Jackson 3rd Graders



The 3rd graders from all four Jackson schools will be visiting JTHS in October. The Jackson School of the Arts puts on a living history school day for the students. Several years ago, Don and Nancy Montgomery presented to the trustees, a different way to deliver our program to these students with hands on experiences. Susie Gardner from the High School supports the program from her side. The program is financed through grants from the Jackson Schools Foundation and Jim Camp. Kim Demor has traveled to two of the schools and presented a "What to expect" program to the students. She talked about the 1860's desks, heating, plumbing, getting to school, and so

much more. She answered questions the students had and shared information on what they will do while at the schoolhouse. This is a great learning cooperation between the groups and students.

Building Update

*The addition to the building is about 25 years old and was in need of some care. Todd, and Randi Morris with help from some high school students, are almost finished siding the addition. Unfortunately, there was rotted wood found under the door and added time to the project in order to repair. Drainage and a small ramp will be added to the backdoor. The trim has been painted white to match the rest of the building, The bell tower is in the process of being painted as well.

- *We believe we found the cause of the dampness on the walls of the basement and are in the process of getting it corrected.
- *Damaged window panes were replaced.
- *The required yearly Backflow System was tested and everything was good .
- *Julian Strub, who is working on his Eagle Scout Award, has lead the team to re-waterproof the damp basement walls, added shelving and will be add-

ing a protective cover to parts of the basement ceiling.

*Items still on the Wishlist: parking lot, light for flagpole and sign, the wood floor of the schoolhouse, more painting.





Archival Update

Thanks to the Christmas in July fundraiser and the scanner fundraiser, we received enough money to purchase a Czur Book scanner, a digital microscope, and several archival boxes for the newspapers, some toys, some clothes, a family bible, and Constable papers. Thank you to all who thought these projects were important.

We have trained some volunteers to use the new scanner and they are moving through large documents, newspapers and other documents very quickly. The process is easy and anyone can help, you just place and click.

We have a new process for what we do with items that have been donated. We have received several large donations and are looking for helpers who would like to learn to catalog the items. If you are interested in learning please let us know.
