Tuesday Ride Report

Richard, who has not been riding too regularly of late, joined us (Dave, Gavin and myself) for our weekly 100 km ride. Richard performed well to hang in on the faster stretches, so too did Gavin.

We rode from Ballina to Evans Head and then to Woodburn for our usual snack of coffee and muffins. We also had three sparrows accompany us for muffins _ they are getting more used to us.

We returned home via Kilgin Rd, and it is all patched up (at last). So Kilgin is the 'go-road' for the next month or so, before further potholes develop.

Friday Wardell Loops Ride Report

A third of the field took the extra 8 km challenge to match the others to the ferry. The third, Tom, Dave and Pete, pushed each other to not drop below 31 kph. Over a 33 km distance we averaged 32.6 kph. We arrived about 30 seconds behind the rest of the field. Our overall judgement is that we, the faster group, is improving. Our goal has always been to beat the field, which we did to Wardell, but not to the ferry.

The good news about this, and in the last few rides, is that Tom's heart condition seems to have improved to the point of a healthy 69 y.o. heart. Tom definitely has shown a marked improvement in strength and stamina this month. Let us hope he will continue to do so.

Saturday April Fools Ride

The only fooling around we did was on the return trip from Signata Ln / East Whytes Ln to Ballina on the Expressway, where we took the speed up for a short while. Overall, the ride was short and quick. We had 5 riders. Dave, Richard, Tom, Marc, and Peter.

At The Proper Cafe we discussed the usual heroes and history of the TDF. We closed the conversation on our personal experiences of saddle types/brands and sizes. Tom claims to have recently found his best seat ever from Specialized, but I feel the rest of us are still searching for the perfect saddle.

Sunday Ride Report

Five riders set off from our Ballina start at 7 AM to reach Broadwater. The abilities were mixed but speeds were adjusted to suit everyone's ability. We followed Pimlico Road and Signata Road and the old Pacific Highway to Wardell. This gave us the optimum choice of road quality and absence of traffic. On a Sunday the old Pacific Highway carries almost zero traffic from Wardell to Broadwater so this was our chosen route. The weather was cool and perfect despite threatening storms out off the coast.

Broadwater has an excellent covered rest area and modern toilets so was a good place to stop for recovery. The town may be called Broadwater however the new M1 bridge crosses the river in the town at the narrowest part of the river. Perhaps it should have been called Narrow Water.

On return we had a gentle tailwind up the old Pacific Highway and River Road to the ferry so the pace was increased, however all riders reached the ferry together.

We met for coffee at about 9:30 AM at the Proper Cafe and all agreed this was an enjoyable outing.

We, from BBC, send our sincere condolences to Alan's family & friends and to Carole.


