South Ballina Hardstand Update

Ballina Shire Council (BSC) has white demarcation lines, including double-lines, at the ferry end of River Drive. This has clearly made it known for drivers to avoid crossing the centre lines. This has also forced cyclists to seek some sort of hazard-reprieve by waiting on the opposite side of the road. This may seem to be a better option for cyclists until traffic starts to come off the ferry, pressing cyclists to stand farther off the road on restricted and unsettling surfaces.

The major hazard here is that cyclists and pedestrians don't have a hardstand to escape to, they don't have any escape route if a vehicle, for some reason, headed for them.

As far as I know, BSC is still waiting for a permit by the Department of Planning and Environment (DPIE), before the council engineers can implement their plans. I am keeping Helen Carpenter, BSC Road Safety Officer, informed of any developing concerns for our safety. In fact, here is Helen's response of the above.

Thanks Peter

I have forwarded your email to our Operations Team.

The project has been added to the work list for the design engineers. Dependent on the final design, it is likely that this project will require regulatory approval including a Fisheries Permit.

Significant resources are required to prepare the required documentation to support an application for these approvals. Without these approvals in place, which are site specific, it is not possible to extend the works we are undertaking on River Drive to include this site.

To allocate the resources required, the works need to be included in Council's adopted program of prioritised work. To enable further consideration of the cost and priority, we have added this proposal to our works for consideration list. This means our design team will endeavour to develop some indicative design and cost options so that Council can be informed about the project.


First of all, I rode into Ballina town before heading back up to Coles car park for our usual start. While in town I came across a lot of riders wearing identical blue jerseys. They were part of a field of 125, riding from Sydney to Surfers. I even saw one rider carrying a spare wheel on his back.

Today they were doing their final leg, to finish at Surfers. The group was raising funds for <u>Father Chris Riley's Youth Off The Streets</u>. It has been an annual event since 1999, and has so far raised

over \$3.5 million. I spoke with Dave, aka 'Biscuits', and he was looking forward to reaching Surfers.

He reported that all 125 riders got to Ballina without any mishaps, and were all in good spirit.

Seven of the nine riders rode to Broadwater via the old highway and River Drive. The weather was sunny and hardly a breeze to contend with and the pace was easy most of the way. During the southbound trip the main pacer was Dave. I was the *lanterne rouge*, constantly looking behind for upcoming traffic. I was happy to get to Broadwater for a break for I was starting to get a crook neck.

Right from the start of the return trip some riders were not ready for one reason or another, and it took awhile for them to come together as a group. Though it was only a short distance of 8km to Wardell some wanted to stop for a rest, but that idea soon fell apart as Richard and I carried on. As a result a few hundred metre gap formed between first and last rider. When I looked back to see where the others were I saw Tom and 2Bob chasing us, so we slowed down. After awhile I looked back

again to see Tom broken away from 2Bob. I was surprised to see 2Bod performing much better than he usually does.

After Tom joined us, the three of us took turns at a steady working pace. Tom felt very good, but his heart rate was saying differently, so he took it easier than usual. When we got to the ferry, the remaining group of four riders soon caught up to us. By the look on their faces they did a good workout too.



On the return trip from ferry to Ballina town, we came across Mark Downey, and a mystery rider, heading out of town. I discovered later, on Strava, that Mark rode one hundred and eleven kilometres. Well done Mark.


