Eton Wick Youth & Community Centre Charitable Incorporated Organisation (EWY&CC CIO) held its AGM on Wednesday 25th September. (Registered Charity No.1201257)

The Trustee Board of EWY&CC includes representatives from Eton Wick Village Association (EWVA), Eton Wick Youth Club (EWYC), and Eton Wick Waterways Group (EWWG) with all Trustees having equal rights.

The Trustee Board of EWY&CC is non-operational, and the roles of Chair and Secretary of EWY&CC Trustee Board are constitutional only. All parties benefit from a single Treasurer under the EWY&CC CIO, whilst maintaining individual operation in their own right.

Thames Water (TW) have committed to clearing the Roundmoor/Boveney rivers twice annually until the planned improvements to processing and storage of effluent at the Slough Treatment Works prevent any future sewage releases into the Roundmoor. Their contractors are expected to be clearing weed from Boveney and Roundmoor for a second time within the next couple of weeks and EWWG await a date for this to commence. Some issues have been identified along this watercourse including low bridges and fallen trees, which are the responsibly of riparian owners. We have been informed that contractors can only work safely if bridges are fully retractable and do not have a footprint in the riverbed. Riparian residents will find guidance on this in the latest environment agency riparian owner handbook (link below).

Now that TW are taking on the weed clearance of the main rivers, our team of volunteers have not been idle. They were out every weekend in September to clear weeds, fallen branches and other debris from the smaller streams. They started on the Colenorton alongside Moores Lane footpath finding a shopping trolley (later collected by Asda) child car seat and other plastic bits as well as lots of large branches that needed to be taken out to allow better flow. This was followed by clearing fallen branches, brambles and other natural impediments to flow as well as more plastic and building materials from Common Brook along Bell Lane and Common Road green spaces. The sediment is very deep making working in these streams precarious. The Town Council and Eton College have been asked to clear the piles of green waste left near the banks.

The problem is that most of the Common Brook/Colenorton waterway is inaccessible to volunteers and landowners are responsible for the maintenance of this waterway. The issue of flooding on the footpath should be addressed by Slough Council who own the land and the Environment Agency (EA) who were responsible for its alteration over the Jubilee, and both been made fully aware by us of their responsibility to safeguard residents who use this path regularly for work, school and shopping.

Water levels on all our waterways are very high once again due to persistent heavy rainfall and an increased outflow from TW treatment works. Added to this, partially treated effluent has been released when the treatment works have reached full storage capacity. This can be tracked on the EDM tracker.

As already mentioned, TW are developing a major project at the Slough Water Treatment Works which will increase their capacity to treat and store effluent. Work is likely to start at the end of 2025. No firm date yet for completion but we understand that this project is being fast tracked by TW. They have been asked to present their project either online or in person and to engage with residents who will be affected, as promised in the original planning proposal of 2022.

Meantime, the EWWG has submitted a bid for Water Restoration funding from the Rural Payments Agency to restore our waterways independently of any plans by TW. If the bid is successful, the planning will start this winter, and landowners and riparian residents will be involved in the consultation throughout. EWWG have received new guidance from the EA for Riparian owners, who have rights and responsibilities for their stretch of the river. This includes the removal of impediments to flow such as fallen tree trunks. It also offers guidance on what permissions are required for any construction on or near the river, such as flood defences, bridges and use of herbicides. Link below.




Maidenhead and the Movies with Richard Poad


