

CLEANING & MAINTENANCE

RETURN TO SERVICE:

Please allow 24 hours after completion before walking on your new floor.

Please allow 72 hours after completion before driving on your new floor or moving substantial or heavy items across the floor, unless otherwise specified.

Return to service will vary depending on the weather. Full chemical cure time is 7-10 days.

Your floor is designed to resist dirt, bacteria and mold. Keep it looking new with these simple care instructions.

RECOMMENDED CLEANING EQUIPMENT:

- ✓ 5 gallon bucket
- ✓ Soft bristle deck brush
- ✓ 18" 24" rubber squeegee

Cleaning Process

- 1. Wipe any spills off of the surface using a paper towel or terry cloth rag.
- 2. Sweep off any dirt or debris.
- 3. Mix 2 ounces Simple Green with 4 gallons of warm water in a clean 5 gallon bucket.
- 4. Pour some of the Simple Green mixture on to the surface. The floor may become slippery when wet, so use caution. Using a soft bristle deck brush, lightly scrub the Simple Green and water mix to thoroughly clean the floor.
- 5. Using a rubber squeegee, remove any of the standing water from the floor.
- 6. Empty and clean the 5 gallon pail and fill with clean warm water. Using a heavy-duty cotton mop, clean the floor with the clean water. You can also use a hose for this step, starting at the highest point and working your way toward the door. Squeegee off any standing water.



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DO'S

- ⇒ DO sweep your floor every month to reduce abrasives
- ⇒ DO clean salt and de-icer debris off your floor regularly
- ⇒ DO cover your infrared garage door sensors when using a hose in the garage
- ⇒ DO use rubbing alcohol for stubborn stains, but be sure to rinse the spot thoroughly to prevent discoloration

DON'T'S

- ⇒ DON'T use acidic cleaners on your floor, such as acid or vinegar, or citrus cleaners
- ⇒ DON'T use a pressure washer on your floor
- ⇒ DON'T use soapy cleaners on your floor, as they can leave a slippery film
- ⇒ DON'T allow corrosives to harm your floor, such as rust or battery acid

GOT SPILLS?

Harsh chemical spills like gasoline or other car fluids should be wiped up immediately. Clean the area with a mild degreaser, such as Simple Green.

GOT TIRE MARKS?

Clean tire marks off your floor as soon as you see them, with a mild degreaser, such as Simple Green.



Keeping Your Floor Clean

For washing your floor, we recommend using water and Simple Green. It is a good all-purpose cleaner and degreaser.





If you have tire marks, we recommend a Libman floor scrub brush, which you can find at Home Depot.
