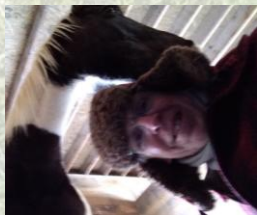

 - Supplements: Cosequin ASU or other joint supplements, Previcox, Minocycline, Equiox, UlcerGuard, Gastroguard, Prascend, Chasteberry, horse dewormer
 - Barn Supplies: shavings, stall dry, wheelbarrows, duct tape, bleach, scoopable litter, fly spray, 10' & 12' metal tube gates, pipe fencing
 - Farm Supplies: 4 x 4 in. and 6 x 6 in. fence posts, 1 x 6 x 8 ft fence boards, round bale racks/huts, tar/millings for parking area, side by side with a dump
 - Medical Supplies: Poultice, Gauze, Vet wrap
 - Office Supplies: envelopes, copy paper, ink cartridges (Canon #240 and #241), stamps
 - Construction: Battery operated power tools, chainsaw
