Eton Wick Waterways Group

After a disappointing delay by Thames Water, weed cutting on the Boveney and Roundmoor is due to begin on Wednesday 9th September, carried out by Maydencroft contractors following their ecology studies. This work should have started at the end of the spawning season on 15th June, and Cllr Mark Wilson has been following up regularly throughout the summer.

In the meantime, our volunteer group has cleared weed from the start of the recreation ground upstream as far as Tilstone Close on most weekends throughout the summer, helping to maintain water flow. Fortunately, the drought has prevented flooding this year, but weed is fast growing in warm conditions and the Boveney is again congested with weed.

In anticipation of the Maydencroft clearing of the Boveney and then Roundmoor streams, our team are having a well-earned rest. We will pick up on congestion of the Common Brook later this month.

We ask residents to continue to let us know of any issues that are unresolved by emailing us at the address below and not on Facebook and we will aim to respond within 24 hours.

Riparian residents are reminded that to keep the river flowing we need to avoid anything being thrown into it, such as branches, grass cuttings or weeds, as these will get caught up further downstream causing potential blockages.

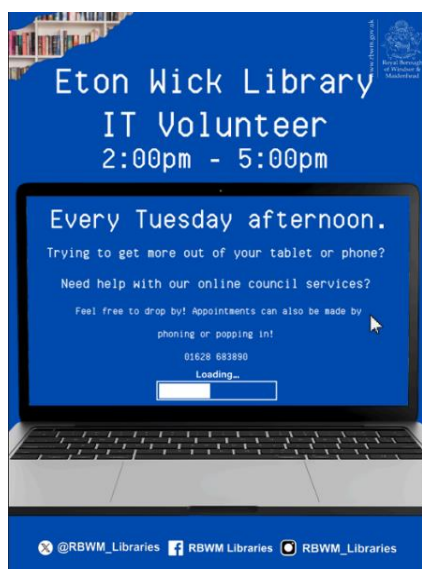

The meetings are held in the Watermans Arms, Brocas St, Eton, SL4 6BW, with the opportunity for a chat and drink afterwards.

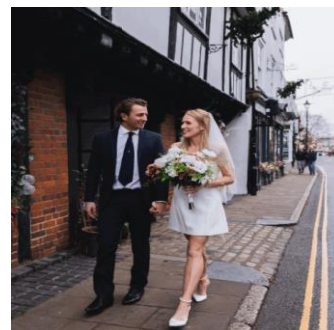

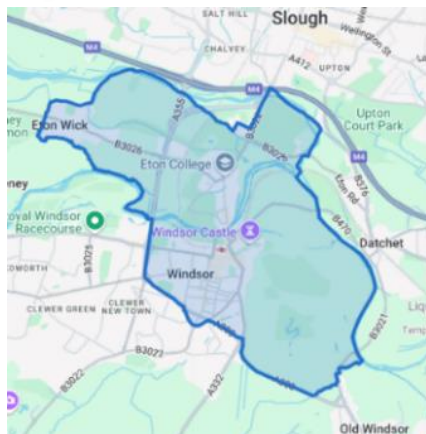
