

The Eton Wick Christmas elves were busy delivering seasonal cheer and goodwill on Saturday 21st December. Tommy (age 4), one of the designers of the accompanying Christmas card, was one of the village children who took part in the delivery.

A grand total of 126 boxes were hand delivered to residents in our village and a great big THANK YOU to every kind person who donated a box or bag as without your generosity it would not be possible to fulfil this amazing task. A special thank you goes to Andy Wild, Piotr Rosinski, Samantha Doore, Clare Hibbert, and Karen Tullock who put so much time and effort into this great initiative.

Although a great total of boxes, the number donated by village residents was significantly lower than in previous years ... 53 vs 130 in 2023 ... and we are very grateful for the grant from Eton Poor's Estate (a registered charity run by Eton College) which made the creation of 126 boxes possible, with special thanks to Philip & Lynne Highy, and Sue Warren.



The Boveney and Roundmoor streams have been running low throughout December, in part due to low rainfall but also due to the thorough clearance of weeds and debris in November by the Thames Water team. The next clearance will take place in early March according to Thames Water, who have also asked the Environment Agency for support by taking action to eliminate impediments to the natural flow and maintenance such as fallen trees and low bridges.

Sunday – 12 noon to 9.30pm




