

HISTORY OF SHEPHERD'S CENTER OF GREENBRIER VALLEY

Shepherd's Center of Greenbrier Valley was started by Ann McClung in 1999 after a visit to Shepherd's Centers of America in Kansas City, MO. Seven area churches agreed to sponsor the formation of Shepherd's Center of Greenbrier Valley, we obtained our State Charter, and we were off and running. Adventures in Learning started in 1999 with 45 participants. We now have average 125 registrants for ALL sessions. Other programs that have been added through the years are Gwen's Meals, Handy Helper, Friendly Visitor, transportation to medical appointments for those who are no longer driving, as well as being a senior resource center in the area. We currently have 29 area sponsoring congregations that support us in various ways. This year we celebrate our 27th anniversary and look forward to continued growth and expansion to reach out to those in our community who need our services.
