Course Description: This is a theory-based course designed to be a fundamental introduction to barbering for all students. It is a required class for completion of the Class A Barber program. The course focuses on: **infection control, sanitation, disorders of treatments of the hair and scalp, basic anatomy, hair cutting, shaving, chemical texture, hair coloring, and state board prep.** The course content is aligned with the Texas Department of License and Regulation (TDLR), as well as the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Evaluation includes safety guides, homework, quizzes, lab participation and examinations. Content exams are required for each unit. As a result of this course, students will have a complete understanding of sanitation and the protection of public health.
