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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

COLUMBIA BASIN BARREL RACING CLUB

We, the undersigned persons, acting as the incorporators of a corporation under the provisions of the Washington Non-Profit Corporations Act (R.C.W. 24.03A), adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation (“Corporation”):

ARTICLE I

The name of the Corporation shall be:

COLUMBIA BASIN BARREL RACING CLUB

ARTICLE II:

This Corporation has perpetual existence.

ARTICLE III:

This Corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof, and the specific purposes for which it is formed is to organize a Barrel Racing Club, located in Grant County, Washington, and to sell memberships, and for this purpose to:

1. Fix, levy, collect and enforce payment by any lawful means, all charges, dues, or assessments pursuant to the terms of the membership subscription documents; to pay all office and other expenses incident to the conduct of the business of the Corporation, including all licenses, taxes, or governmental charges levied or imposed against the Corporation;
2. Acquire (by gift, purchase or otherwise), own, hold, improve, build upon, operate, maintain, convey, sell, lease, transfer, dedicate for public use or otherwise dispose of real or personal property in connection with the affairs of the Corporation;
3. Borrow money, and with the requisite assent of the members, mortgage, pledge, deed in trust, or hypothecate any or all of its real or personal property as security for money borrowed or debts incurred if allowed for by the terms of the membership subscription documents;
4. Have and to exercise any and all powers, rights and privileges which a corporation organized under the non-profit corporation laws of the State of Washington by law may now hereafter have or exercise, and as may be authorized by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV

The address of the registered office of the Corporation is TrunkenbolzRohr, PLLC, 4127 S Sullivan Rd, Spokane Valley, WA 99307.

The registered agent is Laurie Coombs, 11272 Bob White Dr NE, Moses Lake, WA 98837.

ARTICLE V

The number of directors of this organization shall be fixed in the manner specified by the By-Laws of the Corporation. The first directors of the Corporation are two (3) in number and their names are and addresses are:

The first directors shall serve until the first annual meeting of the members and until their successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VI

The Corporation may be dissolved pursuant to the provisions of the Washington Non-Profit Corporations Act. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, other than incident to a merger or consolidation, the net assets of the Corporation are to be distributed to another non-profit equine group prorata.

ARTICLE VII

Amendment of these Articles shall require the assent of the requisite number of votes as required by the Washington Non-Profit Corporations Act.

OBJECTIVES

1. Inexpensive races
2. Training ground for horses and riders
3. Provide camaraderie and competition
4. Promote barrel racing as a sport

FUNDAMENTAL BY LAWS OF THE C.B.B.R.C

1. To promote the sport of barrel racing and to establish a method of communication and a central address for the convenience of all members.
2. To establish and organize association sponsored barrel races throughout our area.
3. To make known to all members information concerning dates or barrel races, points, winners, and other particulars which members are interested in.
4. To establish a point system by which yearly placing members will be named and awarded year end awards.
5. To establish dues, this will be kept by the Secretary/Treasurer. The dues will be used for the associations necessary cost, postage and supplies. Should a sizeable amount accumulate in the treasury after all necessary expenses have been paid, it will be used toward awards throughout the season as well as operational costs for the C.B.B.R.C.
6. To establish C.B.B.R.C. rules, in the case of no rule, C.B.B.R.C. will follow the Barrel Racers National 4D (BRN4D), Northwest Barrel Horse Association (NWBHA) and Women's Professional Rodeo Association (WPRA).
7. The C.B.B.R.C. is an independent organization incorporated in the State of Washington.
8. Any person becoming a member of the association shall comply with all of its rules, bylaws, and decisions and will be bound by the same.
9. Rules and regulations of the C.B.B.R.C. may be altered or changed at the end of the year general meeting. Proposed rule changes must be submitted in writing to the Board before the deadline at the last C.B.B.R.C club race of the season and then will be published in the newsletter. The proposed rule changes will be put to a vote of the general membership at the annual year end meeting.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS (Board Members)

All officer terms run September 30 to October 1

1. President:

- a. Shall preside at all meetings of the C.B.B.R.C.
- b. Shall perform duties necessary for proper administration of the association.
- c. Barrel race approvals must be given to the President, subject to his/her approval.
- d. Must have served on the board (1) one year prior to nomination to this position.
- e. Officers will receive complaints, disputes, and questions submitted to them in writing and report to the President. The Board will meet and discuss such issues and hold a board meeting to resolve issues. The Board will send a written response back to the member supported by the C.B.B.R.C. rule book of the Board's findings.
- f. The President will cast the deciding vote when necessary.

