxiety, eating disorders, personality and other psychiatric disorders)
- Environmental influences (e.g., exposure to physical, sexual, or emotional abuse or trauma, substance use or addiction in the family or among peers, access to an addictive substance; exposure to popular culture references that encourage substance use)
- Starting alcohol, nicotine or other drug use at an early age

Drug-defined offenses	Violations of laws prohibiting or regulating the possession, distribution, or manufacture of illegal drugs.	Drug possession or use. Marijuana cultivation. Methamphetamine production. Cocaine, heroin, or marijuana sales.
Drug-related	Offenses in which drug's pharmacologic effects contribute; offenses are motivated by the user's need for money to support continued use; and offenses connected to drug distribution itself.	Violent behavior resulting from drug effects. Stealing to get money to buy drugs. Violence against rival drug dealers.

“In the previous 12 months, the Marion County Prosecuting Attorney’s Office filed 708 charges (not including traffic tickets or infractions). Of those, 395 (55.8%) of the charges filed were related to drug and alcohol crimes. Of the 395 cases, 93 (13% of the 708 caseload) were DWI.

These numbers don’t reflect what I consider “drug fueled” crimes (assault, robbery, stealing, property damage, burglary, etc.). Often times an addict will commit crimes to support their drug habits. I don’t have an accurate estimate of what percentage of the overall caseload would be considered “drug fueled” but I would guess it’s a pretty large percentage.”

PREVENTION INITIATIVE

■ JUSTIFICATION

In an effort to create a better community and more vibrant economy, the issue of substance abuse needs to be tackled head on.

■ YOUTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Continental Cement, Green America Recycling, and United Way have joined together to decrease the number of youth who eventually become individuals who abuse substances.

■ INITIATIVE GOAL

Decrease the number of local individuals who abuse substances by preventing youth from engaging in utilizing substances.



DETAILS OF INITIATIVE:

- Non-profit organizations are invited to apply for \$25,000 to fund a research based initiative to prevent area youth from utilizing substances.
- These dollars are to be used solely to **prevent** youth from utilizing substances (not any treatment).
- Organizations will submit an application outlining details of the prevention initiative which will be reviewed by committee members. Applications will be accepted July 1st through October 15th.
- The top submitted proposals will be announced in early November. Individuals submitting the top proposals will make a presentation to committee members. Members of the committee will ask questions and one organization will be awarded funding.
- Funding for this project is made possible because of Continental Cement and Green America Recycling.