2. Vice President:

- a. In the absence of the President, shall preside at all meetings.
- b. Shall keep records of points won by C.B.B.R.C. members in all divisions.
- c. Shall advise the Awards Chairperson of final standings within ten (10) days of the last race.
- d. Shall be in charge of keeping track of mandatory race duties performed by club members at our sponsored races, which includes duty charts, duty sign ups, and fines. This information will be given to the secretary-treasurer periodically.
- e. All C.B.B.R.C. members at C.B.B.R.C. are required to sign the duty roster and work at least one standard duty race. (See STANDARD DUTY LIST) Members shall sign the roster at the time of entry. Vice President and/or Advisor will be in charge of making sure that the duty roster is at each race. The Board shall make sure the roster is filled before time only

will start.

f. All fines of a violation of the duty system will be sent out by written documentation from the Vice President within five (5) days of a C.B.B.R.C. race.

3. Secretary/Treasurer:

a. Shall keep a record of meetings.

b. Shall maintain a complete roster of membership and keep the other officers informed of any changes to the roster.

c. Shall maintain records of horse/rider nominations in the appropriate divisions and keep the other officers informed of any changes to the roster.

d. Shall deliver all information pertaining to this position to the newly elected Secretary no later December 31st of elected year.

e. Shall keep a record of the business transactions and have custody of C.B.B.R.C. funds, accounting to the club at the meetings, will also provide a financial statement and a copy of the bank statement to the President monthly. All bills paid must have approval of the Board. Board may perform an audit of the books every three (3) months and the financial statement shall be printed in the newsletter each month.

f. It is the responsibility of the Treasurer of the current tax year to file that year's tax return, must show proof of filed taxes or file taxes online at the January board meeting.

g. Make sure all nonprofit paperwork is completed, bills are paid; insurance, web, IRS, taxes, post office box, etc.

h. Shall deliver all information pertaining to this position to the newly elected Treasurer no later December 31st of elected year.

4. Publicity/Newsletter/Website Editor:

a. Shall be in charge of submitting Club information by Club Newsletter/Website.

b. If the need for a supplement arises will see to it that is published and mailed.

c. C.B.B.R.C. will furnish stamps for the mailings of monthly newsletters and any other mailings that are required.

d. The deadline to get news to our Newsletter/Website Editor is the 20th of each month, to allow for the newsletter to be mailed by the last day of each month.

e. Newsletter/Website must be submitted to the President for pre-approval before it reaches the membership.

f. Shall be in charge of publishing and submitting any/all information regarding the C.B.B.R.C. to any or all local and/or state public announcement operations, i.e. newspaper, magazine, radio, Facebook, etc.

- g. Publicity articles shall be approved by the board prior to publication.
- h. Prior to any/all publication, publicity editor shall approve any/all cost associated with publication with the President.
- i. Shall perform all duties that ordinarily pertain to the office, such as handling correspondence, "Thank -You" etc.

5. Awards Chairperson:

- a. Shall secure year-end awards either by purchasing with funds or through sponsorships and donations obtained to fill the awards positions.
- b. Shall also be in charge of year-end awards banquet.
- c. Awards may be voted on or board approval will be given to Awards Chairperson on purchasing awards per Awards Chairperson's choice.

6. Advisor:

- a. A position to be filled by our immediate past President for the purpose of imparting advice on issues in which this person will have expertise from experience.
- b. All C.B.B.R.C. members at C.B.B.R.C. are required to sign the duty roster and work at least one standard duty race. (See STANDARD DUTY LIST) Members shall sign the roster at the time of entry. Vice President and/or Advisor will be in charge of making sure that the duty roster is at each race. The Board shall make sure the roster is filled before time only will start.

7. Futurity Chairperson:

- a. Serve as a voting member on the board of directors if and when it is voted to have a Futurity.

Officers will receive complaints, disputes, and questions submitted to them in writing and report to the President. The Board will meet and discuss such issues and hold a board meeting to resolve issues. The Board will send a written response back to the member supported by the C.B.B.R.C. rule book of the Board's findings.

Area directors may be chosen depending on the association's need for them. The Board will elect an Arena Committee and also a Rule Book committee. The current Board members shall meet prior to the purchase of year end awards to review bids of perspective awards and to set purchase price limit per each award given. At this time awards may be voted on or Board approval will be given to Awards Chairperson on purchasing awards per Awards Chairperson's choice.

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

1. The officers of the C.B.B.R.C. are to be President; Vice President; Secretary; Treasurer; Newsletter/Website Editor; Publicity Chairperson and Awards Chairperson. Secretary, Treasurer positions may be combined. Newsletter/Website, Publicity positions may be combined.
2. Nominations of Officers, Special Awards and Rule Change Proposals will be accepted prior to the annual Fall meeting; C.B.B.R.C. members in good standing will elect officers. Voting of Officers and Rule Change Proposals will take place at the annual fall meeting. There will be ONE voting ballot PER paid membership.
3. When possible C.B.B.R.C. will hold periodic meetings at the races to keep the club informed of current happenings, in addition to our Annual Fall meeting. Meetings may be held at any designated place. The Secretary or Newsletter Editor must give membership advance notice.
4. When nominations and special awards ballots are counted it will be a sealed ballot count, which will be overseen by a minimum of 3 officers. All voting of nominations, special awards and rule change proposals will be voted on at the last C.B.B.R.C club race.
5. There will be monthly meetings, dates to be set by the current board.
6. Board members are exempt from paying membership fees, individual or family. They are required to pay their horse/rider nomination fee(s). If an officer steps down or is removed from a position they will be required to pay their membership dues at that time in order for their races/points to count for year-end awards. The ballot for the unoccupied office will go out by the first available newsletter. The votes will need to be received by the 20th of the month so the office will be filled by the following newsletter. This would also apply if a board member resigned from office, or if a board member is impeached for due cause by the membership.
7. A minor (under 18yrs old) cannot carry an individual membership. They must join under a family membership.
8. Only a current member in good standing may be nominated for an officer/board position.

9. No member can be nominated for a board position if they have a history of slander/verbal abuse towards other members or board members.

10. To preserve the safety and integrity of the club, individuals who were previously banned from the dissolved organization known as Columbia Basin Barrel Racing Club Est. 1998, based on formal and documented violations, shall remain ineligible for membership in Columbia Basin Barrel Racing Club Est. 2025. The Directors and current board reserve the right to review each case and grant exceptions based on current information and/or appeals.

MEMBERSHIP

1. It shall be the policy to accept any female or male in their respective divisions who desire membership within the designated boundaries. Eligibility for membership shall be left to the discretion of the officers of said organization. Youth, Pee Wee, Junior and Lead line division memberships will be open to girls and boys within those age or limitation brackets.

2. Club races will be for members only for points to count. Non-members may participate but no points will accrue. They must adhere to the same rules, bylaws and decisions that any paid member is adhered to.

3. Annual membership dues are fixed at \$35.00 (thirty-five dollars) for an individual membership and \$45.00 (forty-five dollars) for a family (living in the same household) membership, anyone nominating a minor must join as a family. All horse/rider combinations shall pay a \$5.00 fee to a designated division, with the exception of Leadline (see Entry Fees). Points can only be accumulated in the division(s) in which you are nominated.

4. Dues and nomination fees must be paid before any points will count towards C.B.B.R.C. standings.

5. Any member not paid by the first race of the year shall be dropped from the mailing list for the upcoming year.

6. Any member in good standings is eligible to win points.

7. C.B.B.R.C. competition year will start October 1 and finish September 30.

8. Any member owing outstanding fees, which are not paid in full within seven (7) days of notice of infraction, will then be ineligible for race or awards until paid in full and will automatically be put on C.B.B.R.C. suspension list until paid.

9. No member shall refuse any reasonable request to assist the association, its officers, committees or agents in the proper conduct of the affairs of the C.B.B.R.C.

10. The Board/Officers have the right to refuse any entry at any time for either members or non-members and they have the right to refuse or revoke any membership that is not in the best interest of the club. This decision does not have to be put to a general vote, but can be decided on by the Board/Officers. Any membership or entry refuse or revoke, can be done on the first offense or anytime thereafter if it is done in the best interest of the club. Their names shall be added on a C.B.B.R.C. blacklist and they shall remain ineligible for future membership.

11. Upon entering any C.B.B.R.C. race, every contestant waives all claims against C.B.B.R.C. officers, race management, and grounds owner for any damage to property or injury sustained.

13. Anyone wishing to nominate and compete on a stud or stallion in any division shall be required to be over the age of 18 years of age. This horse will be the sole responsibility of the owner /handler. If a stud is found to be acting inappropriately, the owner will be asked to trailer said stud or leave the area. It's up to the discretion of the C.B.B.R.C. Board.

14. Non-members of C.B.B.R.C. must sign a release at the office before being on horseback at any C.B.B.R.C. function.

15. All members are required to participate in any club-schedule activity that has been selected by the board or pay a \$5.00 fee per event. (Example: Potty duty or fundraisers) This fee does not include club races, which are mandatory or co-sponsored races.

16. Members can substitute a nominated horse in the event of a catastrophic event. Example: death, signed vet note of an illness and/or lameness that won't recover for the season. This must be discussed with and approved by the board prior to the horse substitution and points counting with said substitution. Example: if you choose to run your substitute horse before coming to the board, your points for that race will not count.

ENTRY FEES

1. The basic entry fee for club point's race is \$10.00 (ten dollars) with the exception of Leadline it is \$2.00 (two dollars). Non-members will pay \$15.00 (fifteen dollars).

2. Entry fees: Fees at a classic race or open jackpot race will be set according to co-sanctioned association fee schedule.

3. The entry fee for Jackpot Pole bending, should the race management choose to offer it, is \$10.00 (ten dollars) with \$3.00 (three dollars) office charge and \$7.00 (seven dollars) going into the pot. The pot will then be paid accordingly.
4. The entry fee for the Open Jackpot side pot on Tuesday nights is \$15.00 (fifteen dollars) with \$3.00 (three dollars) office charge and \$12.00 (twelve dollars) going into the pot. If you choose to enter the side pot your time can only be rolled from the 5D Open points race, no one will be "running" in the side pot.

CLUB RACE DUTY SYSTEM

1. All C.B.B.R.C. members at C.B.B.R.C. events are required to sign the duty roster and work. Members shall sign the roster at the time of entry. Vice President will be in charge of making sure that the duty roster is at each race. The Board shall make sure the roster is filled before time onlys will start.
2. C.B.B.R.C. members who accept a job and do not work at a club race (or get a replacement) shall be fined \$50 (fifty dollars) payable to the secretary. Any member owing outstanding fees or fines which are not paid within seven (7) days of the infraction will then be ineligible to run or receive points until fine is paid.
3. All fines of a violation of the duty system will be sent out by written documentation from the Vice President within five (5) days of a C.B.B.R.C. race.
4. In the event a member has any unpaid fines, the member forfeits their right to receive a year-end award. The member's award will be passed on to the next eligible member in the standings.
5. Duties can be performed at both club sponsored races and individually sponsored club races to meet your requirement. To be eligible for club points at co-approved races you will be required to work one full race (at co-approved races) in order to earn your club duty points.
6. You must write your name down on the Duty Point sheet each race, if you write your name down and the duty was not completed by you the board can and will remove said duty points from you for that race.
7. Duties will be of a standard nature however; due to certain arena conditions some race locations may require more or less duties. A standard duty list could contain (but not be limited to):

STANDARD DUTY LIST:

- a. Race Secretary: To include call in, entries race and payoffs.
- b. Timer Secretary: To handle the recording of time, announce times.

- c. Back-up Timer: Back-up the timer secretary.
- d. Electric Eye: Making sure the eye is there, set up and taken down.
- e. Marking Barrels: Also making sure barrels are there setting them up.
- f. Gate Person: Open and closing for contestants.
- g. Rakers (6 per race): Need Two people per barrel. (Does not apply when tractor is available)
- h. Membership: Accept applications and payments from new members. This is to be given to the Secretary/Treasurer immediately.

POINTS SYSTEM

1. Open and Novice divisions are determined by time brackets. The fastest NOMINATED horse/rider in the class will set the time for points. (See pg. 20 for examples).
2. Leadline, PeeWees, Junior, Youth and Senior will be fastest horse/rider wins.
3. 3D classes will be 1 second splits. 5D classes will be ½ second splits.
4. Points will be awarded in all classes and divisions on a 10,9,8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1 basis for 1st place through 10th place, regardless of the number of entries. If two or more riders tie, the points for the tied positions will be added together and divided equally among the riders who tied. For example, if there is a tie for first and second places in a race, the total points of nineteen (10+9=19) will be divided in half (9.5 each). In the event of a tie for year-end awards, the tie will go to the member receiving the most first place points, then second place points and so on until the tie is broke.

First Place	10 Points	Sixth Place	5 Points

5. Should fewer than ten horses place in a division, points will be awarded beginning with ten points for 1st place.
6. Points will not be awarded for any run during which a contestant knocks over a barrel in the Open and Novice. A knocked over barrel is a no time. With the exception of the Leadline, PeeWee, Junior, Youth and Senior a knocked over barrel in those classes is a plus 5 penalty (+5). If rolling from the Open to Youth and Senior a +5 will be added to the time, Open times MUST be wrote down with the NT.

7. Each nominated horse/rider combination will be eligible to receive one year end award per class nominated in, not including special awards.

8. Each nominated horse/rider will be responsible for earning duty points as required and for meeting the minimum number of races required.

9. Races must be listed in the newsletter at least (7) days prior to the race. If newsletter cannot be sent, all members are telephoned seven (7) days prior to the show in order for points to count. It is the member's responsibility to check on possible changes in scheduled races due to weather conditions. CBBRC has a website and Facebook page where information gets updated.

10. Points can only be accumulated in one race per race date. Those points are accumulated in the division they are nominated in. Members shall run in the division nominated in for the entire season.

11. Points shall stand as published unless contested and proven incorrect by the rider.

12. Once horse/rider combination has nominated for CBBRC 3D Novice, they must remain in that division for that CBBRC year; regardless of lifetime earnings after time of nomination.

13. Nominations in the 3D Novice) will be based on lifetime dollars won and CBBRC lifetime points earned as of the date of nomination. Lifetime points will be equal to lifetime dollars won and points earned at CBBRC Races.

****No.13 and the following 3 examples need to be followed by ALL novice horses, it is your responsibility to know your horses LTE(life time earnings) as well as CBBRC LTP(life time points); CBBRC Novice horses must have less than \$500 LTE or LTP or LTE/LTP combined at the time of nomination.****

Example#1

Horse X has lifetime earnings of \$450. He is nominated into the 3D Novice for 2025. During the 2025 season, Horse X accumulates 60 points at CBBRC races and earns no other money. In 2026, Horse X will be eligible for the 3D Novice because his lifetime points with CBBRC are \$510 (\$450 lifetime dollars and 60 CBBRC points).

Example #2

Horse Y has lifetime earnings of \$750 dollars. He is nominated the 3D Novice for 2025. During 2025, Horse Y earns \$500 at jackpot races but does not earn any points at CBBRC club races. In 2026, Horse Y will no longer be eligible for the 3D

Novice at CBBRC club races but will be eligible for the divisions that do not have earnings requirements (Open, Senior, Junior, etc.).

Example #3

Horse Z has lifetime earnings of \$0. He is nominated in the 3D Novice. During the 2025 season, Horse Z accumulates 45 points. Horse Z will be eligible for the 3D Novice in 2026. In 2026, Horse Z accumulates 75 points in the 3D Novice. In 2027, Horse Z will be eligible to nominate in the 3D Novice because their lifetime earnings equal \$0 dollars won and 120 CBBRC lifetime points.

If it is brought to the board and proven that a horse is truly not Novice (less the \$500 LTE/LTP), all points for that season will be pulled, nomination/fees will not be refunded.

14. Members are responsible for keeping track and turning in money won throughout the season on Novice horses.

APPROVALS

1. Only C.B.B.R.C. approved barrel races will count for points. Individual races may have the optional jackpot if interest allows.
2. Approvals will be only with the designated boundaries of the C.B.B.R.C.
3. For the benefit of all members, it is the President's duty to see that these approvals are spread as evenly as possible through the season.
4. C.B.B.R.C. will hold "club" races in which the approval and race particulars are handled by the club members using the duty system outlined in this book. The club will incur all proceeds and/or expenses. C.B.B.R.C. will also approve races handled by individuals upon the President's approval.
5. Approvals will be printed in the newsletter and posted on website/social media with entry fees and all other race information. Members will be notified of changes or cancellations however, it shall be the member's responsibility to check changes in scheduled races due to unforeseen circumstances. CBBRC has a website and Facebook page where information gets updated.
6. C.B.B.R.C. races will be allowed to co-approve with other associations. When co-approving with other associations, the C.B.B.R.C. members will abide by the prime sanctioning associations rules.
7. Barrel races shall be approved by the President. It shall be the policy to approve all races for the good of the club. However, if the President feels there are extenuating circumstances, he/she shall poll the officers regarding the approval.

8. It is mandatory at all approved races that the secretary handling the race submits a C.B.B.R.C. race financial statement to the Club Treasurer no later than five (5) days following the date of the race.

9. At co-approved races C.B.B.R.C. may offer a point's only race for each club Division, following the co-approved race. Any club member who chooses to run in the co-approved race may have his or her points count towards club points by designating at the time of entry they wish to have their point carried and they also have to pay an additional \$10.00 entry fee.

ARENA PATTERN & GROUND RULES

1. Barrels to be used will be fifty-five (55) gallon size. Metal will be preferred. If plastic is used, they must be weighted with two (2) inches of water or an equivalent of sand, approximately one (1) inch.

2. There is to be only one (1) contesting horse in the arena at a time during barrel race with the exception of holding pen set ups.

3. Anytime contestant crosses the starting line time will begin.

4. Contestants will receive a no time for knocking over a barrel in the Open and Novice. A knocked over barrel is a no time. With the exception of the Leadline, PeeWee and Junior, Youth and Senior a knocked over barrel in those classes is a plus 5 penalty (+5).

5. Contestant may go to the right or left barrel first, but must take two (2) left turns and one (1) right turn, or two (2) right turns and one (1) left turn.

6. Failure to follow the course disqualifies contestant.

7. Re-runs shall be given if timer malfunctions. It is up to the contestant to accept or decline a re-run.

8. If arena size permits, barrels must be set in standard course. (Example shown on back of this rule book)

Distance from the fence:

-Barrels one (1) and two (2) must be at least 15 (fifteen) feet from bucking chutes and/or fence.

-Barrel three (3) must be at least 20 (twenty) feet from bucking chutes and/or fence.

9. Permanent markers must be set for entire race, to include electric eye markers. Unless lasers are available at the arena.

10. When setting barrels on the marker, center of barrel should be positioned over where marker comes out of the ground. If lasers are being used the laser shall be centered on the top of the barrel.

11. Barrels and electric eyes should be marked prior to race time.

12. If one electric timer is being used, a backup watch is required in the office and the flagger will position himself/herself behind the electric eye. The flagger and backup timer must time entire race.

13. If electric eye fails on twenty-five (25) percent or more contestants in the race, back up times will be used. Times missed with the electric eye will be dropped to 100ths of a second.

14. Timer and/or flagger cannot be changed before a race is completed. Horse's nose will be flagged both at the start and the finish.

15. Timers and flaggers must be acceptable to the majority of the contestants. The flagger's decision will be final.

16. Arena owners and operators will have the right to have their ground rules enforced by C.B.B.R.C. Ground rules for arenas will be published in the newsletter and enforced by the C.B.B.R.C. Board.

17. No riders in arena before markers and barrels are set up and ready to go for time onlys. Open arena should be offered for 15 minutes prior to the race starting, unless otherwise advertised.

18. No working of the markers/lasers at any time. First time will be a warning and the second time will be a \$20.00 fine.

19. Rake every seven (7) contestants regardless of a class starting and/or stopping, with the exception of the Open it will begin with a rake.

20. Contestants are asked to dress neatly. Boots or equestrian footwear must be worn at all times. If dress code is enforced, it must be in the newsletter and members will be required to wear long sleeves, hats and/or helmets.

PENALTIES, VIOLATIONS & MISCONDUCT

1. Members shall not abuse their horses at C.B.B.R.C. approved races. A decision regarding excessive training or abuse of a horse shall be made by the C.B.B.R.C. Board. The President will send a warning letter for the first offense. If the offense

continues, the member will be fined \$50.00 (fifty dollars). The fine must be paid before points will count.

2. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated or permitted by board members and/or members, competitors, their families or friends. Any offenses will be handled at the discretion of the board members.

3. C.B.B.R.C. members who accept a job and do not work at a club race (or get a replacement) shall be fined fifty (\$50.00) dollars payable to the secretary. Any member owing outstanding fees or fines which are not paid within seven (7) days of the infraction will then be ineligible to run or receive points until fine is paid.

DIVISIONS RECOGNIZED BY THE C.B.B.R.C.

5D OPEN: This division is open to men, women, boys or girls. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each horse/rider combination before points will be counted. This class has half second splits. You may roll your time from the Open to the Youth, Senior and Novice.

3D NOVICE: This division is open to men, women, boys or girls. For horses with lifetime earnings (LTE), lifetime points (LTP) through CBBRC and/or LTE/LTP combined under \$500 (five hundred dollars) at the time of nomination. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each horse/rider combination before points will be counted. Horses that have won the 1D in the Novice class in CBBRC in years prior are no longer eligible to nominate to this class. This class has full second splits. *See page 14 for LTE/LTP explanation* You may roll your time to the Novice from the Open.

SENIOR: This division is open to men and women 50 years of age or older. Age is determined as of October 1 of the current fiscal year. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each horse/rider combination before points will be counted. This class is the fastest horse/rider wins points to 10th place. You may roll your time to the Novice from the Open.

YOUTH: This division is open to boys or girls, thirteen (13) to eighteen (18) years of age. Age is determined as of October 1 of the current fiscal year. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each horse/rider combination before points will

be counted. This class is the fastest horse/rider wins, points to 10th place. You may roll your time to the Novice from the Open.

JUNIOR DIVISION: This division is open to boys or girls, nine (9) to twelve (12) years old. Age is determined as of October 1 of current fiscal year. Points in the Junior races count for Junior division only. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each horse/rider combination before points will be counted. This class is the fastest horse/rider wins, points to 10th place. You must run in the Junior, you cannot roll your time from the Open.

PEE WEE DIVISION: This division is open to boys or girls eight (8) years old and younger. Age is determined as of October 1 of current fiscal year. Points in the Pee Wee races count for Pee Wee division only. Points are accumulated on the horse/rider combination. You may nominate more than one horse/rider combination. You cannot cross enter between Pee Wee and Leadline. This class is the fastest horse/rider wins, points to 10th place.

LEADLINE DIVISION: This division is open to boys or girls that are being lead, walked through by an adult or someone over the age of 18 years old. Course will be shortened for Leadline. Points in the Leadline races count for the Leadline division only. There is a \$5.00 (five dollar) nomination fee due to the Secretary/Treasurer prior to race for each rider before points will be counted, rider can change horses, but must be lead for points to count. . You cannot cross enter between Pee Wee and Leadline. This class is the fastest horse/rider wins, points to 10th place.

AWARDS

1. Awards will be presented at annual awards banquet after the last competition race of the year.
2. There will be 4 (first through fourth place) standard awards given in each division of the 5D Open, 3D Novice, Senior, Youth, Junior and PeeWee with the exception of the Lead Line class; Lead Line will receive one standard award for first through fourth place. Lead Line class will receive participation awards if work points and minimum races are met. One (1) award will be added for every five (5) horses registered over the base of 40. An overall Open High Point award for the season will also be awarded.
3. Any nominated horse/rider combination MUST participate in a minimum of five (5) approved club points races to be eligible for a year end award(s) and the rider must have performed a minimum of five (5) duties for each nominated horse/rider combination. A portion of those 5 duty points must be obtained while working a

fundraiser "classic" race. Each nominated horse/rider combination must work a minimum of one Classic Race to be eligible for a year end award(s). With prior written request to the board in other duties may be assigned to make up for missed work at the Classic Races, again with prior written request to the board a nominated horse/rider combination can request to "opt-out" of working a Classic Race by obtaining a buckle sponsor; if approved that buckle sponsor MUST be turned in no later than **August 1st**. All duty points/race requirements must be met by the final Tuesday night club race of the season (with the exception of the buckle sponsor being due no later than August 1st).

4. Awards will be purchased according to the end of the year budget.

5. In the event a member has any unpaid fines, the member forfeits their right to receive a year-end award. The member's award will be passed on to the next eligible member in the standings.

6. There will be a "cap" on the dollar amount for each division for yearend awards. For example: \$300.00 - \$400.00 per division.

7. "Special Awards" may be given as follows:

- a. Most Improved Rider- Judged on the rider's improved performance during the club year.
- b. Sportsmanship- Judged on good attitude/behavior of member towards club & other competitors/members; gracefully winning &/or losing, lifting others up.
- c. Service Award- Judged on the individual(s) who have served the C.B.B.R.C. over and above that of which is expected.
- d. Most Improved Horse- Judged on a horse's improved performance during the club year.

8. The current board members shall meet prior to the purchase of year end awards to review bids of prospective awards and to set purchase price limit per each award given. At this time awards may be voted on or board approval will be given to Awards Chairperson on purchasing awards per Awards Chairperson's choice.
